(1) Task Group 44.7 to proceed to Townsville on 3/2 to embark provisions, returning Challenger Bay on completion. "VICTORIA" to proceed there arriving 1300/5.

Task Group 44.3 ("AUSTRALIA" "BAGLEY" "HENLEY") to carry out exercises between Cape Moreton and Caloundra on 4/2. "HELM" to be sailed from Dunk Is. to join T. G. 44.3 in Moreton Bay by 1600/3/2. "SELFRIDGE" to join T.G. 44.5 by p.m. 4/2. (11) ENEMY FORCES (1) Russel Is. - Reports state that 400 Japanese were landed in 4 sampans on Baisen Island (northernmost of Russel Group) at about midnight 28-29/1 having arrived from N.W.

Baisen Is. was passably the unloading point for the 6 destroyers which were proceeding SE from Faisi p.m. 28/1 and were seen at 0911/29 west of Vella Lavella course N. As previously pointed out these units would hardly have had time to reach Cape Esperance but they would have had ample time to reach Russel Group.

Similarly the force of 1 heavy cruiser and 7 destroyers seen at 2220/26 of SW coast Santa Ysabel course South, may have been into Russel Group as it was thought that they had not reached Cape Esperance.

Further, numerous reports have been received of surfaced submarines in the vicinity of the Russel Group.

The enemy may have built up a force in the Russel Group for use as a "stageing-in" base. It fits in with their general policy of occupying all possible points in the Solomons so as to be able to bring pressure to bear on Guadalcanal from all directions when the major assault is made.

(2) New Georgia - Bombers and fighters were active on and over Munda aerodrome 30/1 and 31/1. The strip at Vila was reported by reconnaissance 31/1 as not ready for use.

At 1105/31, 2 destroyers and 1 cargo vessel were reported SW of Treasury Is. course 400. These units were probably returning from Vila Plantation area and, if the position is correct, were making a wide sweep back to No units were actually sighted 30/1 en route Kolombangara.

At 1435/31, one unescorted cargo vessel was reported entering Vella Gulf course 1200 probably en route Vila Plantation area.

At 1450/31, a destroyer and a 5000 ton cargo vessel with another small escort vessel and air cover of two float-planes, were sighted NW of Vella Lavella course ESE and were attacked at 1745/31 in Vella Gulf (see Naval Incidents).

- (3) Shortlands At 1115/31, reconnaissance aircraft reported 28 vessels including 3 cruisers (heavy or light), 17 destroyers, 7 cargo vessels and 1 large unidentified vessel. Of these, the 3 cruisers and 14 of the destroyers may have been about to depart to south. A submarine was seen leaving Tonolei Harbour at 0945/31 when seven 4-engined flying boats and 8 floatplanes were seen on the water, the latter taking of f. Sightings 30/1 were reported as 22 cargo vessels and four destroyers.
- (4) Choisenl Is. At 0930/31, a small vessel was sighted 25 miles
 NE Cape Alexander course 150°, speed 10 knots possibly patrolling.
- (5) Ontong Java At 1100/30, a small vessel possibly a reporting ship, was sighted 185 miles NE of Ontong Java.
- (6) Buks Passage At 1630/31 the following vessels were at Buka Passage -
 - 1 destroyer arrived from N.W. 2 - 7,000 ton transports)

2 small cargo vessels One of the cargo vessels with 2 schooners and barges was manoeuvring along west coast possibly to land a patrol.
At 1900/31, the destroyer and 2 transports departed

probably south along west coast.

Aircraft were active on and over the aerodrome on 30/1 while 7 bombers and some fighters were seen on the aerodrome at 0905/31.

(7) Rabaul - Fortresses attacking shipping at Rabaul at or before dawn 31/1 reported very few ships in Simpson Harbour indicating night dispersal.

(8) Arawe - At about 0900/31, a small cargo vessel was sighted west of Pilelo Is. The deck was loaded with boxes and

kegs.

(9) Wewak - At 0710/31, 2 carto vessels (8-10,000 tons) were sighted off Mushu Island, with a gunboat or small destroyer patrolling around them.

Another vessel was in Wewak 1 mile off-shore and appeared possibly damaged. This may be the same vessel as

that seen there at 0750/30.
(10) Coral Sea - At 2010/30, there were possible indications of an enemy submarine on a line between Townsville and Port Moresby.

II. NAVAL INCID ENTS

(1) Rabail - The 6 Fortresses which attacked shipping at Rabaul 0405-0441/30 scored one hit with 500-1b bomb on an unidentified Three explosions followed. Bombs were also dropped on other vessels but observations were prevented by searchlight glare.

Bombs were also dropped near Malguna strip, dumps at Toboi Wharf and along main street N. of Simpsons Harbour. One large and one small fire were started in the Toboi Wharf

dumps.

Shipping was again attacked 0450-0602/31 by 7 Fortresses (2) Open Bay - The 2,500 ton transport attacked by a Liberator at 1200/30 in Open Bay was probably hit by one bomb while another hit the ship's rail and exploded in the water. Personnel on

deck were effectively strafed.

(3) New Georgia - At 1745/31 in Vella Gulf 12 dive-bombers and 7
torpedo planes escorted by 6 Wildcats and 8 Aircobras attacked
the destroyer and 6000 ton cargo vessel with another escort
vessel, which had been sighted N.W. of Vella Lavella at 1450/31. Two direct hits and 3 near misses with 1000-1b bombs were claimed on the cargo vessel plus one sure torpe do hit: 2 hits with 500-1b bombs were claimed on the destroyer. Both were left burning, listing and dead in the water. The other escort vessel was strafed and left smoking. 8 Zero's and 2 Zero floatplanes attacked our escorting aircraft which shot down the 2 floatplanes and 3 other Zero's. 2 Wildcats were lost in combat.

(4) Guadalcanal - During the night 29-30/1, 2 N.Z. minesweepers caught a large "I" class submarine, on the surface off Cape Esperance, shelled her and drove her ashore a gutted wreck.

The submarine had troops on board.

At 1222/1 a force of 20 vessels comprising destroyers and flotilla leaders departed Faisi on an ESE course. This force was sighted and attacked (see Naval Incidents) at 1820/1 in a position 15 miles NE of Marovo Lagoon. Four hours later it was observed 9 miles N.W. by N. of Cape Esperance on an ESE course. The shadowing aircraft later reported that it had lost contact with the enemy. However, at 0348/2 portion of the force, described as 7 flotilla leaders were seen dispersing 9 miles NE of the Russell Group and shortly afterwards three sections of the enemy force were observed dispersed west of Korrigole Bay, Santa Ysabel Is. heading on NW courses.

A later sighting at 0900 this morning reported 19 destroyers off the east coast of Vella Lavella heading N.W.

One destroyer was towing a second.

(3) Buka Passage - At 0945/1 a cargo vessel was observed at the

S. . end of the Passage getting under way.

However, at 0900/2 the convoy was observed off east coast of Vella Lavella on a N.W. course. 19 ships were sighted including one in tow. 16 were proceeding at high speed, thus indicating that only one destroyer

was probably sunk and three others slightly damaged.

8 x 500-lbs. on lights seen N. of Praed Point Bombs were also dropped on township and on Vunakanau aerodrome.

Very few ships were seen in Simpson Harbour.

NAVAL INCIDENTS

(1) Shor tlands - (a) 16 of the destroyer force returning to Faisi from Guadalcanal were attacked approaching Faisi at 0800/2 by 10 dive bombers, 11 torpedo bombers with 20 fighters. One direct hit with 500-1b bomb is claimed on 1 destroyer and 2 near misses on another.

(b) 6 Fortresses, covered by 7 Lightnings and 3 Warhawks, attacked shipping at Shortlands at 1710/2, and scored 3 or possible 5 hits with 500-1b bombs on large cargo ship stationary between Ballale and Shortlands possibly the same vessel as was hit at 0840/1. The vessel was last seen burning fiercely and listing. At least 20 enemy fighters intercepted and 9 were shot

down plus 1 more probably. All our planes returned.

January arrived in Sydney under tow p.m. 2/2. The torpedo hit No.5 Hold on starboard side but wool cargo took the concussion and prevented more extensive damage. The ship was abandoned by all except an armed guard in case of a second attack and 5 boats put away: four returned at daylight but the 5th carrying the Captain was unable to return.

Only 1 fatal casualty isreported. ssel Is. - Further to the report of that attack on "PATRICIA CAM" by 1 floatplane on 22/1 the following (3) Wessel detail has now been received: -

> The aircraft approached the vessel in the path of the sun with engine shut off. The aircraft was not observed until bomb released. Bit obtained in main hatch and bomb exploded on ship's bottom, blowing it out. in 2 minutes in 14 fathoms in position 11019'S, 136023'E (approx 20 miles S. Cape Wessel). Survivors bombed and machine gunned.

(ii) ENEMY FORCES

(1) Guadalcanal - Two air raids were reported on Guadalcanal 1955-2045/2 and 2255-2330/2. During first raid 1 plane dropped 5 bombs across fighter strip while our aircraft were landing. Material damage is not yet reported. During the second raid one plane dropped 7 bombs at Koli Point, (7 miles E. of Lunga) but no damage is reported. Two raids were again reported 1850-1945/3 and 2056-2150/3. Each raid was by a single plane. No damage

has yet been reported.

(2) Viru Harbour (S.W. Coast New Georgia) - AB barges and a small submarine were at Viru Harbour. Some of the barges departed SE during the night 2-3/2 but some were still there a.m. 3/2, indicating that Viru Harbour is being used as a "stageing"

base probably between Munda and Wickham Anchorage.

(3) Munda - 7 twin-engined aircraft were seen on Munda drome when 4 Marauders with 10 fighters attacked at 0830/3 and dropped bombs in target area. No interception was encountered. At 1303/3, 4 single-engined aircraft passed S.W. of Munda course SE.

(4) Gizo - At 0945/3, a burning medium sized merchant vessel was

seen beached on the east coast Gizo Is.

(5) Shortlands Area - No reconnaissance report of Buin base has been received for 3/2 but a destroyer and 2 cargo vessels (8,000 & 10,000 tons) were sighted at 1815/3 20 miles S.W. Buin proceeding into the area. In addition, a destroyer and a cargo vessel were seen approaching Bougainville Strait from N. at 0900/3.

The aerodrome and dispersal areas at Kahili were bombed by a Catalina at 0200/3.

(5) Bougainville - Native reports confirm that Puruata (W.coast on north shore Empress Augusta Bay) has been occupied by the enemy.

(6) Buka - More troops, guns, bombs and fuel have recently been

landed at Buka.

A large number of aircraft, many of which had arrived damaged from south, were reported on the 'drome p.m. 3/2.

A cargo vessel was seen at anchor at SW end of Passage at 1015/3.

(7) Rabaul - Reconnaissance of Rabaul 1030-1100/2 was interrupted by 15 Zero's of which 2 were damaged and possibly destroyed. 50 ships were, however, seen in the Harbour including one very large warship. Photos taken were incomplete but show -

Between 0500 & 0600/3, 3 Fortresses attacked Rabaul aerodromes but the target area was completely closed in. Bombs were dropped on both sides of the Harbour in the vicinity of Lakunai and Rapopo aerodromes.

(8) Wide Bay - At 1455/3, a heavy cruiser was seen at the southern end of St. George's Channel on a southerly course. On approach of the aircraft, the cruiser turned toward Wide Bay. Bombs were dropped bytfell wide. One Zero attempted interception but turned away on being fired on.

At 1725/3, a destroyer was seen, also at S. end of St. George's Channel course South.

(9) Lae - Activity on the runway has increased since p.m. 2/2 and blast bays were inspected p.m. 3/2, possibly presaging the arrival of aircraft.

Photos taken 3/2 show only 2 probably serviceable

aircraft on the aerodrome.

(10) Wau - An allied patrol surprised a Japanese party la miles S.E. of Wau at 2100/1 and killed 15 to 20. Another strengthened patrol encountered Japanese

N.E. of Wandumi on 3/2 and killed 50-60 before withdrawing. Wandumi was effectively shelled by artillery at about noon 2/2 when an enemy party was entering. Patrols report the area immediately N.E. of Wau clear of enemy. (11) Morobe - Barges are reported to be running nightly from Anoa (6 miles N.W. Morobe) south to Waria River mouth.

(12) Kumusi - A large party of Japanese is reported to have entered Deunia (about 15 miles up Kumusi River) p.m. 2/2.

Mightly barge activity is reported in the area.

II. NAVAL INCIDENTS

(1) Faisi-Guadalcanal - Additional information on the "Tokyo Express" run 1-2 Feb. leads Comsopac to the conclusion that one enemy destroyer was definitely sunk by motor torpedo boats in the night action off Cape Esperance and probably a second. Analysis of all reports indicates that 3 destroyers may have been sunk if more than 20 participated in the operation. We lost 3 motor torpedo boats in the action, not

5, as previously reported.
Another "Tokyo Express" was run last night 4-5/2. 20 destroyers departed Faisi at about 1300/4 and were reported at various stages on their SE course until they were attacked at 1600/4 by 13 Avenger torpedo planes, 7 Dauntless divebombers escorted by 8 Aircobras, 4 Lightnings and 15 Wildcats. 25 Zerc's covered the enemy convoy. Aircraft reported one destroyer sunk and 1 badly damaged while 7 Zero's were shot down and probably 5 more: we lost 4 Avengers, 1 Dauntless and 1 Wildcat.

The convoy was attacked again at 1730/4 when it consisted of 18 destroyers. 1 additional unit was seen at this time in the distance to NW burning and headed NW, confirming

the claims of the first attack.

The second attack was made by 13 Dauntless escorted by 10 Wildcats and 4 Warhawks: the convoy was covered by 35 Zero's. Two hits were claimed on one destroyer and one on another. 10 Zero's were shot down and probably 2 more: we lost 1 Warhawk while 2 Wildcats and 1 Dauntless are missing.

At 2150/4, 3 ships were seen 20 miles N. of Russell Group still on course 1500 and at 0145/5 6 ships were reported retiring to west 20 miles W. of Cape Esperance although some units were thought still to be in the vicinity of Cape Esperance at 0323/5.

NAVAL INCIDENTS II.

Faisi-Guadal canal - Further reports fof the "Tokyo Express" 4-5/2, consisting of 20 destroyers which dep. Faisi about 1300/4 (as reported yesterday) show that 17 or 18 units reached Guadalcanal by about 2245/4. Landings were apprently effected from 10 to 12 destroyers between that time and 0100/5 in vicinity of Aruligo (E. of Cape Esperance), Visale (almost on the point) and at Kamimbo (Coughlan Harbour, west of Cape Esperance). The remaining 6 to 8 units probably acted in the capacity of a screening force.

Six destroyers were seen departing from the vicinity of Cape Esperance - Goughlan Harbour course 240 at 0115/5 and 5 were reported SE of Catukai Is. (southernmost New Georgia) course 290° at 0325/5.

17 destroyers were seen entering Faisi from south at 1140/5.

Enemy aircraft were over Guadal canal from 2245/4 -0500/5 in an effort to neutralize our air activities against their landing.

Approx 40 landing barges were seen a dift between Cape

Esperance andSAvo Is. at daylight 5/2.

It would appear that one destryer was probably sunk as a result of the first air attack at 1600/4 and another as severely damaged at the same time that it fell out of the convoy and was last seen retiring N.W. burning. As only 17 destroyers were seen returning into Faisi, it would appear that another unit may have been sunk by the second air attack at 1730/4 or later in the vicinity of Savo Is. where a large oil slick was seen at daylight 5/2.

NAVAL INCIDENTS

(1) Guadalcanal - Comsopac reports that observers tate that an explosion was heard off the enemy held coastal positions during the night 4-5/2 while enemy destroyers were in the vicinity. As there was no motor torpedo boat nor air attack, coupled with the fact that a large oil slick was seen near Savo Is. at daylight 5/2, Comsopac suggests that one of the destroyers hit a mine.

This would account for the third missing unit as 20 destroyers set out from Faisi and only 17 returned. One was believed sunk by air attack at 1500/4 while at the same time a second was severely damaged and was last seen retiring to

N.W. burning.

(2) Buka Passage - The two vessels, reported yesterday as 2 medium cargo vessels 16 miles SSW Buka Passage course N. at 1600/5, were subsequently stated to be one 6-8000 ton cargo vessel and one 6-8000 ton tanker. The cargo vessel was attacked and one very near miss or possible hit was obtained on the bow.

(3) Talasea - The 50C ton cargo vessel sighted during the morning 5/2 and probably the same vessel again at 1510/5 as reported in yesterday's "Enemy For ces". The vessel was unsuccessfully bombed in the morning but in the afternoon 2 direct hits were scored and the vessel sank in 3 minutes.

(4) Ambor - Prior to the attack by 8 Liberators on shipping at Ambon at 1150/5, 5 merchant vessels (medium to 10,000 tons) were seen in Ambon Bay: none were seen in the inner harbour. A direct hit was scored on a 10,000 tonner which was left burning and near misses or possible hits were reported on 2 medium-sized merchantmen.

About 10 Zero's intercepted the Liberators and five were destroyed while another was damaged. All our aircraft

returned.

II. NAVAL INCIDENTS

(1) Finschhafen - A 500 ton campuflaged vessel off Finschhafen (reported under Enemy Forces yesterday 7/2) was attacked by a Liberator at 0735/6. The ship burst into flames and was still burning when the aircraft returned at 1145/6 at which time she appeared completely destroyed and grounded.

(2) Open Bay - A 500 ton car our laged cargo ship off Tagada (reported under Enemy Forces yesterday 7/2) was attacked at 1027/6 by the same Liberator that destroyed the ship off Finschhafen. Photographs show a demaging near miss and another aircraft

over the area an hour later saw no sign of the ship.

(3) Guadalcanal - The "Tokyo Express" consisting probably of 19

destroyers, which departed Faisi at about noon 7/2 was
attacked by 15 Dauntless dive-bombers, escorted by 20 fighters,
at1735/7 20 miles S. of Rendova Is. Hits are reported on two destroyers. 15 Zero's accompanied the convoy and 2 were shot down plus one probably. All our aircraft returned.

A second air strike was cancelled owing to weather. At about 0300/8, 3 or 4 ships were believed to be

10 miles NW Cape Esperance. (4) Gabo Island - The British freighter "IRON KNIGHT" (4,800 tons) Is reported to have been torpedoed in position 36005'S, 150038'E (approx 25 miles E. of Turos Inlet) shortly before 0230/8. "IRON KNIGHT", carrying ironstone for Newcastle from Melbourne, was in convoy 0068 (3 ships for Port Kembla, 2 for Sydney and 5 for Newcastle) escorted by HMAS"MILDURA" and "TOWNSVILLE". H.M.A.S. "MILDURA" first reported sighting rockets followed by 2 heavy explosions and large fires and

at 0340/8 reported that "IRON KNIGHT" had been torpedoed. Immediate search proved negative and "MILDURA" intended to return at daylight to the scene of the action to search for survivors.

This is the first a ttack by enemy submarine in this area since "PETER H. BURNETT" was torpedoed 22/1/43

about 420 miles E. of Sydney.

(5) Exmouth Gulf - U.S.S. "HERON" reported being attacked by Submarine in position 26000'S, 112053'E (13 miles off W.coast Dirk Hartog Is.) at 1845/7. Torpedoes passed ahead of "HERON" which dropped four depth charges in the estimated position of the submarine and then proceeded on her course.

(2) Guadalcanal - The Commanding General, Guadalcanal, reports that enemy resistance is weakening on the island thus indicating that the last two "Tokyo Expresses" have been engaged in evacuating part of the Japanese forces.

Support is lent to this suggestion by the sighting of empty barges floating off Cape Esperance.



This is the 5th convoy reported in the Buka - Cape St. George area proceeding on a northerly course since the beginning of this month consisting of 16 merchant vessels and a probable tanker indicating the with-drawal of troops from the Shortlands area. This does not mean that permanent defence forces have been withdrawn from the Shortlands base but more likely the return of troops probably intended for the anticipated assault on Guadalcanal.

(4) Rabaul - Rabaul area was harassed by for 2 hours by one Fortress from midnight to 0200/11.

Reconnaissance reported some ships in Rabaul Harbour at noon 11th but that the concentration did not appear heavy.

(5) Wau - On 9/2 our artillery successfully harassed enemy on the tracks and in the vicinity of Wandumi, apparently causing them to withdraw towards Mubo. Our patrols are active in other sectors of this theatre.

on 20/2 a medium sized tanker arrived in the Passage from the east. This is probably the vessel that was seen in

Arawa Bay (near Kieta) 19/2.

(5) Gasmata - The convoy sighted off Gasmata p.m. 19/2 consisting of probably one light cruiser, one destroyer and one medium cargo vessel was shadowed through/the night 19-20/2 by a Catalina and 8 Beauforts attacked all three ships with torpedoes between 0400 and 0500/20 without scoring hits. The Catalina dropped bombs on the cruiser without observing results at 0520/20. At 0935/20 reconnaissance reported the convoy, still off Gasmata, 1 light cruiser to consist of -

1 destroyer 2 4-6,000 ton cargo vessels.

By 1255/20 the convoy of 4 vessels was reported to be proceeding east at 7 to 9 knots, and was then about 30 miles SE by east of Gasmata. 6 Fortresses and 4 B.25's set out to attack the convoy but were unable to locate the target. Gasmata aerodrome was bombed instead by the Fortresses and two landing barges in Gasmata Harbour believed to have been loaded with supplies were strafed and badly damaged by the B. 2 's. 3 Zero's intercepted the Fortresses while possibly 2 more Zero's were seen taking off Gasmata aerodrome.

(5) Kavieng - Two cargo vessels (8-10,000 tons) were sighted 40 miles west of New Hanover course east, speed 8-10 knots at 1500/23. (6) Cape St. George - At 1334/23 the following ships were reported in the vicinity of Cape St. George, course 3000, speed 20 knots:-1 destroyer 1 cargo vessel (3000 tons) (7) Wide Bay - An unauthenticated report from aircraft gave the following shipping in Wide Bay, course 1450 at 0930/23 -1 transport 3 probable destroyers No confirmation has been received of this report. (8) Rabaul - Shipping and ground installations at Rabaul were attacked by 6 Fortresses at about 0600/23. About 12 ships were seen in Blanche Bay or St.George's Channel but results of the attack have still to be assessed. The larger portion of bombs was dropped on the what and town area at the northern end of the harbour. (9) Open Bay - The small vessel reported in the vicinity of Powell Point on 21, 22 & 23/2 is shown by photographs to be wrecked.

(10) Lorengau - Photos of Lorengau taken 22/2 confirm that the runway has been cleared and extended. Much track activity is shown and new buildings appear in the township. Visual recce 1500/3 reports that the runway appears to be about 7000 ft. long and unserviceable except for emergency use. No aircraft were seen. (11) Wewak - Photos of Wewak 1100/23 reveal one 10,000 ton merchant vessel and several small vessels in the harbour: 25 fighter aircraft on the aerodrome where work on dispersal lanes and bays is in progress. Reconnaissance aircraft was intercepted by 6 fighters thought to be Zero's. (12) Alexishafen - Photos of Alexishafen aerodrome 22/2 reveal a possible new taxiway. (13) Makham-Ramu Valleys - Patrols report 21/2 that no Japanese have been signted in the Markham River Valley in the Kaiapit -Guruf area (50 miles NW Lae) since 30/1 and that the area west of Kaiapit has been cleared of the enemy since that date: also that between 19/1 and 19/2 no enemy activity was observed in the Ramu Valley between Kesam and Sepu (approx 40 miles S.V. Madang). (14) Mubo - Enemy troops appear to continue to be retiring 22/2 eastwards towards the Guadagazal Saddle area while our air attacks on enemy positions on the Guadagazal Ridge have forced some of the troops there to withdraw towards Mubo. Enemy positions in the Guadagazal area were attacked morning and afternoon 23/2 by Bostons. (sp prox 30 miles up the coast from Morobe) heading south were strafed, probably damaged and beached or turned back. - 2 -

Kumusi Delta was reported clear or the enemy a.m. 22/2. Woodlark Is. - An enemy submarine was seen and a ttacked by aircraft approximately 55 miles ENE of Woodlark Is. at (18)1450/23. At 2052/22 there were indications of an enemy unit in the vicinity of a position approximately 200 miles south

No enemy fighter cover is specifically mentioned but the report states that 1 float zero was shot down and one probably damaged while our losses in combat were one fighter shot down and 2 missing.

(2) Wewak - During the attack on shipping at Wewak 0300-0640/26

by 6 Fortresses, a 5,000 ton cargo ship received a direct
hit and 2 near misses with 500-lb 32 sec. delay bombs
delivered from 150 ft. in a skip-bombing run.

(3) Buna Area - H.M.A.S. "BALLARAT" reported that she obtained contact with a submarine at 1922/26 in position 8°52'S, 148°35'E (approx 18 miles NE of Oro Bay) and dropped six depth-charges. Investigations next morning produced a good stationary contact in the position of the attack and several large oil patches 2 miles to south.
