(4) Solomons Shipping-General - These sightings would appear to suggest a stepping up of enemya ctivity in the general area. As many as 16 ships have not been reported in the Shertlands area for some months. Fourteen ships were present early in April. The majority of the vessels sighted in this last reconnaissance were reported to be small, and it may be that the enemy is maintaining an increased number of smaller merchant vessels and warships to ferry supplies to the Japanese garrisons on the south west Bougainville coast and in the Kolombangara -S.W. New Georgia area.





(1) Bougainville Island - Two Liberators attaded two coasters in Tinputz Harbour 1715/3. One was destroyed by two 500 pound bomb hits, and the other was strafed and set on fire, and the crew were seen to abandon ship. This makes a total of four coasters destroyed in this area since 31/5.

(2) <u>Kolomban gara-S.W. New Georgia Area - A small cargo vessel was</u> observed proceeding N.W. from Vila 2000/2. Two vessels were seen approaching Vila from N.W. at 2359/2 and returned N.W. at 0200/3.

One corvette and one small cargo vessel departed Faisi course S.E. at 1532/4. Movements of these vessels were reported by an observer and later by an aircraft during the afternoon and evening, and at 2143/4 the aircraft reported that it was shadowing the ships to the east of Vella Lavella. (3) Unea Island - Photos 0814/3 reveal nil military activity. A

- 200 ft. serviceable jetty was observed in Papua Bay (north coast of Unea Island) on 31/5.
- (4) Wewak Photos 1215/3 reveal 2 merchant vessels of less than 1000 tons and 8 luggers or coasters in Wewak Harbour. But, Wewak, Boram and Dagua aerodromes were attacked by 3 Liberators, 3 Fortresses, one Fortress and 3 Liberators while Wewak town area was attacked by one Fortress, all before dawn 4/6. Fires and explosions were started at the aerodromes.
- (5) Sepik River Area One destroyer or corvette and three small freighter transports were sighted heading into the Sepik River at 0655/4. The vessels were well camouflaged and were not seen by the aircraft on its return at 1125/4.

Aircraft which attacked Wewak before dawn 4/6 reported sighting lights on the Sepik River from Angoram (33 miles inland) to the mouth. Two crews definitely identified the lights and movements as boat traffic.

- (6) Ramu River A string of lights, probably from boats, was sighted by aircraft up and down the Ramu River, southwest of Madang at 0300/4.
- (7) Nubia Fhotos revealed two fighters on the aerodrome 3/6.
- The last report of aircraft on this strip was on 24th April. (8) Markham Vally Area - Enemy Activity: It is reliably reported 4/6 that the Japanese have permanently occupied Boana (24 miles NW Lae) and that more Japanese are reported to be en route to Boana to prepare the aerodrome. There was a mission aerodrome

at Boana, A party of 40 Japanese left Boana 30/5, and is reported to be proceeding to Karapit (53 miles N.W. Lae) to commence work on an aerodrome site.

- (9) <u>Huon Gulf</u> An enemy submarine was sighted by aircraft 60 miles E.S.E. Lae on course 250° at 0025/5. The submarine was reported to be proceeding at 20 knots.

NAVAL INCIDENTS

(1) Shortlands - Shipping was attacked 1135/5 by 30 torpedo and dive bombers escorted by 26 Warhawks, 21 Corsairs and 6 Lightnings. A destroyer was hit by several 500 lb. bombs and believed sunk. In addition, a corvette and a medium sized cargo vessel were left burning.

The submarine submerged at 1125/4, and "EDWARD CHAMBERS" proceeded to Brisbane.



At 1210/7, 1 aircraft landed at Munda and another crashlanded there. At intervals 18 aircraft were seen in this locality flying west.

- (2) <u>Kavieng Area</u> A convoy of four merchant vessels and two gunboats of which blurred photos confirmed three freighter transports of 5500-7000 tons and one of 2000-4500 tons and one gunboat was sighted by a Liberator 35 miles W.S.W. of Kayieng course 150° speed 10 knots at 0940/8. The Liberator dropped six bombs without result. This appears to be a routine convoy en route Rabaul.
- (3) <u>Cape Orford</u> A submarine was sighted proceeding south past Cape Orford at 1700/6.
- (4) Gasmata Photos 1025/8 reveal the runway unserviceable and nil serviceable aircraft.
- (5) Wewak Recce 0945/8 sighted two merchant vessels at the dock and one other entering the harbour at high speed. Photos reveal one merchantman of 1000 tons, 5 small luggers, 50 barges and much activity in the harbour area. In Wewak Harbour one merchant vessel (under 1000 tons), 5 luggers and the usual number of barges were photographed.



- <u>Guadalcanal</u> was alerted for an air raid for an hour after midday 20 June but no further details have been received.
 <u>New Georgia</u> Local sources report that all Japs left Malasova River (S.W. Vella Lavella) at 2200/18 for the S.W. and during the same night evacuated Vanga Vanga (S.W.Kolombangara). At 1500/19, 45 enemy aircraft flew over north Hendova beeding S.F. but superently no attack developed heading S.E. but apparently no attack developed.

This is the third consecutive day on which sea traffic has been observed in this area heading towards S. Bougainville indicating increased transportation to the forward bases probably consequent upon the arrival at Rabaul of the important convoy 24-25 June.

Three destroyers were sighted 60 miles S.E. by S. of Cape St.George course 180° at 1300/27, presumably en route from Rabaul to the Solomons, and would, providing a speed of 25 knots was maintained, have been able to reach Vila at 0100/28. The three destroyers were unsuccessfully attacked by a Catalina at 0030/28 in Blackett Strait.

A further report at 0930/28 stated that four destroyers had been observed in the area during the night, and that up to that time none had been observed returning. Aircraft proceeding to attack at 0700/28 were unable to locate the vessels.

There were indications that possibly 50 aircraft circled over Kolombangara at 0855/28 and then proceeded N.W.

(4) Munda-Vila - Allied Air Strikes - 13 Dauntless, 9 Avengers attacked Munda while 12 Dauntless, 11 Avengers simultaneously attacked Vila at 0815/27. A single cover of 23 Wildcats was provided for both strikes. All but one of the Munda A.A. batteries were silenced. At Vila hits were scored on the runway, gun positions and living quarters.

18 Dauntless, 12 Avengers covered by 30 Wildcats attacked Munda at 1630/28 starting several fires.

(2) Fuiloro - Photos taken at the same time reveal a new strip of 4000 feet on which were 9 serviceable fighters and 5 medium bombers. There were four fighter revetments, four or five heavy A.A. batteries plus one under construction and numerous light A.A. positions.

Another new aerodrome was photographed on Cape Charter (8 miles north of Fuiloro). This was 5000 feet long and there were 7 possible fighters and 5 medium bombers. There were four, probably five, heavy and a minimum of 12 light A.A. positions.

(3) Darwin - A preliminary report states that 9 twin-engined bombers escorted by 9 fighters bombed the Darwin area forenoon 28/6. Damage was very slight and there were no casualties. 42 Spitfires were airborne, but only one squadron intercepted the enemy aircraft destroying two fighters and possibly destroying two fighters, two bombers. One Spitfire is missing as a result of the operation and one made a forced landing.
