### (11) EREMY FORCES

(1) Choiseul - It is reliably reported November 29 that estimated total 5000 Japanese still remain N.W. end Choiseul between ChoiseulBay and Warrior River where they are apparently digging in.

(1) Choiseul (Contd) . Twenty three allied fighters straffed enemy concentrations N.W. tip Choiseul November 30 with unobserved results. Six Mitchells attacked Choiseul Bay area at 1320/30. (2) Treasury Island - Unstated number enemy aircraft raided this area at 0541/29. (3) Buin-Shortlands - Photos November 30 show Kara and Kahili and Ballale all unserviceable. Some evidence of repair on Ballale which now needs only grading to make it serviceable. Shipping included approximately 20 barges including at least seven damaged. During night November 28-29 our PT boats assisted by Catalina flares damaged or destroyed at least one

loaded enemy barge 20 miles W. of Kahili.

Four Aircobras made fighter sweep this area forenoon November 30 scoring hits on four barges, two boats and three A/A positions. Four Kittyhawks also strafed S. coast of Ballale. Five Aircobras attacked Tonolei during afternoon, strafing one barge and silencing one A/A position.

(4) Kieta - Photos November 30 show five barges and one 70 foot vessel. (5) Empress Augusta Bay - At 0855/29, 40 barges or landing boats were reported off the beach E. of Cape Torokina. This report is based on an intercept and it is not clear as yet as to whether these craft are enemy.

> Soupac aircraft reported November 30, sighting forty barges in a lagoon near the mouth of Atsinuma River

(12 miles N.W. Cape Torokina).

The beach between the Jaba River (14 miles S.E. Torokina) and southern end Jaba Village is reported to be roped off and possibly mined. There have been several reports of continued enemy a ctivity in this area recently.

Two tanks were reported at Monoitu (25 miles S.E.

Gazelle Hartour) on the southern extremity of Empress Augusta Bay.

Ter Dauntless, 12 Avengers escorted by four fighters attacked enemy positions S.E. end Empress Augusta Bay destroying several buildings.

Our destroyers shelled Japanese positions vicinity

Torokina en November 30 under fighter cover.

(6) Bougainville - Fifty Dauntless, 22 Avengers escorted by 31 fighter: attacked enemy positions S.W. coast Bougainville forencon November 30.

Eight Lightnings strafed enemy positions between Numa Numa and Kieta atternoon November 30 starting fires. (7) Bismarcks - A further enemy convoy comprising 6-8 vessels was observed S. of Ravieng last night November 30. apparently heading sway from Rabaul towards the Mandates. First sighting was at 2135/30 when one of our aircraft attacked what was described as a 6-ship convoy in a position 15 miles S.S.E. Kavieng on course 300°. Several bombs were dropped on a 10,000 ton transport forming part of this convey.

At 2155/30 another aircraft reported sighting what would appear to be the same convoy but now described as including eight vessels in a position 30 miles S. by W. of Kavieng on course 2700.

(8) New Britain

(a) Cape Hoskins - Four enemy barges reported arrived mouth Kapiura River (12 miles S.E. Cape Hoskins) dawn November 30. These may well have been connected with the destroyer transportation run indicated along New Britain coast the previous night, November 29-30.

(b) Gasmate - Night November 29 -30, four allied destroyers successfully bombarded this area without encountering any

enemy opposition.

(c) <u>Ubili</u> - Three concealed barges were observed in this area a.m. November 30.

(8) New Britain (Contd)

(d) Borgen Bay - Eight Mitchells escorted by eight Lightnings made barge sweep from Reibeck to Borgen Bay afternoon November 30, silencing several light A/A positions at Rein Bay and scoring several hits on barges this area.

Several enemy barges were observed along the East coast Willaumez Peninsula in addition to N.W. New Britain coast indicating constant supply activity by this means along this coast.

(e) Cape Gloucester - At 1200/30 a possible sea truck was observed in a cove near Cape Gloucester.

(9) Alexishafen - Forencon November 30, twenty Liberators attacked this area. Six probable barges were observed in Bostrem Bay.

(10) Madang - Night November 29-30, four allied destroyers bombarded targets this area.

(11) N. Coast Huon Peninsula - Eighteen Mitchells attacked enemy positions Kalasa area forencon November 30.

(12) Satelberg Area - Our ground forces advancing northwards reached Bonga at 0925/29.

At 0800/30, 11 Bostons were involved in attacks on enemy positions along Buzuluc-Lakoma track.

(13) Coral Sea - At 1940/28 an enemy submerine was reported in a position 100 miles S. of Port Moresby.

### (11) ENEMY FORCES

(1) Empress Augusta Bay - Further details of the allied landing night November 28 between the Reini and Sau Rivers, indicate that one paratroop Battalion together with one

company of marine raiders landed against minor opposition helf a mile N.W. of Koisris (9 miles E. by S. of Cape Torokina) early morning November 29 for the purpose of reconnaissance and raids. The landing was apparently made in an enemy ammunition and medical supply area. It is estimated 1000 Japanese launched a strong daybreak counter attack and the size of the enemy force increased during the day. They used most effective mortar and piper fire. Our forces were effectively supported by aircraft and 155 mm. battery. LCI's and gunboats bombarded enemy positions while at least one destroyer arrived at 1800/29 to assist in this bombardment. Our combined land, surface and artillery fire practically silenced Jap mortars while waves of boats landed, loaded and withdrew under some fire without suffering casualties or damage. This evacuation was completed about 2130/29. Casualties resulting from the raid were Japanese 200 known dead and probably more killed by bombing and artillery fire: Allies - approximately 15 killed, 71 wounded. Enemy artillery dumps, rifles, stores and medical supplies were destroyed during the raid and enemy documents captured. (2) Treasury Island - Our ground forces reported clearing of a strip is progressing satisfactorily despite heavy rains. (3) Sclomons - Nil enemy aircraft were contacted in the Solomons area from a.m., November 22 until November 30. No subsequent reports have yet been received.

(4) Bismarcks - (a) At 1030/1 our aircraft reported sighting 14 Tife boats (7 two-masters) 90 miles W. New Hanover, while at 1500/1 a Liberator reported sighting one motor launch and approximately 20 large white life boats in the same area, approx 65 miles W.S.W. New Hanover. This aircraft strafed these boats from 200 feet and Japs were seen jumping in the water until few remained in the boats. Enemy casualties were undetermined, but believed heavy. (b) At 1440/1 a Liberator sighted an enemy convoy described as four medium sized freighters with one gun boat escorting, 12 miles W. by S. of the western tip New Hanover heading East, suggesting convoy heading into Rabaul. (c) Further details of the enemy 6-8 ship convoy reported outward bound from Rabaul in the area S. of Kavieng night November 30, indicate that the force was described as two destroyers, one large 8-10000 ton transport, one whaling factory ship and two unidentified vessels. One Liberator dropped six 1000 pounders on the transport, scoring two possible hits causing a big explosion and towering red flames which slowly died down. The vessel was claimed as seriously damaged and possibly sunk, A Catalina reported sighting probably the same convoy W. of Gazelle Channel at 0130/1, still heading on a westerly course. This Catalina dropped 4 x 500 pounders scoring a direct hit amidship on one destroyer and a direct hit on the stern of what was described as another destroyer.

(d) At 0130/1 another Catalina reported sighting a convoy described as 10-12 large vessels in the same general area 45 miles W.S.W. Kavieng, but states the force was on an easterly course. This Catalina dropped two a 1000 pounders causing a large fire visible 50 miles distant. increased number of vessels suggests the possibility of another force in the areaproceeding into Rabaul, but as no aircraft reported sighting more than one group of ships, it is possible this is the same force which may have been heading for Kavieng following damage suffered by the previous attacks. (5) Garove - At 2356/1 one of our aircraft attacked an unidentified enemy vessel 20 miles E.S.E. of Garove Island. Early hours December 1, one Catalina bombed shore installations this area. (6) New Britain - Delayed report indicates two Beaufighters on barge sweep Hovember 29 attacked unstated number of barges and a small coaster near Cape Hoskins. The targes were believed

Twenty Liberators escorted by Thunderbolts attacked this area early afternoon December 1. Interception by at

least 44 enemy fighters, but final results not yet assessed.

(10) Hansa Bay - At 1340/1 a small enemy merchant ship was reported anchored S. of Kandover Island (35 miles N.N.W. Hansa Bay).

(11) Ulingan - Porencon November 30 four Kittyhawks attacked landing

In this connection a 500 ton vessel was observed at Madang wharf forenoon November 27. Our destroyers were strafed by enemy aircraft vicinity of Sio, but no casualties or damage were sustained.

A full report of the strike on Wewak airfield and neighbouring supply dumps indicates that 46 Liberators escorted by 32 Thunderbolts participated. Heavy damage is believed to have been inflicted, although fires and smoke prevented correct assessment. Approximately 40 enemy fighters intercepted vigorously and 10 fighters were shot down by the bombers and fighters combined and one more probably. (as reported in Summary No.675), Korovo on S.E. coast Shortland Is. was raided 1142/2 by 24 Liberators. At 1530/4 a large camouflaged seaplane was observed in Tuka Channel (between Shortland and Poporang Is.) Photos 4 Dec. show Kahili, Kara and Ballale runways all unserviceable. (2) Kieta - At 1130/3, supply and bivousc areas at Kieta were successfully attacked by 23 Mitchells. Five large and numerous small fires were started. (3) S.W. Bougainville - The enemy's supply line between Buin and souther; Empress Augusta Bay was attacked throughout 3 Dec. At 45 minute intervals, six-plane formations involving 36 Avengers, 58 Dauntless, attacked positions on the trail from Aku on Poiro River (11 miles W. of Kahili) to Motupina. Thirty to forty buildings were destroyed also a 250 ft. bridge over Poiro River at Aku. At 2000-2045/3, 20-25 enemy torpedo and dive bombers attacked a transportation echelon escorted by destroyers en route Torokina, about 28 miles S.S.W. of Motupina Point. At least 6 torpedoes passed close to the escorting destroyers and there were several bomb nearmisses but no actual damage is reported. Three enemy planes were shot down forcertain and another 2 or 3 probably. No further attacks were made during the night although several enemy aircraft were located and fired on by the echelon. (4) Buka Passage Area - Photos 4 Dec. show Buka airfield unserviceable but bomb craters are being filled. Bonis was obscured by cloud but photos 3 Dec. showed this field unserviceable At 1106/4, a possible submarine was reported by aircraft 20 miles S. of Buka Passage. (5) N.E. Solomon Sea - At 1203/4, a submarine was reported by aircraft 27 miles S.E. of Cape St. George also a half-sunk unidentified vessel 5 miles further S.E. During the night 3-4 Dec. a Catalina reported a number of patrol vessels strung out across S. entrance to St. George's Channel. (6) Bismarck Sea - During the night 3-4 Dec. a Catalina unsuccessfully attacked two patrol vessels and a destroyer in the Bismarck Sea. No further details are reported. At 2333/3, three unidentified vessels were reported by Liberators in Kimbe Bay 16 miles N. by E. of Talasea. At 0003/4, two probable barges were observed off Rangamboi Pt. (20 miles S.S.E. of Cape Pomas) heading N. (7) Mandates-Bismarcks - Further to the report of 11 ships possibly in convoy sighted night 3 Dec. S. of New Hanover (refer Summary No. 675), further details give the sighting as 4 naval vessels, 2 transports of 7-9000 tons each and 5 unidentified vessels at 2235/3, 30 miles S. of Cape Matanalem. The two large ships were attacked by 3 Liberators patholling the area and one washelieved to have been sunk. The course of the convoy was undetermined but in view of the considerable shipping seen in Kavieng anchorage on 2 Dec., it is thought likely that the convoy was outward bound. (8) Rein Bay - At 1110-1130/4, installations, dumps and barges were attacked by 18 Mitchells and 6 Liberators. A considerably larger escorted force was scheduled but was turned back by unfavourable weather. - 3 -

(9) Rottock Bay - At about 1100/3 Liberators reported a two-masted schooner off-shore approx. midway between Borgen Bay and Rein Bay. This vessel may be responsible for two unconfirmed reports -

(a) 0945/3 a 4-5000 ton freighter close in-shore Eastern

Borgen Bay.
(b) 1130/4 a 1000 ton cargo vessel lying off Rottock Bay. (10) Rooke Island - At 1010/3, aircraft reported 6-9 barges off S.E.

Rooke Island. An unconfirmed report gives two probable sea trucks off the S. coast Rooke Island at 0820/3.

(11) Long Island - At 1850/2 an enemy aircraft ineffectually bombed a Pr boat 15 miles S. of Long Island.

(12) Sio Area - At 0953/4 Sio area was attacked by 10 Mitchells.

(13) Bogadjim Area - At 0730/4 an important bridge on the Bogadjim road was bombed by 16 Kittyhawks, led in by Boomerangs.

A direct hit completely demolished the western half of the bridge creating an affective road block the bridge creating an effective road block.

16 Bostons.

(1) Choiseul - Latest intelligence from Local sources, reported 2 Dec., indicates that there are no aps now south of Vurulatu River (adjacent Luti Plantation) but that there may be some N. of the river.

The same source reports 4 Dec that the Islands in

Manning Strait are free of Japs.

At 0900/5, Choiseul Bay area, where between 2,000 and 5,000 Japs are believed present, was bombarded by U.S.destroyers (See Naval Incidents).

(2) Treasury Island - Enemy aircraft were over during the night 3-4 Dec and 2 were possibly shot down by anti aircraft fire.

There is no report of bombs being dropped.

(3) S.W. Bougainville - On 3 Dec no enemy contacts were made by patrols from all fronts on the Torokina perimeter but our artillery has been active destroying a gun and an ammunition dump near Mavavia (4 miles E. of Cape Torokina).
At 1415/3 Aitara Mission (16 miles S.E. of Mutupina)

was raided by 6 Mitchells. Throughout 4 Dec separate flights of our aircraft, at 45 minute intervals involving 58 Dauntless, 41 Avengers, attacked the lines of communication from Buin to S.W. Empress Augusta Bay. Thirty to forty buildings were destroyed also a bridge over the Silibai River.

Next day, between 0800 and 1215/5, the same targets were attacked for the third successive day by 23 Mitchells 12 Avengers, 10 Daungless in 8 flights.

Shipping off Torokina was ineffectually raided by a

few odd enemy planes before dawn 4 Dec.

(4) Numa Numa - At 0830/4, an enemy submarine was observed off Numa Numa. This is the second such report in 2 days as a submarine was reported in the same vicinity at 0700/2 possibly indicating supplies being brought in by submarine.

(5) Buka Passage Area - Local sources report 4 Dec that many casualties and much damage has been inflicted by our air attacks in the Tinputz, Teop and Teopasino area. Fires started 27 Nov at Teopasino were still burning on 29 Nov and natives, formerly friendly towards the Japs, have deserted the area.

At 1236/3 Bonis airfield was raided by 21 Liberators, 17 Mitchells. The target areas were well covered. Liberator was lost to phosphorous type A/A on 4 Dec and the Mitchells were attacked by aerial bombs from a high flying plane.

During the night 3-4 Dec U.S. motor torpedo boats

operating W. of Buka Passage were illuminated and strafed. Photographs 4 Dec show 10 barges at Buka Passage

and 14, barges plus 1 small boat at Chabai.

(6) Rabaul - At 1940/4, shipping in the outer part of Blanche Bay was attacked by 6 torpedo carrying Beauforts but results have not yet been assessed.

At 2040-2130/4 Lakunai aerodrome and dispersal areas

were well covered by bombs from 22 Beauforts.

7) Mandates-Bismarcks - At 1325/5 a Liberator reported one heavy cruiser one light cruiser and 2 destroyers 95 miles N.E. of Mussau Island on course 210°. Probably this same force was sighted by a Navy Catalina shortly before 0300/6 60 miles S.E. of Cape Matanalem (New Manover) when it was described as one light cruiser and 3 destroyers. No course was reported at this time but the reports indicate a small movement of warship reinforcements from Truk to Rabaul.

At 1310/5, a single freighter transport of 1000-1500 tons was located and thoroughly strafed by a Liberator 135 miles N.E. of Wewak on course 1800. The vessel was carrying a motor truck on deck and had A/A guns on bow

and stern.

X(8) Cape Hoskins Area - At 1545-1740/4, 7 barges probably loaded with fuel and 1 small boat in the Cape Hoskins area were strafed by 2 Beaufighters. Five barges were burned and destroyed; the other craft were damaged.

(9) Cape Gloucester - At 1145-1205/5 supply dumps and A/A positions at Cape Gloucester were raided by 40 Liberators with One possible sea truck substantial Thunderbot escort. was observed off Cape Gauffre.

(10) Bogadjim Road - Following the successful stake by 16 Kittyhawks on 4 Dec, the road and bridges were again attacked 1020-1055/5 by 19 Kittyhawks 10 Mitchells with 12 Lightnings escorting. The bridge demolished 4 Dec was about 6 miles S. of Bogadjim and on 5 Dec another bridge about 1 mile further up the Ioworo River was

hit by the Kittyhawks and partially destroyed.

(11) Saidor Area - At 2315/3, 4 barges around an unidentified craft
1,000 feet off the coast 4 miles up from Lepsius Point were attacked by 2 PT boats. One barge was sunk, another probably and the other two probably damaged. The unidentified craft was probably hit by a torpedo. Intense fire was encountered from the shore and from the barges.

- At 0800/5 defence positions near Labona (44 miles N.W. of Bonga) were attacked by 6 Bostons. (12) Bonga Area

(13) Finschhafen Area - At 2050/4, 1 enemy plane bombed Langemak Bay causing some casualties and another at 2105/4 when there was no damage inflicted.

(14) Morobe - A possible submarine was sighted off Maiama (10 miles

N.N.W. of Morobe) at 1155/5.

(15) Kiriwina - A probable enemy reconnaissance plane was over Kiriwina at 1145/5.

At 1123/5, 20 liberators escorted by nine fighters attacked Bonis starting three large fires. Noon December 5 16 Kightnings also strafed West coast Buka. For Dec.5 our patrols strafed Chabai and Numa Numa. Forenoon (4) Mandates-Bismarcks - At 1025/6 an enemy convoy described as three medium and two small freighters was observed 20 miles off western tip New Hanover on course 300°. At 1413/6 another aircraft reported sighting probably the same convoy in a position 70 miles W.N.W. New Hanover still heading on course 300°. The force was covered by two Zeros, and was described to include one 7-8500 ton freighter and four small freighters. This would appear to be an outward bound convoy from Rabaul returning to Mandate bases. At 1160/6 a reconnaissance Lightning reported sighting one light cruiser 40 miles N.W. by N. of Rabaul on course 350°. At 1150/6 the same aircraft reported "normal" shipping in Simpsons Harbour. (5) New Britain - Dawn Dec.6, 4 barges were reported to have arrived Cape Hoskins area. A similar report was made on Nov.30 indicating the constant movement of barges in this area. (6) Borgen Bay -Forencon Dec.6, 17 Mitchells attacked this area. (7) Cape Gloucester - Forenoch Dec.6, 6 Liberators attacked this area.
(8) Garove Island - Forenoch Dec.5, a reconnaissance Liberator reported an unstated number of possible barges off Garove Island.
(9) Vitiaz Strait - At 1030/6, 3 probably barges were reported north of Marien Harbour (Rooke Island).
At 2230/4 our PT boats reported destroying seven or eight loaded rafts 6 miles S.E. of Sio. The rafax rafts were loaded with rice, beef extract and Soya flour and had approximately 150-200 tons on each of five rafts, while the other three had 3 x 50 gallon drums and several heavy boxes on each. These supplies may have been loaded on these rafts from enemy submarines which was have been regularly reported in this area apparently maintaining a supply line from Rabaul.

At 0300/5 one PT boat reported firing two torpedoes on an object 150-200 feet in length five miles S.E. Marienx Harbour. The torpedoes failed to explode and the object disappeared - possibly an enemy supply submarine. (10) Hansa Bay - Forenoon Dec.4, 8 Kittyhawks strafed one lugger, two loaded barges in Dogamur Bay (25 miles S.E. Hansa Bay).

The lugger was destroyed and the barges beached. (11) Bogadjim Road - In addition to air attacks on bridges this area already reported Dec.5, 7 Marauders attacked same pargets at 1035/5 while 8 Aircobras also attacked bridges this area forencon Dec.6. - 3 -

(12) Finschhafen - At 2020/5 one enemy aircraft dropped bombs over Finschhafen.
At 0750/6, 9 Bostons attacked enemy positions

Lakona area (13 miles N. Finschhafen). At 2100/5 one enemy aircraft dropped bombs near Malahang (13) Lae strip without effect.

# (c) Proposed Movements:

After the sailing of Convoy OC. 149, CO and OC convoys are to be discontinued. Ships sailing between N.S.W. ports south of 32°50'E and Victorian and Tasmanian ports will proceed independently except in the case of certain special ships. Air and surface patrols will be provided at certain focal points (e.g. Gabo Island and approaches to Sydney and Newcastle) and striking forces made immediately available if required.

## B. SOUTH PACIFIC AREA

(1) Ocean Island - Noon Dec.5, Soupac aircraft reported one unidentified seaplane, one barge and three other small craft at anchor Ocean Island.

(2) Nauru - Forencon Dec. 5, 8 Liberators attacked Nauru causing large fires in the fuel storage area. Three enemy aircraft were observed taking off.

#### NAVAL INCIDENTS

- (1) Guadalcanal Tulagi During Dec.5 several attacks were carried out against a submerged enemy submarine in this area. At 0700/5, contact was made with an enemy submarine 3 miles S.W. of Florida six depth charges were dropped causing heavy oil slick. At 1640/5, an allied minesweeper attacked the same submarine causing a further heavy oil slick and bubbles. At 1800/5 an allied destroyer attacked same submarine with nine depth charges causing large amount of black oil. The submarine is believed stationary on the bottom in 35 fathoms of water.
- (2) U.S. Submarine Successes Ferencon Dec.4, one U.S. submarine reported sinking a "ZUIHO" Class CV(L) between the Bonins and Japan. Another submarine reports sinking two small merchantmen in the Eastern Carolines on Nov. 24 and Dec. 4 respectively.

# ENEMY'S PROBABLE NEXT MOVE

- (1) Consolidation of defences Marshalls, Carolines, Bismarcks, North coast New Guinea, East Indies, Malayan areas.
  (2) Constant effort to maintain maximum air and naval strength in general Carolines, Marshalls, Bismarcks, New Guinea areas to off-set allied forward moves.
- (3) Use of barges, submarines and destroyers for night transportation runs to forward areas.
- (4) Continued use of submarines for reconnaissance and offensive patrol duties in allied operational areas in Pacific and Indian oceans.



(6) Bismarcks-Mandates - At 1136/11, a patrolling Liberator unsuccessfully attacked a convoy of two freighter transports (one large, one small) escorted by one destroyer or gunboat on course 300°, 70 miles W. of New Handwar , 70 miles W. of New Hanover. This is probably a small convoy returning to the Mandates from Rabaul. (7) Wide Bay - At 0845/10, two Bostons strafed points in the Henry Reid Bay area. (8) Open Bay - At 0910/11, a formation of aircraft was heard flying on course S.W. over Open Bay. (9) Gasmata Area - At 1835/10, a Beaufort attacked and claimed to have destroyed a probable submarine 30 miles S. by E. of Gasmata. A dummy periscope was observed 300 yards from the scene of the attack. (10) Borgen Bay - At noon 11 Dec., 26 Mitchells with Thunderbolt escort heavily bombed and strafed targets in the Borgen Bay area. The entire target area was well covered with 25 tons of bombs. (11) Madang Area (a) At 0830/9, eight Kittyhawks were ineffectively intercepted off Madang by six enemy fighters. (b) At 0920/10, eight Kittyhawks shot down three of fifteen enemy fighters between Madang and Alexishafen. (12) Dumpu Area - At 0845/10, eight Kittyhawks damaged one of 35-40 enemy fighters in the Dumpu area. (13) Huon Peninsula -(a) At 0900/10, four Aircobras strafed Sio Village. (b) On the night of 9-10 Dec., allied PT boats destroyed five empty northbound barges off Reiss Point (20 miles W. of Sic) and an add tional 5 off Mardenberg Point (25 miles S.E. of Sic).

(13) Huon Peninsula (Contd) -Opposition was encountered from the barges and shore positions. (e) A.M. 11 Dec., five Aircobras strafed and probably destroyed two barges and a launch on the beach at Lepsius Point. The Reiss Point area was also strafed. (d) At 0835/11, eight Mitchells bombed a barge unloading in area near Fortification Point with unsatisfactory results. At the same time eight Marauders bombed a bivouse area at Fortification Point, blanketing the entire area; the target is considered destroyed. Six partially loaded barges were observed in the area H. of Fortification Point. (e) Our forward troops supported by tanks and artillery have reached Kiligia and are continuing pressure on enemy positions N.E. of Wareo. Five heavy A/A revetments in clearing W. of Ebery's Lease, Kahili, a 6th under construction. (2) Kieta Area - During 12 Dec., Arigua Plantation, Tenekau and Kieta Harbour area were bombed and strafed by 15 Mitchells, 20 Dauntless, 8 Corsairs, 16 Avengers, 2 Venturas and 40 fighters, destroying buildings and starting many fires. (3) Buka Passage Area -(a) 1040/12, 46 Dauntless, 27 Avengers and 48 escorting fighters dropped nearly 50 tons of bembs on gun emplacements and huts in the Matchin Bay area, destroying the targets and demolishing a pier at Soraken. (b) 1100/12, 8 Mitchells with 16 escorting fighters bombed the supply area at Bonis with good coverage of target area. (c) Dec. 13, a reliable report states the enemy has left Tarlena (on Matchin Bay) for the East coast of Bougainville as a result of recent bombing in which 60 were killed. Many of the enemy are reported to be unarmed. (d) Night Dec.11-12, PT boats pursued a 50 foot schooner into Queen Carola Harbour and wrecked it. (4) Feni Island - 0345/12, a westbound enemy submarine was attacked by a patrolling aircraft 15 miles E. of Feni Island. (5) Mussau Island - 1122/13, a 50 foot wooden fuel barge was reported by aircraft 40 miles E.N.E. of Cape Siemens on course N.W. The aircraft scored a direct hit with a 500 lb. bomb and heavily strafed it, leaving it burning and dead in the water, probably sinking. Heavy oil slicks were observed nearby to the N.W. (6) Kavieng -(a) 0110/14, a damaged heavy cruiser was reported by a U.S.N. Catalina to be anchored in Steffen Strait. The extent of the damage is unknown. (b) Further reports reveal that at 0315/13, a U.S.N. Catalina attacked a convoy consisting of . 2 medium vessels l very small tanker 1 destroyer 20 miles E. by S. of Dyaul Island, heading for Rabaul. A direct hit was scored on a 4000 ton cargo vessel which sank within 20 minutes. A few miles further north the same Catalina sighted one very large and two small vessels heading towards Kavieng. These two were the only convoys reported in the area on the night of Dec. 12-13. (7) Cape Hoskins - Morning Dec. 13, two Beauforts strafed and damaged three camoufalaged barges off Cape Hoskins. (8) Gasmata - 1025-1335/13, the heaviest attack on Gasmata yet reported was carried out by 60 Liberators and 50 Mitchells, which dropped nearly 250 tens of bombs. Lightnings escorted the bombers. Eight enemy fighters attempted interception, at least two being shot down. The entire target area was heavily covered with a concentration of effort at Ring Ring and Lindshafen Plantations. Kara and Kahili were unserviceable on Dec.16 but no coverage was made by photos Dec.17. Ten barges visible Buka Passage Dec.17 and another nine in Matchin Bay area.

(b) Dec.16, sixty Dauntless, 28 Avengers with 34 fighters escorting attacked A/A positions at Bonis and Sohana Island destroying two heavy and several automatic gun positions. The escorting fighters also strafed Tenekau and Kieta. Three Dauntless were lost but several of the crew were rescued. (c) Fourteen unescorted Liberators and five Mitchells escorted by eight fighters, also attacked Buka Passage area forenoon Dec.16 while three attacked Bonis and Sohana Island. Photos Dec. 16 show considerable damage to Buildings in Chinatown . (d) It was reliably reported Dec. 16 that the overland evacuation of enemy troops from South Bougainville was believed to be commencing. (2) New Ireland -(a) At 1233/17 a Soupac aircraft reported three large, three medium and two small u/i vessels in Kavieng Harbour. One fighter was airborne and another observed taking off but no attack was made. (b) The same aircraft sighted an 80 foot barge leaded with troops at 1345/17 off the N. coast of New Ireland vicinity of Namatanai heading N.W. The barge was set on fire and many passengers killed by strafing.

(3) Mussau Island - At 1208/17 a large southbound merchantman was reported 130 miles N. of Mussau Island on course 1100. (4) New Britain (a) Arawe - Further details of the initial allied landing operations at Arawe are to hand and set out in chronological form (see Naval Incidents attached). No further report has been received concerning ground activity since Dec. 16 when mopping up and consolidation was in progress. At 1645/16, 8 Thunderbolts intercepted 12-15 enemy fighters strafing allied ground positions at Arawe and destroyed four enemy aircraft and probable another one. At 0815/17, 8 Thunderbolts encountered 20-25 enemy dive bombers escorted by 15 fighters also bound to attack allied ground positions. Our aircraft destroyed 7 dive bombers and 2 fighters. At 1430/17 an enemy reconnaissance aircraft in the vicinity of Arawe was shot down by four of our patrolling Thunderbolts. (b) At 0700/17 a large formation of u/1 aircraft was reported over Open Bay heading S.W. Probably the same formation described as including more than 48 aircraft was reported shortly after passing Ubili area still on south westerly course. At 0803/17 a smaller flight of enemy aircraft was reported in Ubili area on a similar course. (c) Two Bostons and three Beaufighters made a barge sweeps along north and south coasts New Britain afternoon Dec. 16. Several barges were destroyed and damaged vicinity Cape Hoskins; at least two others were attacked vicinity Cape Dampier. - 3 -

(4) New Britain (Contd) -(d) Borgen Bay - Between 1355 and 1420/16 nine Lightnings engaged a force of nine medium bombers and 20-30 fighters 4 miles S. of Borgen Bay, destroying three medium bombers and probably another one. The enemy aircraft remained entirely on the defensive during our attack.
The force of 34 Liberators attacking Cape (5) Cape Gloucester -Gloucester afternoon Dec. 16 reported approximately 7 small vessels (probably barges) vicinity Natamo. At 1205/17, 20 Liberators escorted by 14 Thunderbolts again attacked A/A positions Cape Cloucester while 10 Mitchells also attacked targets this area. Details of attack are not yet to hand. Sixteen patrolling Lightnings reported observing an enemy fighter taking off No. 2 strip at Cape Gloucester at 1705/17 and shot this aircraft down at 500 ft. (6) Solomon Sea . Early hours Dec. 16 our Pr boats shot down a possible four-engined enemy flying boat S. of Gasmata. (7) Wewak - At 1150/16 four patrolling Thunderbolts reported six enemy medium bombers taking off from Boran strip. (8) Hansa Bay - At 0800/17, 20 barges and seven luggers were reported in Hansa Bay. (9) Uligan - At 0800/17, ten barges were reported in Harbour. (10) Huon Peninsula . (a) At Oll4/17 a Navy Catalina attacked a large enemy surfaced submarine 85 miles N. of Sio heading N.W. One bomb exploded 10 feet from the port quarter and a second scored a direct hit amidships. submarine was probably destroyed and was last observed disappearing by the stern in a large area of oil. (b) Between 1255 and 1310/16 one Liberator strafed twelve empty barges vicinity of Sic. (c) Dec.16, heavy fighting was reported in progress by our ground troops between Lakona and Sanga River. 0724 - First wave arrived beach (Alligators and buffaloes) 0730 - Second squad of B.25s arrived. 0736 - Second wave arrived beach (Alligators and Buffaloes) 0744 - Third wave arrived beach (Alligators and Buffaloes) 0756 - Fourth wave arrived beach (Alligators and Buffaloes) 0808 - First LCV arrived) 0820 - Remaining LCVs still landing. Destroyer-escorted LCVs and LCMs arrived off Pilelo. These ships still slowly steaming southeast of Pilelo awaiting signal to land. No opposition of any sort observed. Crew members reported they thought one destroyer was fired upon. All Alligators and Buffaloes got safely ashore. All ships and landing craft presented exceedingly vulnerable target to air attack from first light to 0820. Unoccupied rubber boats observed on east beach and at northwest tip Pilelo, indicating landings accomplished as planned. Sea calm. Weather 4/10 overcast. Visibility 15 miles. 0845 - Ten Betty's and 15 Oscars coming towards Arawe from direction of Rein Bay at 25,000 feet. They flew over Arawe Is. on southerly course and then went East. Our planes patrolled shipping at all times and were not drawn away by enemy fighters. 0905 - Blue beach and her bour area bombed by 33 Jap aircraft. Allied warship which remained behind to cover small craft was attacked but received no damage. Other vessels were not attacked. 1148 - Final objective reached. Nil indication of opposition or casualties. Director area broken to overcast, middle cloud with broken low cloud, light rain during early morning and late afternoon. Visibility fair. Wind calm to light northerly. Slight sea. Flying conditions fair. Total of 2395 troops landed in director area.

(3) Buka Passage -(a) Photos Dec 23 reveal both strips unserviceable. 15 barges visible. (b) P.M.Dec 22, 21 Liberators involved in series of attacks enemy positions. (c) 1215/23, 17 Mitchells attacked Sohana Is. (4) Feni Islands - Dec 23, 2 camouflaged barges were straffed. At 0824/24 an enemy submarine was reported in this area. (5) Nuguria Islands - (N.E. of Feni Group) - Dec 23, an enemy sloop towing barges was strafed in this area and the sloop left sinking. A seaplane ramp and piers were visible at the southern end of the island. (6) Cape St. George (a) Dec 24, 2 Venturas escorting Soupac Liberators were intercepted by 9 enemy fighters in this area. Three enemy fighters were destroyed and 3 others damaged without loss to our aircraft. (b) P.M.Dec 23, 6 Soupac Venturas attacked the lighthouse and possible Radar station at Cape St. George. (7) Bismarck Sea -(a) Further details of the 7-ship convoy sighted west of Mussau Is., forenoon Dec 23, and later S. of Kavieng heading Rabaul during early hours Dec 24, indicate that one of the transports were carrying 5 barges on deck, indicating still further the enemy's policy of building up considerable barge strength in the Bsimarcks area at the present time. This convoy was attacked by a patrolling aircraft when 45 miles S. of Kavieng and a 500 lb. bomb hit was scored on one

large transport. The force was then reported to include 3 large transports, 1 cruiser and 1 destroyer and several unidentified craft, and was on course 150° still heading Rabaul. (b) Further details of the Soupac sighting Dec 25, indicate another enemy convoy including 9 vessels was observed 50 miles NNW of Rabaul during forenoon, apparently heading away from the area. This force was peported to have included 4 destroyers, 2 large and 3 small merchant vessels.

(c) At 0745/23 Soupac aircraft reported a surfaced submarine 105 miles NE Mussau Is.on course 2000.

(d) At 0825/24 one destroyer was observed 165 miles NNW Mussau Is. heading W. This same vessel was again reported during the afternoon still proceeding on a northerly course.

(e) At 0215/24 an enemy light cruiser was unsuccessfully attacked by a patrol aircraft in the area to the south of

New Hanover, course unstated.

> (a) Soupac photos Rabaul, Dec 23, reveal 6 destroyers, 1 submarine, 3 sub-chasers, 11 merchant vessels, 5 small craft and 200 barges in harbour. Vunakanau and Lakunai airfields were not covered but Tobera and Rapopo showed a total of 40 aircraft including 28 fighters. 18 float planes and 1 flying boat were also in harbour.

(b) At 1315/24 a Soupac aircraft also reported a cruiser outside

Simpson Harbour.
(c) At 1327/23, 18 Soupac Liberators attacked Lakunai. During interception by enemy fighters our fighters are reported to have destroyed 24 enemy aircraft and probably destroyed another six.

This would appear to be a transportation run to this area from Rabaul.

(14) Alexishafen - Forencon Dec 23, 31 Mitchells, 9 Marauders, escorted by 16 Aircobras, attacked this area. Several unidentified aircraft, including 3 medium bombers and 2 fighters, were observed on these strips. Both strips were reported in good condition the following morning, Dec 24.

15) Bogadjim - At 1055/23 a small vessel was reported this area.

(16) Huon Peninsula - Forencon Dec 23, 12 Bostons attacked barge hideout and unloading point, Sio area. Four barges were apparently destroyed. At 0935/24 a partly submerged submarine was reported 48 miles SE of Finschhafen.

They dropped over 140 tons of bombs, including 1,000 lb.bombs
and phosphorous bombs which laid an effective smoke screen.

The original landings were made almost without opposition, but a small formation of enemy aircraft attacked our landing

craft in Borgen Bay two hours later.
Throughout the day our air attacks were continued, 265 TONGOF bombs being dropped in addition to strafing attacks, by an additional 64 Liberators, 51 Mitchells and 32 Bostons with

In the afternoon 40 divebombers, 20 medium bombers and 60 fighters attacked our beachheads and ships offshore. We lost one destroyer by a direct hit and three others were damaged. Our operations were not affected by the attacks.

The enemy's total losses were 61 aircraft including 36 bombers and 25 fighters, and others probable.

We lost 7 of our aircraft and others were damaged.
