1. DISPOSITIONS ALLIED & ENEMY NAVAL FORCES

A) SOUTH WESTERN PACIFIC AREA

1. EASTERN AUSTRALIA SECTOR

- (i) Task Force 44 ("AUSTRALIA" (Flag) "CANBERRA" "CHICAGO" "HOBART" "SALT LAKE CITY" "BAGLEY" "HENLEY" "JARVIS" & "PATTERSON") en route Noumea to Brisbane E.T.A. a.m. today 1/7.
- (ii) Convoy ZK10 (4 ships) escorted by "GOULBURN" & "BOMBAY" en route Townsville via Capricorn Channel E.T.A. 0500/2/7.
- (iii) "HELM" was due Sydney yesterday 30/6 from escort duty. To act as escort for Convoy OCS departing Newcastle 2/7 and convoy OCS departing Melbourne 7/8.
- (iv) Sydney Portion Convoy OCS arrived 2011/30/6. "YANDRA" will escort convoy through swept channel and then return to port. "STUART" & "SEELONG" will continue to escort convoy towards Newcastle until dusk today 1/7 and then return Sydney.
- (v) "FLUSSER" & "WHYALLA" departed Melbourne 0900 and 0945 respectively 30/6 for Newcastle escorting Convoy OC7 E.T.A. 1200/3/7.
- (vi) "HUGFORD" & "MORSEBY" escorting Convoy OC7 en route Newcastle to Melbourne E.T.A. Port Phillip 0100/3/7. To escort Convoy OCS departing Melbourne 4/7.
- (vii) "PERKINS" & "ROCKHAMPTON" escorting Convoy GP4 en route Sydney E.T.A. a.m. 2/7. Later to escort Convoy PG4 departing Brisbane 3/7.

- (ix) "WARRAGO" escorting "KARSIK" en route Milne Bay to Townsville E.T.A. 0600 today 1/7.
- (x) Convoy VK3 (8 M.V) to depart Sydney 0900 today 1/7 for New Zealand. Naval escort to be provided for 50 miles to sea.
- (xi) "SWAN" escorting "TASMAN" arrived Townsville from Port Moresby 1440/29.
- (xii) "KATCOMBA" departed Brisbane 28/6 escorting "WEST CACTUS" 200 miles to sea, thence Townsville E.T.A. 1200/2/7.
- (xiii) "CRESSNOCK" escorting "YOCROW" en route Townsville to Port Moresby E.T.A. 1600 today 1/7.
- (xiv) "BENDIGO" departed Port Moresby 1200/29 escorting "JOHN JAY" to Fitzroy Island. "BENDIGO" thence Cairns E.T.A. 1100 today 1/7. "JOHN JAY" to proceed to Townsville E.T.A. 2400 today 1/7.

Enemy Forces (See Appendix)

On night of 27/28 June allied land forces carried out a successful raid on Salamaua. Quantities of paper and equipment were captured and 60 houses were demolished. Allied casualties were two wounded. Enemy casualties at least 60. Enemy reinforcements have arrived at Salamaua from Lae and some possibly from New Britain. In addition, 40 Japanese were landed by aircraft on 29/6.

3. EAST INDIES - PHILIPPINES

AMBON - Later reports indicate that no warships were sighted off Laha 29/6, as previously reported.

GENERAL - The heavy cruiser "ASHIGARA" is now believed to be in the East Indies area.

Tanimbar Is. - On 30/6 a vessel of 200 tons observed south of Saualaki Bay course west.

Ermera (Timor) - An enemy patrol about 25 strong, was engaged by our patrols in the vicinity of Ermera.

Keopang - No enemy shipping at Keopang or Hansisi at 0900/30/6.

B) CENTRAL PACIFIC AREA

Enemy Forces

(i) All four carriers that have been operating in the N.W. Pacific as portion of the covering force for the Aleutian operations are now believed to have arrived in Northern Honshu - Hokkaido waters. These carriers are "ZUIKAKU" "RYUJO" "ZUINO" & "JUNYO".

(ii) Of the remaining aircraft carriers -

(a) "SHOKAKU" - which has been repairing in Japan is expected to put to sea in the near future.

(b) "HIYO" - (sister ship to "JUNYO") has been recently commissioned and is presumably still in Home Waters.

These carriers are ex N.Y.K. Passenger Liners - 27,500 tons, and carry 60 aircraft.

(c) "HOSHO" - no information concerning present whereabouts - last reported in Home Waters.

(iii) There are now indications that only one cruiser of Crudiv 6 has arrived in the Truk area and the other is now en route from Japan to Truk to join up.

(iv) There are indications that C in C Fourth Fleet, at least one unit of Crudiv 6, Crudiv 18 (One possibly two "TERRYU" class) are now in the Truk area. There has been no further information concerning the two damaged "MOGAMI" class cruisers (Crudiv 7) which were repairing in this area last week prior to leaving for Japan.

(v) Units of the First Fleet (principally battleships) which were operating in the Inland Sea last week are believed to have arrived in Tokyo Bay. C in C Combined Fleet was operating with these units in the Northern Honshu area.

(vi) C in C Second Fleet is believed to have re-organized his forces in the Bonins area.

(vii) Units of Subron 8 which have recently been operating off the East Coast of Australia were reported last week as being in the vicinity of the Marshall Is. possibly en route Japan.

C) SOUTHERN PACIFIC AREA

(i) "ACHILLES" & "WALKE" to R.V. with "TRENTON" & "WARRINGTON" (which departed Balboa 17/6, escorting Convoy LW.100) 80 miles N. of Bora Bora at 1200 today 1/7 and relieve these vessels as escort to Auckland. Later to escort Convoys LW.100 and PW.2095 en route Australia as far as Lat. 160°E.

- (ii) "RALPH TALBOT" & "BLUE" (U.S. Destroyers) to proceed to Auckland E.T.A. 4/7. Later to report for duty to Comsowespacfor about 8/7, relieving "PERKINS" & "FLUSSER", which are to be sailed for Tutuila, "PERKINS" proceeding via Noumea and Suva, and "FLUSSER" via Tongatabu.
- (iii) "BARKER" (Task Group 15.4.2) is to depart Tongatabu in time to carry out the following programme. After falling at Samoa to escort "HEYWOOD" to a R.V. about 300 miles west of Samoa with "BOISE" (Task Group 15.4) escorting Convoy PW.2095 at 0800/5/7.
- (iv) "WILCOX NIA" escorting "MEREKUR" en route Noumea to Sydney E.T.A. p.m. 3/7. "WILDURA" also to proceed later to Sydney for duty with Comsowespacfor.
- (v) "TANGIEN" & "MEREDITH" departed Fiji 25/6 for Pago Pago en route Pearl Harbour.
- (vi) At Tongatabu - "MONTGOMERY" "RAMSAY" (Minediv 2) "SOLAGE" "RAINIER" "ALGORAB" "WHITNEY" "ANTARES" "KANAWHA" "CHYEMA"
- (vii) At Samoa - "TURKEY" "SWAN" "KINGFISHER"

Enemy Forces

- (1) There have been indications that at least 2 Japanese subs. and 2 Japanese merchant raiders were operating in the S.W. Indian Ocean area. There were strong indications of an enemy submarine within 90 miles of 42°S, 27°E (approx 590 miles S.E. of Cape of Good Hope)
- (ii) German Raider E is still possibly operating in the Indian Ocean area, although there has been no report on this unit since 10/5.

2. NAVAL INCIDENTS

(1) ~~XXXXXX~~

SANDFLY PASSAGE (N.W. end of Florida Is.) - Natives reports from two sources indicate that a Japanese light cruiser was sunk in the vicinity of Sandfly Passage on 22 or 23/6. The vessel was reported to have three funnels and masts.

Comment - No air attack was carried out on any vessel in this vicinity on that date.

(ii) GENERAL - Increased W/T activity has been noted both to and from Kavieng (New Ireland).

Comment - Recent recce have revealed up to 3 vessels including one 10,000 ton merchant vessel in this area suggesting increased activity.

OPERATIONS

ALIRD KOEPANG - A B.17 on recce over Koepang at 0900/30/6 was attacked by a Type "O" fighters and the latter was possibly damaged.

DILLI - Further to the attack on Dilli 25/6 it is reported that the buildings were still burning fiercely 1100/28.

LAE - Demolition bombs and incendiaries were dropped on Lae night of 29/30 June. Results unobserved.

RABAU - Three separate attacks were made on Rabaul on night of 29/30 June. The targets were Lakunai and Malagunan aerodromes and Wharf installations. Some fires were started. Allied losses Nil, but one B.17 slightly damaged.

ENEMY KOMIATUM (7 miles S. of Salamaua) was bombed by enemy a/c on 29/6.

MUBO (12 miles S. of Salamaua) bombed by enemy on 29/6. No damage or casualties.

- (i) Task Force 44 ("AUSTRALIA" (Flag) "CANBERRA" "CHICAGO" "HOBART" "SALT LAKE CITY" "BAGLEY" "HENLEY" "JARVIS" & "PATTERSON") arrived Brisbane from Noumea 1055/1.
- (ii) Convoy ZK10 (4 ships) escorted by "GOULBURN" & "BOMBAY" via Capricorn Channel was due Townsville 0500 today 2/7. "GOULBURN" & "BOMBAY" after dispersal of convoy are proceeding to Brisbane and Sydney respectively. "BOMBAY's" E.T.A. Sydney 1530/3.
- (iii) "HELM" arrived Sydney 0658/1 after acting as escort for "TASKER H. BLISS". With "KALGOORLIE" is to escort Convoy C08 (6 M.V. from Newcastle, 4 M.V. ex Sydney, 1 M.V. ex Port Kembla) departing Newcastle 0600 today 2/7 and Convoy C09 departing Melbourne 7/7.
- (iv) Convoy C06, less Sydney and Port Kembla portions, arrived Newcastle 0420/1. Two M.V.'s unable to enter harbour until after daylight. "PINGWO" & "WINBAH" standing by to afford protection.
- (v) "FLUSSER" & "WHYALLA" departed Port Phillip 1213/30/6 for Newcastle escorting Convoy C07 E.T.A. 1200/3/7.
- (vi) "MUDFORD" & "MORESBY" escorting Convoy C07 en route Newcastle to Melbourne E.T.A. Port Phillip 0100/3/7. To escort Convoy C08 departing Melbourne 4/7.
- (vii) "PERKINS" & "ROCKHAMPTON" escorting Convoy GP4 en route Sydney E.T.A. a.m. today 2/7. Later to escort PG4 departing Brisbane 3/7.
- (viii) "TROMP" escorting "BUNGAREE" en route Noumea to Sydney E.T.A. p.m. today 2/7. "TROMP" "MANGORA" & "WESTRALIA" to depart Sydney 4/7 escorting H.T. "DUNTROON" to Fremantle.
- (ix) "KARSIK" escorted by "WARREGO" from Milne Bay was detached off Magnetic Island at 2330/30 to proceed to Bowen was due Bowen 0900/1/7. "WARREGO" arrived Townsville 2355/30.
- (x) "YANDRA" departed Sydney 0926/1 escorting Convoy VK3 (8 M.V. for New Zealand) through swept channel to R.V. with "STUART" and "GEELONG" off Sydney Heads. "YANDRA" was to provide A/S protection as far as practicable for one M.V. departing Sydney 1200/1, to join convoy, then return to Sydney. "STUART" & "GEELONG" after escorting convoy until dusk 1/7 returned to Sydney 2148/1. "STUART" will be taken in hand at Sydney for boiler cleaning.
- (xi) "SWAN" escorting "TASMAN" arrived Townsville from Moresby 29/6.
- (xii) "KATOOMBA" departed Brisbane 28/6 escorting "WEST CACTUS" 200 miles to sea, thence Townsville E.T.A. 1200 today 2/7.
- (xiii) "CESSNOCK" escorting "YOGHOW" from Townsville was due Port Moresby 1600/1.
- (xiv) "BENDIGO" which departed Port Moresby 1200/29 escorting "JOHN JAY" to Fitzroy Island was due Cairns 1100/1. "JOHN JAY" was due Townsville 2400/1.

- (vi) One ~~xxx~~ heavy cruiser of Crudiv 6 is believed en route Truk area from Japan. The remaining unit and at least one light cruiser ("Tenryu" class) of Crudiv 18 are now probably operating in the Solomons area.



- (i) Task Force 44 ("AUSTRALIA" (Flag) "CANBERRA" "CHICAGO" "SALT LAKE CITY" "HOBART" "BAGLEY" "HENLEY" "JARVIS" "PATTERSON") at Brisbane.
- (ii) "ADELAIDE" (repairing) will be required for convoy escort from Sydney to Fremantle about 15/7.
- (iii) "SELFRIDGE" & "WHYALLA" are to escort Convoy G.P.5 departing Sydney tomorrow 6/7 for Brisbane and Convoy P.G.5 departing Brisbane 10/7 for Sydney.
- (iv) "MUGFORD" & "MORESBY" escorting Convoy O.C.8 (SM.V.) departed Melbourne 0931/4 for Newcastle E.T.A. 1400/7.
- (v) "HELM" "BUNGAREE" & "KALGOORLIE" escorting Convoy C.O.8 (17 M.V.) en route Sydney and Newcastle to Melbourne. These vessels will escort Convoy O.C. 9 departing Melbourne 7/7.
- (vi) "PERKINS" & "ROCKHAMPTON" escorting Convoy P.G. 4 (6 M.V.) en route Brisbane to Sydney E.T.A. daylight 6/7. On arrival "PERKINS" to proceed Newcastle as escort of Convoy O.C.9 (for Melbourne). - (xii) "COLAC" escorting "BANTAM" departed Townsville 1650/4 for Moresby E.T.A. 1600/7.
- (xiii) "BARALABA" arrived Thursday Island 0110/4 from Merauke. Later to proceed Cooktown E.T.A. 0900/7.
- (xiv) "ARMIDALE" to sail from Port Kembla so as to reach Sydney Heads at 1400/6 and escort Convoy V.K.6 (one tanker) to a position 60 miles East of Sydney, and then return Sydney.
- (xv) At Sydney - "ABRAHAM CRYNSEN" "K.12" "K.9" "DOBBIN" "STUART" Repairing - "ADELAIDE" "LE TRIOMPHANT" "ARUNTA" "VICTORIA".

1. EASTERN AUSTRALIA SECTOR (Contd.)

- (ii) RABAU - C. in C. Fourth Fleet is expected to move to the Rabaul area soon from Truk area where he has been operating with units of Crudiv 6, Crudiv 18, Gunboat Division #8, Desron 6 and approx. three Seaplane tenders.
- (iii) SALAMAU - Allied aircraft sighted at 1240/4 a medium sized vessel, apparently a transport, with two funnels and large superstructure, about 5 miles off the coast between Salamaua and Lae. The ship appeared to be stationary.
- (iv) SOLOMONS - No activity was observed by Allied air recce at Buka Passage on 4/7 or at Feni Islands on 3/7.

2. WESTERN AUSTRALIA SECTOR

British and Allied Forces.

- (i) "KANIMBLA" arrived Fremantle 1430/4. With "PHOENIX" to proceed to a R.V. 1900 miles W.N.W. of Fremantle at 1500/15 with Convoy G escorted by "GAMBIA" & "WORCESTERSHIRE" ex Colombo. From R.V. "GAMBIA" & "WORCESTERSHIRE" to proceed Mauritius E.T.A. 19/7. Convoy to proceed Fremantle.
- (ii) "VOYAGER" departed Fremantle 0709/4 to R.V. approx. 350 miles West of Cape Leeuwin with "TRINITY" at 1200/6, and escort her to Albany E.T.A. 0609/9.
- (iii) "BURNIE" departed Fremantle 0900/4 for Adelaide E.T.A. 1830/9.
- (iv) "LITHGOW" was to depart Thursday Island 1200/4 escorting "BURWAH" to Darwin.
- (v) At Fremantle - "PHOENIX" "KANIMBLA" "CHILDS" "HERON" "OTUS" "K.8" (see Appendix) "ERLING BROVIG" "ISABEL" "LANAKAI"
- (vi) At Albany - "HOLLAND" "LARK" "WHIPPOORWILL"

CAPE LEEUWIN - There is no further information as to the QQQQ signal (suspicious vessel) intercepted by "KANIMBLA" at 2052/3 when in position 30° 45' S, 114° 17' E (45 miles S.W. of Cape Leeuwin). There were no indications of the position of the identity of the originator of the message.

Enemy Forces

- (1) All four carriers that were operating in the N.W. Pacific as portion of the covering force for the Aleutians operations are now believed to have arrived in Northern Honshu - Hokkaido waters. These carriers are "ZUIKAKU" "RYUJO" "ZUIHO" & "JUNYO". "JUNYO" is believed returning to the Inland Sea.
- (ii) Of the remaining aircraft carriers -
 - (a) "SHOKAKU" which has been repairing in Japan is expected to put to sea in the near future.
 - (b) "HIYO" - (sister-ship to "JUNYO") has been recently commissioned and is presumably still in Home waters
 - (c) "HOSHO" - no information concerning present whereabouts - last reported in Home waters.

B) CENTRAL PACIFIC AREA (Contd.)

Enemy Forces (contd.)

- (iii) Cincpac reported 30/6 indications of a southward movement by some of the forces in the Northern Honshu - Hokkaido area. This possibly included heavy cruisers as well as the aircraft carriers mentioned above.
- (iv) Units of the First Fleet (principally battle ships) are believed to be in the Tokyo Bay area. Cinc Combined Fleet was recently operating with these units.
- (v) C. in C. Second Fleet is believed to have re-organized his forces in the Bonins area.
- (vi) One heavy cruiser of Crudiv 6 is possibly en route New Britain - Solomons area from Japan to join other unit already in that area.
- (vii) Converted Seaplane Carrier "NOTORO" was in the Saipan area June 30th and is believed employed ferrying aircraft to New Britain.
- (viii) Seaplane Carriers "GHITOSE" & "CHIYODA" (airron 7) are believed to be en route Japan from the Bonins.
- (ix) Converted Seaplane Carrier "KANOI" is en route Home Waters to Truk.
- (x) One of the damaged "MOGAMI" class cruisers (Crudiv 7) is still under repair at Truk. There is no further information concerning the remaining unit, which was expected to proceed Japan after effecting temporary repairs at Truk.
- (xi) There are indications that units of Subron 1 may operate in the Marshalls area shortly.

Comment - These units were operating in the Northern Pacific area last month. The above intelligence may indicate that these units are intended to replace units of Subron 8 which were operating off the East Australian Coast last month and which have since returned to the Marshalls area, possibly en route Japan.

- (xii) There are indications of convoy movements from Formosa to Port Arthur.

- (ii) "BARKER" (Task Group 15.4.2) and "HEYWOOD" were to R.V. about 300 miles West of Samoa with "BOISE" (Task Group 15.4) escorting Convoy P.W. 2095 at 0800 today 5/7.
- (iii) "LEANDER" "CUMMINGS" & "TUCKER" escorting "PRESIDENT COOLIDGE" en route Suva to Auckland E.T.A. 0700 tomorrow 6/7.
- (iv) "RALPH TALBOT" & "BLUE" (U.S. Destroyers) reported for duty with Comsowespacfor on 3/7. Unless required by Comsopac immediately for escort duty with ships bound for Australia from N.Z., these vessels are to proceed Sydney forthwith.
- (v) "MILDURA" escorting "BISHOPDALE" departed NOUMEA 1425/3 for Brisbane E.T.A. 0700/7.
- (vi) "TANGIER" & "MERKEDITH" departed Fiji 25/6 for Pago Pago en route Pearl Harbour.
- (vii) At Tongatabu - "MONTGOMERY" "RAMSAY" "(Minediv 2) "SOLACE" "RAHNER" "ALGORAB" "WHITNEY" "ANTARES" "KANAWHA" "CUYAMA"
- (viii) At Samoa - "TURKEY" "SWAN" "KINGFISHER"
- (ix) At Suva - "CURTIS" "McFARLAND" "GALE"
- (x) At Auckland - "MONOWAI" "ASCANIA" "RIGEL" "MACKINAC"
- (xi) At Vila - "CAP DES PALMES"
- (xii) At Noumea - "CHEVREUIL"

Enemy Forces - One enemy submarine is possibly operating in the NEW CALEDONIAN area.

D) NORTHERN PACIFIC AREA

Enemy Forces - Cincpac reports that the enemy force in the Aleutians Area includes Nachi (Cruiser Division 5) and possibly "Abukuma", (Light Cruiser, flagship of Desron 1) in addition to submarine Squadron 2 and part of Desdiv 1.

Enemy Forces (Contd)

- (ii) Converted Seaplane Tender "KAMIKAWA MARU" is believed en route Japan from the Aleutians after leaving a detachment of seaplanes at Kiska. In addition there are indications that other seaplane units are proceeding to the N.W.
- (iii) There were indications that at least six enemy units probably submarines were operating in the N.W. Pacific area on 2/7.
- (iv) A repair ship was reported in the vicinity of Kiska on 4/7.

F) INDIAN OCEAN AREA

Enemy Forces

- (i) There have been indications that at least two Japanese submarines and two Japanese merchant raiders were operating in the S.W. Indian Ocean area.
- (ii) German Raider E is still probably operating the Indian Ocean area.

2. NAVAL INCIDENTS

(i) INDIAN OCEAN

An Admiralty report 1/7 on the enemy air attacks on "CORNWALL", "DORSETSHIRE", "HERMES", early in April, states that there was no R.D.F. warning of the attacks. Opposition was slight, since the cruisers did not sight the enemy aircraft until they were already diving to attack, while "HERMES" was too lightly armed to offer effective resistance. The attacks indicated the following tactics by Japanese carrier-borne dive bombers. The initial attack is developed from the general direction of all ships in convoys by aircraft up to 70 in number, at 10,000 ft. or above. Attacks from ahead may continue as the ships alter course. The aircraft are organized in sub-flights of 3, attacking in quick succession at slightly lengthening intervals. The height of the release of bombs is not definitely established but aircraft flatten out from the dive as low as 500 ft.

- (ii) New South Wales: Commencing on 7/7, "C.O." Convoys (i.e. convoys en route Newcastle and Sydney to Melbourne), are to act as targets for simulated torpedo attacks by B-26 and Beaufort aircraft based on Nowra.

3. AIR OPERATIONS

1. LAE - 4/7.

- (a) 4 Catalinas attacked aerodrome from 0028 to 0315. Nil opposition. Results not observed. Nil Allied losses.
- (b) 4 B-25's bombed aerodrome at 0502. Results unknown.
- (c) 7 B-25's attacked aerodrome at 1500. 6² Zero fighters intercepted. 1 Zero shot down, 2 others probably damaged. 4 Allied aircraft damaged.

- 2. SALAMAUA - 4/7. 4 Hudsons attacked aerodrome from 0225-0320. Bombs fell on runway and an explosion was observed near a hangar.

ENEMY

PORT MORESBY 4/7 -

- (a) Raid No.66. 2 unidentified enemy aircraft bombed 7-mile aerodrome from 0355-0431. Damage was slight. Nil interception, no casualties.
- (b) Raid No.67. 27 P-39/400's took off to intercept approaching enemy aircraft at 1040. 13 Allied aircraft were attacked by about 20 Zeros. 1 Zero probably destroyed, 3 damaged; 3 Allied aircraft missing, 1 seriously damaged, 2 slightly damaged.

- (i) Task Force 44 ("AUSTRALIA" (Flag) "CANBERRA" "CHICAGO" "SALT LAKE CITY" "HOBART" "DAGLEY" "HENLEY" "JARVIS" "PATTERSON") at Brisbane.
- (ii) "ADELAIDE" (repairing) will be required for convoy escort from Sydney to Fremantle about 15/7.
- (iii) "SELFRIDGE" & "WHYALLA" are to escort Convoy G.P.5 departing Sydney today 1500 6/7 for Brisbane and Convoy P.G.5 departing Brisbane 10/7 for Sydney.
- (iv) "MUGFORD" & "MORESBY" escorting Convoy O.C.8 (8M.V.) en route Melbourne to Newcastle E.T.A. 1400/7.
- (v) "HELM" "BUNGAREE" & "KALGOORLIE" escorting Convoy C.O.8 (17 M.V.) en route Sydney and Newcastle to Melbourne. These vessels will escort Convoy O.C.9 departing Melbourne 7/7.
- (vi) "PERKINS" & "ROCKHAMPTON" escorting Convoy P.G.4 (6 M.V.) arrived Sydney 1732 5/7. - (xiii) "BERALABA" departed Thursday Island for Cooktown 1844/4. E.T.A. 1800/7. Thence Cairns for fuel and water.
- (xiv) "ARMIDALE" to sail from Port Kembla so as to reach Sydney Heads at 1400 today 6/7, and escort Convoy V.K.6 (one tanker) to a position 60 miles East of Sydney; and then return Sydney.
- (xv) At Sydney - "ABRAHAM CRYNSEN" "K.12" "K.9" "DOBBIN" "STUART".
Repairing - "ADELAIDE" "LE TRIOMPHANT" "ARUNTA" "VICTORIA".
- (xvi) At Melbourne - Repairing - "VENDETTA" "GOLDSTAR".
- (xvii) At Brisbane - "GRIFFIN" "ATREUS" "ALSEY" "TULSA".
- (xviii) For Submarines in Eastern Sector - see Appendix.

(1) NEW BRITAIN AREA.

- (a) Lorengau - nil shipping observed by air reconnaissance 5/7.
- (b) Kavieng - At 1120/5 the following vessels were observed in the Harbour: one transport 7,000 tons with tug-boat alongside at wharf,
One small warship, possibly destroyer,
One probable schoener.

(11) SOLONON ISLANDS.

- (a) At 1500 3/7, large freighter, escorted by light cruiser, reported departing Tulagi, course N.W.
- (b) At 1245/5 a 7,000 ton merchant ship sighted approx. 400 miles N. of Guadalcanal, course not stated.
(Comment: Probably refers to same vessel reported in (a). Vessel probably returning Rabaul.)
- (c) On 4/7 large auxiliary sailing vessel was observed 42 miles E. Cape Esperance (N.E. tip Guadalcanal).
- (d) On 4/7 two warships and five flying boats were sighted at anchor off Makile (28 miles E. of Cape Esperance).
- (e) At 1300/4 13 Japanese warships and 2 aircraft carriers were reported by coast watcher to have passed Cape Esperance course due West.

(Comment: Previous reports have indicated the presence of at least one heavy cruiser, one light cruiser and 3 destroyers in this area. As recent W/T intelligence has indicated that other units, including C. in C. 4th Fleet, were expected to proceed South from the Truk area, it is possible that the above force is composed as follows:-

- 2 heavy cruisers "KAKO" one "AOBA" class,
- 3 light cruisers (including "KASHIMA" and possibly one "TENRU" class),
- 8 destroyers,
- 2 seaplane tenders ("FUJIKAWA MARU" and "KIYOKAWA MARU").

The above is considered to be a maximum force as indicated from W/T intelligence, and it is possible that some of the units include small gunboats or patrol vessels, instead of some of the units detailed above.

It would seem likely that this force has made a sweep of the Solomons Area, possibly to cover the movement of reinforcements to that area.)

- (i) All enemy aircraft carriers are now believed to be centred in Japanese home waters. These include "ZUIKAKU" "RYUJO" "ZUIHO" & "JUNYO" which have been operating in the Aleutians area, and "SHOKAKU" "HIJO" "HOSHO" & "KASUGA HARU". "SHOKAKU" is expected to be almost ready for sea again.
- (ii) C.inC. Combined Fleet and units of the First Fleet (principally ~~the~~ battle ships) are believed to be in the Tokio area.
- (iii) C.inC. Second Fleet is believed to have reorganised his forces in the Bonins Area.
- (iv) The converted seaplane carriers "NOTORO" & "KAMOI" are believed employed ferrying aircraft to the Truk-New Britain area.
- (v) One of the damaged "MOGAMI" class cruisers (Crudiv 7) is still under repairs at Truk, but is expected to proceed Japan when these are completed.

- (vii) There were indications on 4/7 of enemy convoy movements from Formosa to Port Arthur.

- (iv) "RALPH TALBOT" & "BLUE" (U.S.Destroyers) departed Auckland 1115/5 for Sydney. E.T.A. 0900/9.
- (v) "MILDURA" escorting "BISHOPDALE" en route NOUMEA to Brisbane. E.T.A. 0700/7.
- (vi) "TANGIER" & "MEREDITH" departed Fiji 25/6 for Pago Pago en route Pearl Harbour.
- (vii) At Tongatabu - "MONTGOMERY" "SOLACE" "RAINIER" "WHITNEY" "ANTARES" "KANAWHA".
- (viii) At Samoa - "TURKEY" "SWAN" "KINGFISHER" "ZEILIN" "SUMNER".
- (ix) At Suva - "GALE".
- (x) At Auckland - "MONOWAI" "ASCANIA" "RIGEL" "MACKINAC" "ALCYONE" "LIBRA" "WHARTON" "CASTOR".
- (xi) At Vila - "CAP DES PALMES" "RAMSAY".
- (xii) At Noumea - "CHEVREUIL" "CURTIS" "McFARLAND".

Enemy Forces.

- (i) GILBERT ISLANDS. At 2000H/4/7 it was reported that 3 enemy warships had been observed at anchor or drifting off North end of Malana Island (Gilbert Group) since a.m. 3/7.
- (ii) NEW HEBRIDES. A reliable report states that the sound of a diesel engine was heard at about midday & at night on 30/6, 1/7 and 2/7 near Port Stanley, Malekula Island. No vessel observed in vicinity.

D. NORTHERN PACIFIC AREA.

British and Allied Forces. (see Appendix).

- (i) A repair ship was reported in the vicinity of Kiska on 4/7.
- (ii) Cincpac reported 4/7 that the enemy forces operating in the Aleutians area include heavy cruiser "NACHI" (Crudiv 5) and possibly light cruiser "ABUKUMA", Flagship of Desron I, in addition to Subron II and part of Desdiv I.
- (iii) There were indications that at least six enemy submarines were operating in the N.W.Pacific area on 2/7.

F. INDIAN OCEAN AREA.
British and Allied Forces. (See Appendix.)

Enemy Forces.

- (i) Mozambique Channel. Three Japanese submarines commenced operating in the Mozambique Channel on 30/6 and are expected to continue operations until 8/7. (See Naval incidents.) There were D/F indications on 3/7 that a further flotilla, probably of 3 submarines, was proceeding to the area South of Capetown. In addition, two Japanese merchant raiders which were operating in this area early last month may still be in the Indian Ocean.
- (ii) German Raider "E" is still probably operating in the Indian Ocean area.

2. NAVAL INCIDENTS.

(1) INDIAN OCEAN.

Enemy units have carried out attacks on Allied merchant shipping in the Mozambique Channel area, as follows:-

- (a) At 0315C/30/6 S.S. "ROOKLEY" (Br. 4998 tons) was shelled but not sunk in a position 13° 09' S, 41° 45' E. (approx. 120 miles N.E. Mozambique).
- (b) At 0945C/30/6 "GOVIKEN" (Norwegian - 4854 tons) was sunk, 6 survivors being picked up by unknown ship, in a position 13° 00' S, 41° 45' E. (approx. 125 miles N.E. Mozambique).
- (c) At 1659C/30/6 S.S. "DALLINGTON COURT" (Br. 6889 tons) was subjected to an unsuccessful torpedo attack in a position 12° 25' S, 41° (?) 58' E. (approx. 155 miles N.N.E. Mozambique).
- (d) At 0612C/1/7 an unknown ship was shelled in a position 25° 25' S, 34° 49' E. (approx. 340 miles N.E. Durban).
- (e) At 0545C/2/7 "STEAVA ROMANA" (Roumanian, 5311 tons) was shelled in a position 8° 46' S, 43° 11' E. (approx. 400 miles N.N.E. Mozambique).
- (f) At 0715C/2/7 S.S. "PHEMIUS" (Br. 7406 tons) was subjected to an unsuccessful torpedo attack in a position 16° 05' S, 41° (?) 00' E. (approx. 100 miles S.S.E. of Mozambique).

(Comment: One enemy unit could have been responsible for the attacks referred to in (a) (b) (c) and (e), and two additional units could have been responsible for attacks referred to in (d) and (f). At 2550/3 there were indications of a Japanese unit in the vicinity of 17° S 42° E (approx. 170 miles S.E. of Mozambique). This unit may have been responsible for the attack in (f) above.)

3. AIR OPERATIONS.

- (a) One Hudson attacked aerodrome and isthmus at 0326. Results unknown.
- (b) Five B.26s attacked isthmus at 0950. Flames from a possible fuel dump observed.

LAE.

- (a) Six B.17s attacked aerodrome at 1730/4. Large fires observed. One B.17 damaged on landing.
- (b) Four B.17s attacked aerodrome at 0237/5. Damage could not be assessed.
- (c) Three B.17s attacked Lae aerodrome at 1205/5. Damage not observed.

TULAGI. One Catalina attacked Maleta at 0200/5. Fires were observed in the bush. Probably no damage caused. Nil opposition.

AIR OPERATIONS (Continued).

ENEMY.

PORT MORESBY. Raid No. 68.

- (a) At 1012/5 20 bombers escorted by six "Zero" fighters bombed new camp and dispersal bays at Seven Mile aerodrome. Nil damage. 1 Army personnel killed, 3 wounded.
- (b) At 1026/5 7 bombers bombed same aerodrome. 1 P.39, 1 truck and 40 drums of fuel destroyed. 4 B.26s damaged. Nil interception.

BULOLO.

5 heavy bombers raided Bulolo 1035/3. 2 Allied personnel killed and quantity of stores destroyed.

- (vi) "PERKINS" arrived Newcastle 1229/6. "PERKINS" & "GEELONG" escorting portion Convoy G.C.9 departed Newcastle 1605K/6 for Melbourne. S.T.A. 0200/10/7. Departure of Sydney portion of Convoy G.C.9 has been delayed from 0300 to 0500K/7 due to arrival of Convoy O.C.8 coinciding. H.V. with main convoy will be correspondingly delayed, but latter is not to delay; if contact is not established with main convoy, Sydney portion is to proceed independently to Melbourne escorted by "MADRAS" & "LAUNCESTON". "STUART" is to relieve "PERKINS" as escort at approximately 1800/7 and "PERKINS" is to return to Sydney. "STUART" & "GEELONG" to escort Convoy G.C.10 departing Melbourne 11/7.

 - (a) "WILCANNIA" at approx. 2250K/6/7 5 miles off Sydney Heads. An inward loop crossing was recorded at 2303K/6/7 at the Sydney Heads.
 - (b) "ALBERT B. WATTS" (U.S. Tanker) sent an "3333" (submarine) at 0615/7/7 when in position approx. 530 miles E.S.E. Sydney.

- (ii) Lae-Salamau.
 - (a) Photographs taken during the Allied Air attack on Lae on 4/7 show 32 fighters and 4 bombers on aerodrome.
 - (b) In the harbour 3 new jetties have been built since 26/6.
 - (c) On 6/7 it was reported that the Japanese have an estimated military strength of 2500 at Lae and 1000 at Salamaua.

(iii) Solomons.

Tulagi.

- (a) At 1105/3 one warship was reported heading towards Tulagi.
- (b) At 1035/5 two enemy warships were in Tulagi harbour.
- (c) Information received indicates that at least 4 Kawanisi flying boats are operating from Tulagi.

Guadalcanal.

- (a) The report of 13 warships and 2 aircraft carriers at 1300L/4 off Guadalcanal has now been corrected to 4 light cruisers, 5 destroyers, 4 large cargo vessels passed west at Savo Island at 1400L/4. It is now confirmed that there were no aircraft carriers in this force.
- (b) At 1920/4 2 Kawanisi 4 engined flying boats were reported flying South.
- (c) At 1330L/6/7, 1 cruiser, 4 destroyers, and 4 large cargo vessels were observed approaching Savo on an Easterly course.
- (d) At 1610L/6/7 2 cruisers and 1 destroyer were reported at anchor at Lunga, having arrived from the N.W.

On 2/7, 500-lb. bombs were dropped among enemy shipping at Agattu; near misses on a destroyer and a transport were recorded.

On 3/7, Kiska was raided, but results of bombing were not observed. No anti-aircraft fire was encountered.

(ii) Enemy submarines remain active in the Eastern Aleutians area.

E) SOUTH EASTERN PACIFIC AREA, (See Appendix.)

F) INDIAN OCEAN AREA.

British and Allied Forces, (See Appendix.)

Enemy Forces.

(i) Mozambique Channel. Three Japanese submarines commenced operating in the Mozambique Channel on 30/6 and are expected to continue operations until 8/7. There were D/P. indications on 3/7 that a further flotilla, probably of 3 submarines, was proceeding to the area South of Capetown. In addition, two Japanese merchant raiders which were operating in this area early last month may still be in the Indian Ocean.

(ii) German Raider "B" is still probably operating in the Indian Ocean area.

2. NAVAL INCIDENTS.

SANDFLY PASSAGE (SOLOMONS).

There is now evidence to indicate that the enemy warship reported sunk in Sandfly Passage (off Florida Island) on June 21st, was not a light cruiser as reported, but a 2,000 ton armed merchantman, probably carrying troops.

3. AIR OPERATIONS.

Allied.

Isle. Air Attack 4/7.

Ground observation records that 2 out of 3 Type "0" fighters were shot down by an Allied bomber on 4/7 over Upper Watut.

NOTE: The bomber crew claimed one "0" fighter destroyed, and 3 probably damaged.

Enemy.

Port Moresby.

3 alarms were sounded at Moresby a.m. 6/7.
No reports of raids yet received, but 5 bombs were dropped near 12 mile camp without causing damage or casualties.
Interception by Allied fighters resulted in the loss of 1 P.40 and pilot missing.

4. ENEMY'S PROBABLE NEXT MOVE.

- (i) Development of major advanced air base in Guadalcanal-Tulagi area (Solomons).
- (ii) Possible occupation of Nauru and Ocean Island.
- (iii) Possible attack on Port Moresby area.
- (iv) Consolidation of bases in occupied territory.
- (v) Continued submarine and surface raider activity in the Indian Ocean and Pacific areas.

- (a) Interrogation of the crew of the Allied aircraft which attacked enemy shipping off Guadalcanal at 1730/6/7 indicates that the composition of the force was as follows:
 - 1 Cruiser
 - 2 large destroyers
 - 1 transport of 10,000 tons
 - 3 smaller transports (4,000 to 6,000 tons)
 - 5 vessels apparently Motor Torpedo Boats, circling the other ships at high speed.
- (b) Preliminary examination of the photographs taken at the time by this aircraft reveals -
 - 1 light Cruiser under way
 - 1 possible Sub Chaser
 - 1 transport (8,000 tons)
 - 2 transports (7,000 tons)
 - 1 transport (5,000 tons)
 - 8 speed boats moving around the shipping.

A number of small launches, 10 landing barges and five pontoon landing jetties are shown along the beach.

The photos also show several sheds fronting the beach and possible gun positions under construction.

(iv) At 0645/7 -

- 4 Kawanisi Type 97 P/B's were observed flying Southwards and Eastwards of the Guadalcanal coast.

- 1 H24 sighted -
 - 1 Cruiser,
 - 1 Destroyer, and
 - 12 "Merchant Ships"North of Lunga, course N.W.
(See Naval Incidents).

General Comment: It would appear that the enemy has landed a considerable force in the Lunga area on Guadalcanal Is. In addition, A.C.H. Townsville consider that the enemy has possibly effected a landing in a position approximately at the mouth of the Segilau River, 8 miles from Cape Esperance.

The motive of these operations is probably to establish as rapidly as possible an advanced air base on the grassy plains area of Guadalcanal Is.

It is considered that the 4 transports sighted would carry a force of at least 5,000 men.

- 2, possibly 3, Light Cruisers (1 Tenryu 1 Kashima)

- (vi) There are indications of increased activity in the Marshalls area.
- (vii) There were indications on 4/7 of enemy convoy movements from Pohnosa to Port Arthur.

- (b) It is believed likely that the entrance to Kiska Harbour has been mined by the enemy.
- (c) On 4/7 Allied aircraft sighted the following enemy forces:-
 - Attu: 1 possible battleship.
 - Kiska: 3 cruisers and 1 unidentified vessel, 3 seaplanes.
 - Agattu: (35 miles S.E. of Attu.)
3 cruisers,
5 destroyers,
3 large transports.

(2) Enemy submarines remain active in the Eastern Aleutians area.

E) SOUTH EASTERN PACIFIC AREA. (See Appendix).

F) INDIAN OCEAN AREA.

British and Allied Forces. (See Appendix).

Enemy Forces.

- (1) Mozambique Channel. Three Japanese submarines commenced operating in the Mozambique Channel on 30/6 and are expected to continue operations until 8/7. There were D/P indications on 3/7 that a further flotilla, probably of 3 submarines, was proceeding to the area South of Capetown. In addition, two Japanese merchant raiders which were operating in this area early last month may still be in the Indian Ocean.

(F) - INDIAN OCEAN AREA. (Contd.)

Enemy Forces (Contd.)

- (ii) German Raider "E" is still probably operating in the Indian Ocean area.

2. NAVAL INCIDENTS.

GUADALCANAL. One B24 attacked enemy shipping off Guadalcanal at 1155/7/7, dropping 6 x 500 lb. demolition bombs from 12,000 ft. A direct hit was scored on a small motor torpedo boat.

3. AIR OPERATIONS.

Enemy.

- (1) Port Moresby 6/7. A supplementary report of the enemy raid on 6/7 indicates that 20 Heavy Bombers, escorted by 10 Type "G" Fighters, made 3 runs over the Seven Mile and Twelve Mile Aerodromes. One bomb dump containing 36 x 100 lb. demolition bombs destroyed.
- (2) Horn Island. 18 bombers (type unknown) bombed Aerodrome buildings and personnel quarters. Extensive fires were started. No attempt was made to bomb the runway.

4. ENEMY'S PROBABLE NEXT MOVE.

- (i) Development of major advanced air base in Guadalcanal-Tulagi area (Solomons).
- (ii) Possible occupation of Nauru and Ocean Island.
- (iii) Possible attack on Port Moresby area.
- (iv) Consolidation of bases in occupied territory.
- (v) Continued submarine and surface raider activity in the Indian Ocean and Pacific areas.

- (i) Broken Bay (New South Wales).
At 1940K/8/7, 2215K/8/7 and 2325K/8/7 reports were received from a fisherman and Naval Auxiliary Patrols which indicated the possible presence of an enemy submarine in BROKEN BAY (25 miles N. of Sydney). The reports are graded C3.
- (ii) Guadalcanal (Solomons).
A report from the Resident Commissioner, Solomon Islands, dated 8/7, shows that the Japanese are consolidating on Guadalcanal Is.
A/A guns have been installed at TAIVU (20 miles East of LUNGA POINT) and KUKUK (1 mile S.W. of LUNGA POINT).
The preparation of an aerodrome at LUNGA (1 mile S.E. of LUNGA POINT) is indicated by a clearing in the coconut grove.
Fuel has been stored in dumps from LUNGA to TENARU (3 1/2 miles S.E.S. of LUNGA POINT).
A small detachment of Japanese is said to be established at CAPE ESPERANCE (22 miles N.W. of LUNGA POINT).
Photographic reconnaissance on 6/7 revealed the presence of several sheds fronting the beach and evidence of possible A/A positions under construction at LUNGA.
- (iii) Rahaul.
An analysis of photographs of Rahaul Harbour taken at 0959/8/7 reveals -

7 Merchant Ships (from 8,000 tons to 2,000 tons)
3 Landing pontoons

At Lakunai Aerodrome 8 Bombers and 5 Fighters were observed.

- (ii) German Raider H is still probably operating in the Indian Ocean.
- (iii) There are indications that a Japanese unit was in the vicinity of Cocos Is. at 1330/5.

2. NAVAL INCIDENTS.

CAPE EVERARD (VIC.)

S.S. "MARINA" (part of Convoy OC9) and S.S. "ROBERT J. HARPER" (part of Convoy C09) collided during the night of 8/7 in a position South of CAPE EVERARD. "MARINA" sustained damage to her bow 10 ft. above the waterline, "ROBERT J. HARPER" was holed on her starboard side.

"BELTANA" (part of Convoy OC9) has also sustained damage. Pumps are coping with water and all ships are able to proceed at 8 knots.

"MADRAS" and "ROBERT J. HARPER" are proceeding with Convoy C09 to Melbourne. "HALGOONLIN" "BELTANA" and "MARINA" are proceeding with Convoy OC9 to Sydney.

AIR OPERATIONS (ENEMY). 2 4-Engine flying boats reported over NAURU yesterday 8/7.

Interrogation of the crew of S.S. "ALBERT E. WATTS" (U.S. Tanker) which arrived Brisbane p.m. 10/7, confirms the fact that the SSSS signal intercepted at 0615/7/7 from a vessel in a position 36° 50' S. 161° 15' E. (approx. 530 miles E.S.E. of Sydney) emanated from that ship.

The Submarine was sighted at that time and in that position by 7 members of the crew of "ALBERT E. WATTS" at a range of approx. 800 yards and abaft the starboard beam of the ship. Only the conning tower of the Submarine was visible.

The ship increased speed, changed course and swung her stern to the Submarine to train the ship's guns on it but before the gun crew could open fire the Submarine submerged and was not sighted again.

Three of the crew describe the Submarine as of RO33-34 Class, 2 describe it as I 6-8 Class and one man describes it as of I 1-4 Class.

(ii) There are indications that one Division (3 units) of Subron 7 is en route Truk from Japan. As the Commander of Subron 7 is already thought to be in the New Britain area, this Division may be intended for operations in this area.

- (vi) It is reported that since 3/7, four Japanese submarines have been sighted in the Mozambique Channel, two operating between 15°S. and 20°S. and probably two in the area 21°-29°S. and West of 37°E. There is no evidence of any submarines now operating South of these areas. The last reported submarine attack on shipping in this area occurred on a.m. 8/7. There are indications, however, of submarine reinforcements arriving from the East which could commence operations in the Mozambique Channel about 14/7.

Allied. Dilli. Further to the attack on Dilli on 9/7, fires caused are stated to have lasted 52 hours.

Enemy. Milne Bay. A twin-engined bomber was reported at 1030/12/7. It circled the bay and departed East. This aircraft may possibly be an Allied unit. Port Moresby. An alert was sounded at 1244/12 and all clear at 1342/12. No raid developed. Horn Island. An air raid warning was sounded at 1512/12 and an all clear at 1539/12.

2. AIR OPERATIONS

- (1) CAPE LAMBERT (N.W. tip of Gazelle Peninsula) - Three "Zero" Fighters attacked a B.17 on recce in this area at 1150/13. In an engagement lasting 40 minutes, 2 "Zero's" were hit and possibly damaged. Both wings of the B.17 were holed by cannon and M.G. fire and one of its engines rendered unserviceable.

3. ENEMY'S PROBABLE NEXT MOVE

- (i) Development of major advanced air base in Guadalcanal - Tulagi area (Solomons).
- (ii) Occupation of Nauru and Ocean Island.
- (iii) Possible attack on Port Moresby area.



Enemy Forces

- (i) There are continued indications of enemy raiders operating in the Indian Ocean. These include probably German Raider E and two Japanese merchant raiders.
(a) "INDUS" was attacked by an enemy raider in approx 1200 miles S.W. of Cocos Is. at 1503EP/20 (see Naval Incidents).
(b) The British vessel "HAURAKI" was captured by a Japanese raider 1500 miles south of Colombo on 12/7.
(c) A Japanese unit was in the vicinity of Cocos Is. on 5/7 while a Japanese aircraft was reported flying over Cocos at 1015PG/20.
(d) Admiralty report that 23 allied vessels have now been sunk, one captured and eight others attacked in the Indian Ocean in addition to which, 3 others are still overdue at their ports of destination.
(ii) As there have been no attacks by Japanese submarines in the Madagascar area since 1/7, it is considered that the units recently operating in Mozambique Channel may have withdrawn to the south or S.E. of Madagascar to replenish supplies. There were indications that reinforcements would arrive from the eastwards by 14/7, but on 17/7 there had been no evidence of the arrival of reinforcements.

2. NAVAL INCIDENTS

- (i) KAMCHATKA PENINSULA - A Japanese submarine is reported to have opened fire with a 5" battery on a Russian merchant vessel in position 53°21'N, 161°10'W (North of Petropavlovsk) at 1728M/17. Another merchant vessel proceeding independently was fired on and sunk by a submarine at 1800M/15 in position 53°41'N, 157°40'W. One submarine could have been responsible for both these attacks.
(ii) JERVIS BAY - SUBMARINE ACTIVITY -- At 2300K/20 the Greek merchant vessel "G.S. LIVANOS" (4,315 tons) was sunk by an enemy submarine 15 - 20 miles off Jervis Bay. Seventeen survivors were landed at Jervis Bay in the ship's boat. Others are believed to be in another boat. An air search is being conducted.
(iii) INDIAN OCEAN RAIDER ACTIVITY - An RRRR signal was intercepted at 2318H 20/7 from "INDUS" (British merchant vessel - 5187 tons) indicating that the vessel was being shelled by a "battleship raider" in a position 26°44'S, 82°50'E (approx 1200 miles S.W. Cocos Is.) at 1503EP/20 and that the vessel transmitting the message was experiencing interference in its transmission by the enemy raider.

Comment - There has been no recent intelligence to suggest an enemy cruiser or heavy warship is operating in this area. At least two Japanese merchant raiders and one German merchant raider (E) are believed to be operating in the Indian Ocean and one of these units, possibly the Japanese raider which captured the British vessel "HAURAKI" in this general area on 12/7, was responsible for this attack.

3. AIR OPERATIONS

- (1) PORT MORESBY - Raider Raid No.72 -- 26 bombers escorted by 15 "Zero" fighters, bombed Seven Mile aerodrome at 1021/20, registering two direct hits on the middle of the runway, one hit on the parking area; 49 drums of fuel were destroyed, and large grass fires were started. The runways were rendered unserviceable for two hours. One Hudson was destroyed and another slightly damaged. Twenty Aircobras were airborne, but only three made contact with the enemy bombers. One Aircobra is missing and another crashlanded near Cape Nelson.

4. ENEMY'S PROBABLE NEXT MOVE

- (i) Development of major advanced air base in Guadalcanal - Tulagi area (Solomons).
(ii) Occupation of Nauru and Ocean Island.
(iii) Possible attack on Port Moresby area.
(iv) Consolidation of bases in occupied territory.
(v) Continued submarine and surface raider activity in the Indian Ocean and Pacific areas.

- (ix) "CAIRNS" at Brisbane was to be at extended notice until a.m. 21/7 to carry out essential repairs to main engine bearings.

(1) BUNA-AMBASI AREA

- (a) At 0820/21 a B.17 on recon reported sighting enemy units as under -
 2 battleships described as having 2 turrets fore and aft
 4 destroyers in diamond formation
 The position of the sighting was 7°15'S, 148°30'E, the course was given as 260° and the speed 12 knots.
 From an examination of photographs, the large vessels are not considered battleships, but are thought to be heavy cruisers similar in appearance to the two heavy units previously reported N.E. of Cape St. George 20/7.
- (b) At or near Ambasi, 2 destroyers with aircraft patrol overhead were observed at 1515 and 1545/21.
- (c) At 1700K/21 a B.17 observed one transport with bows grounded slightly south of Buna, and 4 transports and 4 destroyers four miles south of Ambasi and four miles off shore.
- (d) At 1825/21 the same B.17 as in (c) observed three transports and four destroyers in position 8°44'S, 148°31'E near Cape Sudest.
 Comment - The minimum total of enemy units operating in the area would appear to be -
 2 heavy cruisers (poss. 1 "AOBA", 1 "KAKO" cl)
 4 destroyers
 5 transports
- (e) At 1450/21 a Type 95 Floatplane machine-gunned Buna and departed N.W. No damage or casualties resulted.
- (f) At 1705/21 a Floatplane carried out a recon of Buna. An object, apparently a ship with two funnels, was observed on the horizon

at the same time.

Note: Floatplanes probably operated from cruisers.

(g) At 1710/21 it was reported that warships (type unspecified) were shelling off Buna.

Note: The shelling possibly refers to the A.A. fire directed against the allied air attack. (See Air Operations).

(ii) SOLOMON ISLANDS

(a) A reliable native report of 19/7 indicates the following enemy activity in this area -

Tanavula Point (W. end of Sandfly Passage) - A.A. guns 2"/3".

Makambo Island - Wireless Station

Santa Ysabel Island - Enemy warships use the harbour (probably Rekata Bay) during the day, but leave every night.

The report also indicates the presence in this area of two enemy submarines about 100 feet long.

(b) Kessa (Buka Is.) - An unconfirmed report states that four warships (type unspecified) arrived at Kessa 19/7 and were still there on 20/7.

(iii) For submarine activity see Naval Incidents.

(iv) TASMANIA - Heavy explosions similar to gunfire were heard between 0836 and 0909/21 from the direction of Cape Raoul, 42 miles S.E. Hobart. Investigations are proceeding.

2. WESTERN AUSTRALIA SECTOR

(v) "OTUS" to depart Fremantle about 25/7 after the arrival of "PELIAS" and proceed to San Francisco via Melbourne and Wellington.

(vi) "PELIAS" en route Melbourne to Albany E.T.A. 1200 today 22/7.

(vii) "TOOWOOMBA" & "GERALDTON" are to be sailed for Kilindini about 24/7, in company with tanker "BARREIN". After fuelling en route "BARREIN" is to be despatched to Abadan.

(viii) "TASMAN" under escort of "WARRNAMBOOL" departed Darwin 0727/21 E.T.A. Port Moresby 0800/25.

- (11) As there have been no attacks by Japanese submarines in the Madagascar area since 1/7, it is considered that the units recently operating in Mozambique Channel may have withdrawn to the south or S.E. of Madagascar to replenish supplies. There were indications that reinforcements would arrive from the eastwards by 14/7, but on 17/7 there had been no evidence of the arrival of reinforcements.

NAVAL INCIDENTS

(1) SUBMARINE ACTIVITY N.E.W. COAST

- (a) The total complement of the es "GEORGE M. LIVANOS" which was sunk off Jervis Bay at 2300E/20 is known to have been saved.
- (b) XX POINT PERPENDICULAR (Entrance to JARVIS BAY) - The U.S. merchant ship "COAST FARMER" (3,290 tons) was torpedoed by an enemy submarine in a position 25 miles S. by E. from Point Perpendicular at 0200E/21/7. A torpedo struck the vessel amidships which caused the engine room to flood. The vessel sank in 20 minutes. One of the crew is missing. The submarine is reported to have come to the surface and examined the ship from close range with a searchlight but did not attempt to molest or play the searchlight on survivors.

Comment - One submarine could have been responsible for both submarine attacks on the "GEORGE M. LIVANOS" and "COAST FARMER".

3. AIR OPERATIONS



A B.17 on reconnaissance dropped 4 x 1000 lb bombs on enemy shipping 4 miles south of Ambasi at 1700/21. No hits were scored, intense A.A. fire was encountered from the transports.

5 B.26's attacked shipping 4 miles S.E. of Ambasi dropping 25 x 500-lb bombs from 6300/7000 ft. One direct hit on a transport was observed. Visibility was poor due to haze and falling light.

"BLUE" arrived Wellington 18/7.

Enemy Forces

(i) There are indications that the enemy destroyer strength in the Indies area has been increased. Reinforcements include units from Desron 4 and Desron 5.

(ii) There are indications that the aircraft carrier "ZUIKAKU" may proceed to Singapore shortly possibly for docking.

(iii) The two remaining heavy cruisers of Crudiv 7 ("KUMANO" & "SUZUYA") with 8 destroyers are believed to be en route Sourabaya. These cruisers are also possibly proceeding for docking.

(iv) There have been recent indications of increased air activity in the Malaya - Andamans area.

(v) TIMOR - It is reported that a n enemy vessel departed Dilli on 19/7 carrying approx 40 troops. The vessel proceeded in a westerly direction.

Two small launches, said to be equipped with W/T departed Dilli easterly on 18/7 returning on 20/7.

A report graded C.2. states that five small ships were approaching Dilli from the West on 20/7.

B) CENTRAL PACIFIC AREA

British and Allied Forces (See Appendix)

Enemy Forces

(i) The Commander of the new 8th Fleet is believed to have departed from Japanese Home Waters in his Flagship "CHOKAI" probably en route Rabaul - Solomons area.

In addition there have been indications that the heavy cruiser "MYOKO" (Crudiv 5) may proceed to the New Britain area in conjunction with the new 8th Fleet.

Comment - The arrival of these two heavy cruisers in the New Britain - Solomons area would make a total of at least four heavy cruisers in that area in addition to three light cruisers and probably 12 destroyers.

(ii) There are indications that army troopships are moving from Davao (Philippines) to the New Britain area screened by units of Desron 5.

(iii) The aircraft carriers "SHOKAKU" and "JUNYO" are believed exercising in the Southern Kyushu area.

(iv) Subron 6 (4 units) is thought to be en route Truk from Japan while a Subdiv (3 units) of Subron 7 has already arrived Truk.

Comment - The movement of additional submarines to the Truk area from Japan suggests intensification of submarine activity in the S.W.P.A.

(b) British vessel "INDUS" was attacked by an enemy raider approx 1200 miles S.W. of Cocos Is. at 1503EP/20.

(c) The British vessel "HAURAKI" was captured by a Japanese raider 1600 miles south of Colombo on 12/7.

(d) A Japanese unit was in the vicinity of Cocos Is. on 5/7 while a Japanese aircraft was reported flying over Cocos Is. at 1015PG/20.

2. NAVAL INCIDENTS

(1) ENEMY SUBMARINE ACTIVITY - N.S.W. COAST - Two further vessels have been attacked by enemy submarines in this area.

(a) At 0530/22 U.S. Freighter "WILLIAM DAWES" (7,176 tons) was torpedoed and sunk by an enemy submarine in position 36°45'S, 150° 20'E (approx 16 miles E. of Tathra Head). Four of the

crew were killed and three injured. The injured and survivors were landed at Merimbula.

- (b) At 0723/23 the British vessel "ALARA" (3,297 tons) en route Sydney E.T.A. 23/7 was torpedoed aft in a position 33°03'S, 152°17'E (30 miles E.S.E. Newcastle). The captain of the vessel has requested that tugs be sent to assist.
- (c) The following enemy submarine sightings were reported off the N.S.W. Coast on 22/7 -

1015/22 36°48'S, 150°20'E (17 miles E. by S. of Tathra Head)
1050/22 36°51'S, 150°03'E (8 miles S. by E. of Tathra Head)
1100/22 36°55'S, 150°03'E (12 miles S. by E. of Tathra Head)
1555/22 35°07'S, 151°01'E (10 miles E. of Jervis Bay)

It would appear that at least three enemy submarines are operating in this general area.

- (d) It is now reported that 41 survivors from the "COAST FARMER" were landed at Jervis Bay. One member of the crew is missing.
- (e) The vessel sunk off Jervis Bay at 2300/20 was the Greek vessel "G.S.LIVANOS" and not "GEORGE M.LIVANOS" as previously reported.
- GENERAL - Convoys are to be re-instituted for vessels other than those defensively armed and capable of maintaining 12 knots, between Melbourne and Brisbane. CO Convoys are to be sailed with escort of two H.M.A. M/S's and OC Convoys with H.M.A.S. "DOOMBA" only as escort. Convoys are to R.V. in Bass Strait, M/S's to return with OC Convoy to Sydney and Newcastle, and "DOOMBA" to return to Melbourne with CO Convoy.

3. AIR OPERATIONS

BUNA BAY AREA - Between 0625/22 and 1755/22 fifteen attacks were made on enemy shipping in the Buna Bay area. One enemy transport (8,000 - 10,000 tons) was destroyed, several barges were sunk and a near miss was recorded on the stern of a destroyer.

24th July, 1942

1. DISPOSITIONS ALLIED & ENEMY NAVAL FORCES

A) SOUTH WESTERN PACIFIC AREA

1. EASTERN AUSTRALIA SECTOR

British and Allied Forces

- (i) "STUART" & "MORESBY" escorting Convoy ZK15 (3 M.V.) departed Sydney 21/7 for Townsville.
- (ii) "ARUNTA" & "YANDRA" departed Newcastle 0943/23 and 1023/23 respectively to join Convoy C012 and escort to Wilsons Promontory, and hand over to "DOOMBA" at 0800/26. "ARUNTA" with "GERKLONG" "ARMIDALE" & "WHYALLA" then to escort Convoy C012 (escorted to this position by "DOOMBA" & "WHYALLA") to Sydney. "GERKLONG" escorting Sydney portion of C012 departed Sydney 1503/23.
- (iii) "SWAN" arrived Townsville from Port Moresby 2115/23.
- (iv) "KATOOMBA" escorting "SWARTENHOND" arrived Townsville from Milne Bay 0650/23. "COLAC" escorting "JAPARA" was due Milne Bay 1100/23. Both vessels later to proceed Townsville. "MANGOLA" was to depart Townsville 23/7 under escort so as to arrive Milne Bay 2200/27.
- (v) ~~XXXXXXXX~~ "WARREGO" escorting "HANYANG" from Fitzroy Island was due Milne Bay 1100/23.
- (vi) "CAIRNS" "MILDURA" & "DELOIRINE" escorting Convoy P06 departed Brisbane 1440/23. To R.V. with local escorts at Newcastle at 0900/25 and proceed Sydney E.T.A. p.m. 26/7.
- (vii) "WARRNAMBOOL" escorting "TASMAN" from Darwin to Port Moresby arrived Thursday Island 2130/23.
- (viii) "KURUMBA" departed Townsville 1105/23 for Brisbane E.T.A. 0500/26.
- (ix) At Sydney - "ABRAHAM CRYNSEN" "K.12" "K.9" "DOBRIN" "CHEVREUIL" "CAP DES PALMES"
- (x) At Melbourne - "MIN UNDA" -- Repairing "VENDETTA" "GOLDSTAR"
- (xi) At Brisbane - "GRIFFIN" "ATREUS" "ALSEY" "FULSA"
- (xii) For submarines in Eastern Sector - see Appendix.

- (i) SYDNEY -
 - (a) A crossing of a loop at Sydney was recorded at 1935/23.
 - (b) H.M.A.S. "ARUNTA", when off Port Jackson on convoy duty at 1950/23, received a submarine contact. Subsequent naval searches were negative.
- (ii) TATHRA HEAD - One Beaufort sighted ^{and bombed} an enemy submarine 8 miles off Tathra Head at 1030/22. Results not assessed.
- (iii) RABAUL - A B.17 on recce observed one destroyer and one medium merchant vessel approx 50 miles N.W. of Rabaul at 1423/23 on a westerly course and some Flying Boats and four ships were observed in Rabaul Harbour.
- (iv) BUNA
 - (a) Examinations of photographs taken by allied aircraft over Buna on 22/7 show -
 - 2 merchant ships (one about 4,000 tons) burning
 - 1 7,000 ton transport
 - 1 9,000 ton transport
 - possibly a landing craft carrier
 - torpedo boats and small motor boats
 - 22 barges close to shore near Gona
 - 4 A.A. guns near Mission buildings
 - (b) N.O.I.C. Moresby who was in the B.17 shadowing the enemy landing forces considers that the total force in the Buna area between 0715/22 and 1100/22 comprised -
 - 2 cruisers (which he considered to be "YUBARI" - 2,890 tons, 6-5.5" guns, flagship of Desron 6--and either "TATSUTA" or "TENHYU" - 3,200 tons, 4-5.5" guns-part of Grudiv 18)
 - 1 destroyer
 - 1 transport 8,000 tons
 - 1 cargo vessel 6,000 tons
 - 1 cargo vessel 5,000 tons
 - 2 M/S type vessels and at least 2 speedboats

He considers that casualties during the landing were probably heavy.

Comment - Units of CruDiv 18 and Desron 6 are known to have been in the New Britain - Solomons area although "YUBARI" was thought to have been one of the units sunk during the Coral Sea action in May.

- (c) During air attacks in the Buna area on 23/6, one transport (5,000 tons) was observed south of Buna course S.E. Direct hit amidships was registered on this ship causing a large fire. 25 barges were observed at Buna at 0630/23 and 20 barges were observed at Gona at 1105/23.
- (d) ORO BAY (27 miles E.S.E. of Gona) - one ship of 1000 tons was sighted stationary off Oro Bay at 0900/23.
- (v) SALAMAU - One cargo vessel, 2,000 tons, and one vessel probably a destroyer, were observed in Salamaua Harbour at 0815 - 0823/23.
- (vi) One Hudson on patrol sighted at 1337/23 one 1,000 ton vessel in the vicinity of Beagle Bay (42 miles S.E. of Port Moresby). Aircraft later despatched to investigate sighted only a small fishing vessel.

H.M.A.S. "ROCKHAMPTON" reported at 1737/22 that "DAWES" was still afloat, burning fore and aft.

- (vi) "WARRNAMBOOL" escorting "TASMAN" was to proceed Thursday Island to Port Moresby 24/7 E.T.A. 1600/26. "WARRNAMBOOL" to return Thursday Island after refuelling.

- (ii) SMOKY CAPE (175 miles N. of Sydney) - SS "MURADA" reported a submarine in position 31°03'S, 153°07'E (8 miles south of Smoky Cape).
- (iii) SYDNEY - H.M.A.S. "ARUNTA" reports R.D.F. indications of an unidentified aircraft south east of Port Jackson at 2000/23.
- (iv) SALAMUA - A reliable report states that an enemy destroyer was at Salamua a.m. 24/7 and departed to the North at 1154/24.
- (v) NEW BRITAIN - Two small unidentified vessels were sighted by recon aircraft in position 04°25'S, 150°35'E (35 miles N.E. of Willaumez Peninsula) at 1025/24.
- (vi) GONA - No shipping was observed at Gona during air attacks 24/7, except one transport half submerged. A few barges were observed at Buna.
Natives state that 600 Japanese and 400 natives from Rabaul landed at Gona from two cargo vessels. One of these vessels was only half unloaded and the other returned to Rabaul fully laden.

Enemy Forces

PREMANTLE - An unidentified crossing of No.1 Loop at Fremantle was recorded at 1746/24. H.M.A.S. "MADRAS" sighted a periscope in the vicinity and fired depth charges which failed to explode. Air and surface patrols are continuing.

3. EAST INDIES - PHILIPPINES

- (i) There are indications that the enemy destroyer strength in the Indies area has been increased. Reinforcements include units from Desron 4 and Desron 5.

- (iii) The two remaining heavy cruisers of Crudiv 7 ("KUMANO" & "SUZUYA") with 8 destroyers are believed to be en route Sourabaya. These cruisers are also possibly proceeding for dx docking.
- (iv) There have been recent indications of increased air activity in the Malaya - Andamans area.

B) CENTRAL PACIFIC AREA

- (i) The Commander of the new 8th Fleet is believed to be en route Rabaul - Solomons area in his Flagship "CHOKAI".
- (iii) In addition there have been indications that the heavy cruiser "MYOKO" (Crudiv 5) may proceed to the New Britain area in conjunction with the new 8th Fleet.
Comment - The arrival of these two heavy cruisers in the New Britain Solomons area would make a total of at least four heavy cruisers in that area in addition to three light cruisers and probably 12 destroyers.
- (ii) There are indications that army troopships are moving from Davao (Philippines) to the New Britain area screened by units of Desron 5.
- (iii) There are indications of an increased number of submarines in the Truk area.

- (iii) Enemy submarines remain active in the N.W. Pacific area.

- (i) There are continued indications of enemy raiders operating in the Indian Ocean. These include probably German Raider E and two Japanese merchant raiders.
 - (a) U.S. Freighter "IRENEE DU PONT" sent out a raider distress signal from a position 1140 miles E. by N. of Durban at 1700/21.
 - (b) British vessel "INDUS" was attacked by an enemy raider approx 1200 miles S.W. of Cocos Is. at 1503EF/20.
 - (c) ~~AXXXXXX~~ The British vessel "HAURAKI" was captured by a Japanese raider 1500 miles south of Colombo on 12/7.
 - (d) A Japanese unit was in the vicinity of Cocos Is. on 5/7 while a Japanese aircraft was reported flying over Cocos Is. at 1015PG/20.
- (ii) There have been indications that at least one enemy submarine was in the Chagos Archipelago area on 23/7 and one west of the Seychelles on 20/7.

2. NAVAL INCIDENTS

- (i) NEWCASTLE - Details of the submarine attack on "ALLARA" are as follows -

The first torpedo struck at 0515/23 and wrecked the stem. The submarine surfaced at 0525 and fired a second torpedo which narrowly missed the stem. The submarine circled "ALLARA" at a distance of 1 to 1½ cables and verbally ordered the crew to abandon ship. At 0530 the submarine abeam on the starboard side fired a shot high over the ship, and "ALLARA" was then abandoned. The submarine then made off and the vessel was reboarded at 0715 and an emergency aerial rigged. The submarine is reported as approx 300 feet in length.

"ST. ARISTELL" (tug) is to depart Sydney 1200 today 25/7 for Newcastle to tow "ALLARA" to Sydney. "YANDRA" to provide A/S escort to and from Newcastle.

- (ii) FORMOSA - Records kept by Chinese coastal observation posts between Fochow and Lhuanchow show that no Japanese warships other than small destroyers and gunboats have passed through Formosa Strait since about one week before the Coral Sea Battle. Fairly large steamers frequently take this route, probably en route to or from Indo-China, but they very seldom call at Hong Kong.
- (iii) GENERAL - Two further exchange vessels are to depart Yokohama soon under safe conduct as follows -
 - "TATUTA MARU" departs Yokohama about 30/7 for Laurence Marques via Shanghai - Saigon - Singapore, E.T.A. about 27/8.
 - "KAMAKURA MARU" departs Yokohama about 10/8 for same destination via Kobe, Shanghai, Singapore E.T.A. about 7/9.

3. AIR OPERATIONS

ALLIED

GONA - Five attacks by 13 B.26's, 1 Hudson, 8 A.24's, 10 P.40's, 2 P.39's were carried out between 0650 and 1412/24 on barges, stores and installations at Gona. Two buildings were hit and one A.A. battery silenced. Only opposition was by A.A. fire.

ENEMY

PORT MORESBY - At least 18 bombers escorted by 16 "Zero" fighters attacked Twelve Mile Aerodrome at 1400/24. Some bombs and petrol destroyed.

BEAGLE BAY (WJA) - An unidentified aircraft was observed at 1115/24.

Enemy Forces

- (i) PEARL CHANNEL - (N.E. Entrance to Moreton Bay) - Simultaneous swings were observed on guard loops 1 and 2 in Pearl Channel at 2140/25. There was no registration on the mine loop and searchlight investigation was negative.
- (ii) TACKING POINT (107 miles N.E. by N. of Newcastle) - "MURADA" which sighted a submarine off Smoky Cape on 24/7 was unsuccessfully attacked by a submarine in position 22 miles S. by E. of Tacking Point, but has now reached port.
- (iii) CAPE EVERARD (150 miles N.E. of Wilsons Promontory) - Two vessels being escorted in Convoy C012 were attacked 6 miles due south of Cape Everard at 0500/25, and slightly damaged.
- (iv) CORAL SEA - S.42 reports having sighted an enemy submarine R0.60 class in approx position 10°S, 155°40'E (approx 180 miles E.S.E. Woodlark Island) on 22/7, course 330°.
- (v) KESSA (Solomons) - It is reported that there were no enemy ships at Kessa at 1900/23.
- (vi) NEW HANOVER - A recon aircraft sighted two very large vessels of unknown type escorted by two small tenders in position 2°28'S, 150°37'E (Ysabel Passage) at 1135/25, on a S.E. course.
- (vii) RABAUL - An analysis of photographs taken over Rabaul Harbour on 23/7 reveals 3 merchant vessels, 14 small motor boats, 5 flying boats in the Harbour.

- (x) SALAMAUA - Report indicates that the light cruiser "YUBARI" (Flagship Desron 6) arrived Salamaua 1424/25 and departed 1515. The vessel apparently had white bow markings.

- (ii) There have been indications that at least one enemy submarine was in the Chagos Archipelago area on 23/7 and one west of the Seychelles on 20/7.

2. NAVAL INCIDENTS

(1) ENEMY SUBMARINE ACTIVITY - EAST COAST AUSTRALIA

Unsuccessful attacks were made on "MURADA" at 0946/24 in a position 31°50'S, 153°E (22 miles S. by E. of Tacking Point) and on two vessels in Convoy C012 ("WILLIAM McARTHUR" - 2393 tons; and "GOULBURN" 2367 tons). These two vessels were attacked and slightly damaged 6 miles due south of Cape Everard at 0500/25. (See Enemy Forces - E. Aust. Sector).

- (ii) NOUMEA - The Dutch vessel "TJINEGARA" (9227 tons) reported at 2338 25/7 that she had been torpedoed in a position 23°10'S, 165°40'E (approx 85 miles S. by W. of Noumea).

3. AIR OPERATIONS

ALLIED

- (1) BUNA-GONA - One B.25 attacked the area at 2330/24, and five attacks were carried out during 25/7 by a Catalina, B.25's, P.400's, P.39's. No damage observed.
- (ii) LAE - One Catalina attacked Lae 24/7. Results not observed.

- (1) TOWNSVILLE - Four or five aircraft dropped six bombs near wharves at Townsville at 2348/25.
- (ii) CAPE LEVEQUE (approx 100 miles NNE of Broome) - Four unidentified aircraft were observed over Cape Leveque at 1115/24.
- (iii) DARWIN - An attack at 2055/25 caused slight damage to power and water lines.

4. LAND OPERATIONS

NEW GUINEA - Isugahambo (25 miles west of Buna) was reported 23/7 to have been occupied by the enemy, and an enemy patrol of about 134 was at Awala (34 miles S.W. Buna) on 21/7.

The Papuan Infantry Battalion has withdrawn from Awala after demolishing buildings, stores etc.

- (i) Development of major advanced air base in Guadalcanal - Tulagi area (Solomons).
- (ii) Attack on Port Moresby area.
- (iii) Occupation of Nauru and Ocean Island.

- (v) "KATOOMBA" escorting two M.V. en route Milne Bay from Fitzroy Is. E.T.A. 1500/30.
- (vi) "CESSNOCK" escorting "BONTEKOE" to a position clear of China Strait departed Milne Bay 0615/28. Then to return Milne Bay to escort "MANGOLA" to Townsville.
- (vii) "WARRNAMBOOL" escorting "KARSIK" departed Port Moresby 2306/27 for Milne Bay E.T.A. 0800 today 29/7. If "CESSNOCK" & "BONTEKOE" are met, escorts are to be exchanged; otherwise previous orders are to be carried out.
- (viii) "YANDRA" escorting "ST. ARISTELL" & "WARANG" with "ALLARA" in tow arrived Sydney 0427/28.
- (ix) "BUNGARKE" departed Townsville 26/7 for Brisbane to join next Brisbane - Sydney convoy.
- (x) "WARREGO" escorting "HANYANG" en route Port Moresby to Townsville E.T.A. 0600/30.
- (xi) "COLAC" arrived Townsville 0455/28.
- (xii) "PALUMA" departed Cairns 0930/28, for Townsville E.T.A. 0600/29.
- (xiii) At Sydney - "STUART" "ABRAHAM GRYNSSER" "K.12" "K.9" "DOBBIN" "CHEVREUIL" "VICTORIA" "CAP DES PALMES" "MILDURA" "DELOIRINE" "YANDRA"
- (xiv) At Melbourne - ~~xxx~~ "DOOMBA" -- Repairing "VENDETTA" "GOLDSTAR"

- (ii) KAVIENG - Air recon 28/7 observed 4 cruisers or large destroyers, 1 small tender - sweeper type, and 5 or 6 small launches, in Kavieng ~~Karabax~~ area.
- (iii) RABAUL - Photographs 28/7 show the following shipping in Rabaul Harbour -
 - 1 light cruiser, 2 cargo vessels 6,000 tons, 4 cargo vessels 4,000 tons, 1 cargo vessel 3,000 tons, 2 unidentified vessels, 2,000 tons & 13,000 tons. Ten Flying Boats were also sighted in Harbour.
- (iv) TULAGI - Photographs taken 26/7 show that the only shipping in the Tulagi Harbour was 6 small boats.

- (vii) "BOMBAY" departed Fremantle for Adelaide 1630/27 E.T.A. Cape Willoughby 1000/2/8, Adelaide 1730/2.
- (viii) "GERALDTON" escorting "BAHREIN" en route Fremantle to Addu Atoll E.T.A. 8/8.
- (ix) "OTUS" departed Fremantle for Melbourne 25/7.
- (x) "VIGILANT" departed Darwin for special duties 25/7.
- (xi) At Fremantle - "TRINITY" "CHILDS" "HOLLAND" "K.S" "ERLING BROVIC" "ISABEL" "LANAKAI"

ALBANY - A large enemy submarine was sighted by an allied floatplane at 0737/28 in a position 35°45'S, 117°21'E (approx 50 miles S.W. of Bald Head, King George's Sound). The submarine crash-dived when sighted, and was not seen again.

3. EAST INDIES - PHILIPPINES

British and Allied Forces

Enemy Forces

- (i) "WETAR IS. (60 miles NNE Dilli) - It is reliably reported 27/7 that a Japanese force of unknown strength landed from large motor boats at Ilwaki (5 miles N.W. of Eden) on the southern coast of New Island.
- (ii) There are indications that Crudiv 7 ("KUMANO" & possibly "SUZUYA") and units of Desron 3 are now in the Malaya area. These units were previously thought to have been en route Sourabaya for docking but it would now appear likely that they have proceeded to Singapore for the same purpose.
- (iii) The Light Cruiser "ISUZU" (5,170 tons - 7-5.5") was in the vicinity of Ambon 28/7.
- (iv) There is no further information concerning the aircraft carrier "ZUIKAKU" which was recently believed to be in the Formosan area en route Singapore.

B) CENTRAL PACIFIC AREA

- (i) There are now indications that the Commander of the 8th Fleet in the heavy cruiser "CHOKAI" has departed Truk area possibly for New Britain. Previous intelligence has indicated the possibility of an additional unit, probably a heavy cruiser of Crudiv 5, being in company with "CHOKAI".
- (ii) The cruiser "KASHIMA" (5,800 tons; 4-5.5"), former Flagship of C in Fourth Fleet, is now believed to have arrived in Japanese Home Waters. C in C Fourth Fleet is believed to have transferred his Flag to one of the cruisers operating in the Truk - New Britain area.
- (iii) There are indications that six RO class submarines of Crudiv 7 have departed Northern Japanese waters for the Aleutians while units of Subron # 2 are proceeding back to Home Waters from the Aleutians - ^{Alaskan} area.
- (iv) There are indications that the enemy is re-organising his Aircraft Carrier Fleets following the loss of units of Cardivs 1 and 2.
- (v) The aircraft carrier Fleet was last reported operating in the Southern Kyushu area (Japan).
- (vi) A review of recent intelligence suggests that approx 12 - 14 enemy submarines are operating in the New Britain - Australasian waters

including probably half RO class (less 1,000 tons) and half "I" class units (1000 to 2,000 tons).

- (vii) There are indications of the movement of further construction units to the Kavieng, Rabaul, Lae area.

C) SOUTHERN PACIFIC AREA

- (i) Task Force 44 ("AUSTRALIA" (Flag) "CANBERRA" "CHICAGO" "SALT LAKE CITY" "HOBART" and seven destroyers) has reported to ComSOPAC.
(ii) "MONOWAI" "TUCKER" "PLATTE" "WORDEN" arrived Noumea 25/7. "MONOWAI" & "TUCKER" later departed.
(iii) At Tongatabu - "SOLACE" "RAINIER" "WHITNEY" "M TARES" "KANAWHA"
(iv) At Samoa - "TURKEY" "SWAN" "KINGFISHER"
(v) At Suva - "LEANDER" "CUMMINGS" "GALE"

(b) British vessel "INDUS" was attacked by an enemy raider approx 1200 miles S.W. of Cocos Is. at 1503/20.
(c) The British vessel "HAURAKI" was captured by a Japanese raider 1500 miles south of Colombo on 12/7.
(d) A Japanese unit was in the vicinity of Cocos Is. on 5/7 while a Japanese aircraft was reported flying over Cocos Is. at 1015/20.
(ii) There are indications that enemy submarines in the Indian Ocean ~~area~~ are operating over a much broader area, namely, in the Seychelles, Chagos, Maldives area as well as the Mozambique Channel. There are also indications that some of the units from the S.W. Indian Ocean area are changing stations or returning to their base, probably Penang.

(iii) MACKAY - An unidentified aircraft was reported very low south of Scawfell Is. (28 miles E.E. Mackay) at 0620/28, and later landed between Scawfell Is. and St. Bees Is. (18 miles N.E. Mackay).
(iv) DARWIN - An air raid warning was sounded at Darwin 0441/29 and a later report states that a raid was in progress.
(v) KIKORI - (214 miles N.E. Port Moresby) - unidentified aircraft were heard overhead on a westerly track course at 0943/28.
(vi)

(vi) MOHN ISLAND - An air raid warning was sounded at 1045/28. No details are available.

- (i) "STUART" to proceed from Sydney to Noumea to escort "WEST CAOTUS" carrying 300 troops from Noumea to Brisbane. E.T.A. 0300/3/8.
- (ii) "GEELONG" & "ARMIDALE" arrived Sydney 0330/29 with Sydney Section of Convoy OCL2. "WHYALLA" arrived Sydney 1529 after escorting Newcastle Section to Newcastle.
- (iii) "ARUNTA" & "KALGOORLIE" escorting Convoy ZK16 en route Sydney to Brisbane. "KALGOORLIE" to continue to Townsville with one M.V. and then proceed Darwin.

Enemy Forces(1) ENEMY SUBMARINES

- (a) Brisbane - "BUNGAREE" reported at 0800/29 a possible submarine in 26°42'S, 153°53'E (approx 60 miles N. by E. of Brisbane).
- (b) Cape Howe - A submarine was observed at 0450/29 by an allied aircraft at 200 feet in position 37°25'S, 150°22'E (20 miles E.N.E. Cape Howe). The submarine was observed on the surface on a southerly course but submerged when sighted.
- (ii) AMBASI-GONA - The following shipping was observed in this area yesterday 29/7 -
 - (a) At least 6 ships one of which is described as resembling an aircraft carrier, off Ambasi.
 - (b) 2 cargo vessels and one small naval unit, accompanied by aircraft, off Caution Point (20 miles N. of Gona), course south.
 - (c) 5 vessels off Bakumbari (5 miles north of Gona) as follows - 2 large ships in line, led by one small vessel probably a destroyer, with two smaller ships probably destroyers on either side.

Comment - There is no intelligence to support the suggestion that an aircraft carrier is in this area. A.C.H. Townsville considers that the vessel reported as

such is probably a landing craft carrier.
 (iii) KAVIENG - Analysis of photographs taken 28/7 during air reconnaissance confirms the presence of 4 cruisers and one small vessel off Manne Is. (10 miles S.W. of Kavieng) and of several launches in Kavieng Harbour.

An aircraft on reconnaissance 29/7 reported 4 destroyers, 1 gunboat, and one large barge approx 5 miles west of Manne Island.

Comment - It is probable that these sightings refer to the same vessels.

(iv) RABAUL - An aircraft on reconnaissance 29/7 sighted 4 warships (probably 2 cruisers, 2 destroyers) and 15 transports, also 20-25 launches, one probable minesweeper in Rabaul Harbour at 1055.

Comment - Ten merchant vessels and one light cruiser were in Harbour 28/7 and a convoy of two transports and two possible destroyers was observed en route Rabaul from the north.

(v) NIGHTINGALE BAY - An unidentified medium vessel was observed at anchor off Nightingale Bay (15 miles E.S.E. Wewak) at 0800/29.

(vi) COLERIDGE BAY - It is reported that a party landed on 27/7 at Coleridge Bay (Malaita Is. - N.W. corner) from a destroyer and one small craft which arrived on that date and departed on the following day.

(ii) There are indications that CruDiv 7 ("KUMANO" & possibly "SUZUYA") and units of Desron 3 are now in the Malaya area. These units were previously thought to have been en route Sourabaya for docking but it would now appear likely that they have proceeded to Singapore for the same purpose.

(iii) The Light Cruiser "ISUZU" (5,170 tons - 7-5.5") was in the vicinity of Ambon 28/7.

(iv) There is no further information concerning the aircraft carrier "ZUIKAKU" which was recently believed to be in the Formosan area en route Singapore.

- (ii) There are indications that the enemy is re-organising his Aircraft Carrier Fleets following the loss of units of Cardivs 1 and 2.
- (iii) The cruiser "KASHIMA" (5,800 tons; 4-5.5"), former Flagship of C in C Fourth Fleet, is now believed to have arrived in Japanese Home Waters. C in C Fourth Fleet is believed to have transferred his Flag to one of the cruisers operating in the Truk - New Britain area.
- (iv) There are indications that six RO class submarines of Crudiv 7 have departed Northern Japanese waters for the Aleutians while units of Subron 2 are proceeding back to Home Waters from the Aleutians - Alaskan area.
- (v) The aircraft carrier fleet was last reported operating in the Southern Kyushu area (Japan).
- (vi) A review of recent intelligence suggests that approx 12-14 enemy submarines are operating in the New Britain - Australasian waters, including probably half RO class (less 1,000 tons) and half "I" class units (1000 to 2000 tons).
- (vii) There are indications of the movement of further construction units to the Kavieng, Rabaul, Lae area.

 - (a) U.S. Freighter "IRENEE DU PONT" sent out a raider distress signal from a position 1140 miles E. by N. of Durban at 1700/21.
 - (b) British vessel "INDUS" was attacked by an enemy raider approx 1200 miles E.W. of Cocos Is. at 1503/20.
 - (c) The British vessel "HAURAKI" was captured by a Japanese raider 1500 miles south of Colombo on 12/7.
 - (d) A Japanese unit was in the vicinity of Cocos Is. on 5/7 while a Japanese aircraft was reported flying over Cocos Is. at 1015/20.
- (ii) There are indications that enemy submarines in the Indian Ocean are operating over a much broader area, namely, in the Seychelles, Chagos, Maldives area as well as the Mozambique Channel. There are also indications that some of the units from the S.W. Indian Ocean area are changing stations or returning to their base, probably Penang.

2. NAVAL INCIDENTS

THURSDAY ISLAND - Radio intercepts indicate that Thursday Island was attacked early today 30/7 by aircraft and also from the sea.

An RRRR signal was ~~xxxx~~, possibly due to an attack by enemy submarine. Further enquiries are being made.

3. AIR OPERATIONS - 29/7

ALLIED

- (i) AMBON - One Hudson attacked a three masted sailing vessel of 100 tons off Ambon. Two near misses scored on bow.
- (ii) BAKUMBAI (5 miles N.Gona) - 7 A.24's attacked enemy shipping at 1600. One direct hit on vessel believed destroyer. 7 escorting Aircobras engaged three Zero's one of which possibly damaged.

ENEMY

- (i) KAI IS. - An unknown number of Japanese aircraft reported near Toaal.
- (ii) PORT MORESBY - Three heavy bombers made three runs over Port Moresby without causing damage or casualties.
- (iii) DARWIN - Two heavy bombers made two runs at 0500 and a formation of three aircraft attacked at 0505. Slight damage to naval searchlight repair shop and fuel & tank.
- (iv) HORN ISLAND - An air raid was reported in progress at 0212/30. No details available.

ENEMY'S PROBABLE NEXT MOVE

- (i) Development of major advanced air base in Guadalcanal - Tulagi area (Solomons).
- (ii) Attack on Port Moresby area.
- (iii) Occupation of Nauru and Ocean Island.
- (iv) Consolidation of bases in occupied territory.
- (v) Continued submarine and surface raider activity in the Indian Ocean and Pacific areas.

ADDENDUM

CAPE HOWE - ENEMY SUBMARINE

The submarine reported off Cape Howe (~~XXXXXXXX~~ (Page 1) was attacked from 200 ft. at 0458. Six 250-lb. bombs were dropped as the submarine crash dived, one of which was seen to hit just forward of the conning tower while the remainder fell right on the target. A circle of oil 100 ft. in diameter was observed after the attack.

GUADALCANAL - A report from the Resident Commissioner, Solomons, indicates that the enemy has six shore-based Zero Fighters at Kukum. This is the first indication of shore-based aircraft being installed in this area.

- (xiii) At Moresby - "POTRERO"
- ~~(xiv) At Moresby - "POTRERO"~~
- (xiv) For submarines in Eastern Sector - see Appendix.

Enemy Forces

- (i) BRISBANE - "BUNGAREE's" report of a possible submarine off Brisbane 29/7 is not now considered probable.
- (ii) BASS STRAIT - There were indications 30/7 that enemy submarines were in the Eastern end of Bass Strait.
- (iii) GONA - BUNA -
 - (a) Katuna - It was reported 30/7 that Japanese landed from six launches at Katuna (10 miles N. Buna).
 - (b) One merchant vessel and three destroyers were observed at 0835/30 (approx 55 miles north of Buna on northerly course).
 - (c) One medium cargo vessel escorted by a destroyer was observed approx 120 miles N.E. Gona at 1615/30, course 220°.
 - (d) One cargo vessel was observed 1 mile north of Buna at 1700/30, on a course 150°.

Comment - These sightings indicate no increase in the number of enemy vessels in the area from 29/7, when the total was considered to be probably 3 destroyers and one other small warship and four merchant vessels.
- (iv) RABAU - Analysis of photographs taken during air recce 29/7 shows the following vessels in Harbour -
 - 1 light cruiser, 2 destroyers, 1 seaplane tender, 2 minelayer type, 4 transports (4-6,000 tons), 1 torpedo boat, 5 large motor boats

Comment - Visual recce on the ~~above date~~ ^{29/7} reported a total of 19 vessels other than small craft.
- (v) KAVIENG - Photographs show that the four destroyers reported by air recce 29/7 off Manne Is. were in fact light cruisers.
 - (b) Five vessels, type uncertain, were off Nusa Is. (half a mile west Kavieng) 30/7.

Comment - It is uncertain as yet whether these vessels are additional to the force located off Manne Is.

(vi) GENERAL - There are indications that heavy cruiser "CHOKAI" (C in C 8th Fleet) is now operating in the Rabaul area. This makes a total of at least 3 heavy cruisers now operating in New Britain - Solomons area.

2. WESTERN AUSTRALIA SECTOR

- (i) "PHOENIX" escorting Convoy ZK12 ("WESTRALIA" "MANGORA" "DUNTHOON" and 6 vessels ex Indian Ocean Convoy) en route Sydney E.T.A. Melbourne 3/8.
After disembarking, fuelling and provisioning at Sydney "WESTRALIA" to proceed Port Stephens to act as training ship for school of Combined Operations.
- (ii) "TROMP" "VOYAGER" were to leave ZK12 29/7 and return Fremantle.
- (iii) "TOWNSVILLE" escorting "TULAGI" en route Darwin to Thursday Island E.T.A. today 31/7.
- (iv) "BOMBAY" en route Fremantle to Adelaide E.T.A. 1730/2/8.
- (v) "GERALDTON" escorting "BAHREIN" en route Fremantle to Addu Atoll E.T.A. 8/8.
- (vi) "OTUS" departed Fremantle for Melbourne 25/7.
- (vii) "LITHGOW" escorting "JOHN JAY" departed Thursday Island 0420/30 for Darwin E.T.A. 1730/2.
- (viii) At Fremantle - "ADELAIDE" "KANIMBLA" "TRINITY" "CHILDS" "HOLLAND" "K.8" "ERLING BROVIC" "ISABEL" "LANAKAI" "WOLLONGONG" "MADRAS"
- (ix) At Albany - "PELIAS" "LARK" "WHIPPOORWILL" "MARYBOROUGH"
- (x) At Exmouth Gulf - "HERON" "W.B. PRESTON"
- (xi) For submarines in Western Sector - see Appendix.

3. EAST INDIES - PHILIPPINES

British and Allied Forces

Eleven submarines on patrol stations in China Sea or N.E.I. area (see appendix).

Enemy Forces

- (i) MALACCA STRAIT - Two heavy cruisers ("TAKAO" class) and 4 destroyers were sighted in a position 90 miles S.W. of Alor Star in the Malacca Straits proceeding in a NNW direction at 0625G/29. One of these units was probably the heavy cruiser "ASHIGARA", Flagship of 3rd Fleet, which is known to be operating in the area.
- (ii) BORNEO - A report from an allied submarine dated 29/7 indicates that the oil well and storage tanks at Miri (330 miles N.W. Serawak) were in productive condition but no vessels were observed there.
- (iii) There are indications that at least one unit of Crudiv 7 ("KUMANO") and units of Desron 3 are operating in the N.E.I. - Malayan area. It is also possible that the "TONE" (Crudiv 8) is operating in this area or in company with C in C 8th Fleet ("CHOKAI") in the New Britain area.
- (iv) There is no further information concerning the aircraft carrier "ZUIKAKU" which was recently reported en route Singapore.
Comment - The presence of additional heavy cruisers and one first class aircraft carrier in this area may indicate the formation of a Task Force for operations from this area.

B) CENTRAL PACIFIC AREA

British and Allied Forces (See Appendix)

Enemy Forces

- (i) There are indications that the heavy cruiser "TONE" (8-8") is possibly in company with C in C 8th Fleet ("CHOKAI" - 10,000 tons, 10-8"). "CHOKAI" is now believed operating in the Rabaul area and C in C 8th Fleet appears to have now taken command of operations in that area.
- (ii) The Cruiser "KASHIMA" (5,800 tons - 4-5.5"), former Flagship of C in C 4th Fleet is now believed in Japanese Home Waters. C in C 4th Fleet is believed to have transferred his Flag to one of the cruisers operating in the Truk - New Britain area. C in C Fourth Fleet was last reported at Truk 28/7.
- (iii) There are indications that the enemy has re-organised his Aircraft Carrier Fleets following the loss of units of Cardivs 1 and 2.
- (iv) The aircraft carriers, with the exception of "ZUIKAKU", are thought to be in Home Waters the majority exercising round the Southern Kyushu area.

- (v) A Submarine Task Force under the command of Comsubron 3 is operating in the Southern Pacific area. It would appear that approx 12 - 14 enemy submarines are operating in New Britain - Australasian waters including ~~xxx~~ probably half RO class (under 1000 tons) and half "I" class units (1000 to 2000).
- (vi) The Converted Seaplane Carrier "KANOI" is now reported en route Japan to the Marshalls while the Seaplane Carrier "CHITOSE" is believed to be in Formosan waters.
- (vii) The Converted Seaplane Tender "KENJO MARU" is believed en route Truk from Rabaul escorted by destroyers.

C) SOUTHERN PACIFIC AREA

British and Allied Forces

- (i) Task Force 44 ("AUSTRALIA" (Flag) "CANBERRA" "CHICAGO" "HOBART" and seven destroyers) has reported to Comsopac.
- (ii) At Tongatabu - "SOLACE" "RAINIER" "WHITNEY" "ANTARES" "KANAWHA"
- (iii) At Samoa - "TURKEY" "SWAN" "KINGFISHER"
- (iv) At Suva - "LEANDER" "CUMMINGS" "GALE"
- (v) At Auckland - "ACHILLES" "RIGEL" "MCKINAC" "CASTOR" "WALKE"
- (vi) At Noumea - "CURTIS" "McPARLAND" "SUMNER" "WORDEN" "PLATTE" "ARGONNE"

D) NORTHERN PACIFIC AREA

Enemy Forces - W. Aleutians

- (i) The movement of enemy supplies to Kiska area continues.
- (ii) One cruiser, 1 7,000 ton transport, 1 destroyer and possibly 4 small tankers were observed at Kiska 29/7.
- (iii) Enemy submarines remain active in the Aleutians - Hawaiian area.

E) SOUTH EASTERN PACIFIC AREA (See Appendix)

F) INDIAN OCEAN AREA

Enemy Forces

- (i) SURFACE RAIDERS - There are continued indications of enemy raiders operating in the Indian Ocean. These include probably German Raider E and two Japanese merchant raiders.
 - (a) U.S. Freighter "IRENE DU PONT" sent out a raider distress signal from a position 1140 miles E. by N. of Durban at 1700/21.
 - (b) British vessel "INDUS" was attacked by an enemy raider approx 1200 miles S.W. of Cocos Is. at 1503/20.
 - (c) The British vessel "HAURAKI" was captured by a Japanese raider 1500 miles south of Colombo on 12/7.
 - (d) A Japanese unit was in the vicinity of Cocos Is. on 5/7 while a Japanese aircraft was reported flying over Cocos Is. at 1015/20
- (ii) SUBMARINES - There are indications that enemy submarines in the Indian Ocean are operating over a much broader area, namely, in the Sazy Seychelles, Chagos, Maldives area as well as the Mozambique Channel. There are also indications that some of the units from the S.W. Indian Ocean area are changing stations or returning to their base, probably Penang.

2. NAVAL INCIDENTS

- (i) THURSDAY ISLAND - There was no attack on Thursday Island 30/7. An AAAA signal intercepted referred to the raid on Horn Island
- (ii) INDIAN OCEAN - "PHOENIX" reports that her aircraft sighted a horn mine in position 30°03'S, 101°30'E (approx 780 miles W.N.W. Perth) at 1600/24.

- (i) GONA - BUNA AREA - Eight B.17's attacked a merchant vessel and destroyer approx 80 miles N.E. Ambasi at 1800. Five direct hits on M.V. which burst into flames. No hits on destroyer. Two direct hits on wrecked M.V. off Gona. Later reports indicate that the vessel hit off Bakumbari 29/7 was a merchant vessel and not a destroyer. A vessel considered to be the above was seen on fire 40 miles E.S.E. of Buna.
