## 2705.—Grant of Qualified Status to Executive Officers of the R.C.N.R. and R.C.N.V.R.

(C.W. 2478/43.—17.6.1943.)

The Canadian Naval Board have, after consideration, decided it to be essential to the Canadian Naval Service that Qualified Officer Status be granted to Executive Officers of the Royal Canadian Naval Reserve and Royal Canadian Naval Volunteer Reserve.

- 2. Because of the dissimilarity between conditions in the Royal Navy and Royal Canadian Navy, it is not considered advisable that the conditions of A.F.O. 3880/40 should be made applicable to the Royal Canadian Navy. Accordingly, it has been decided that Qualified Status will be granted only to Executive Officers of the Reserves who have satisfactorily commanded one of H.M. or H.M.C. minesweepers or corvettes or larger vessels of war for a period of at least six months and who are recommended by their administrative authority.
- 3. In addition, an officer of the rank of Lieutenant-Commander must obtain a statement from an R.N. or R.C.N. Officer of the rank of Commander or above that he is in all respects able and recommended to perform the duties of an R.C.N. Officer of corresponding rank and seniority. Lieutenants who possess Qualified Status and who are subsequently promoted must obtain such a statement before consideration will be given to their retaining Qualified Officer's Status.

It is intended that Reserve Executive Officers who are granted Qualified Status by the Admiralty while lent to the Royal Navy shall retain such Status upon reversion to the Royal Canadian Navy, but that such officers who are granted Modified Qualified Status under A.F.O. 4881/41 shall not retain such Status upon reversal to the Royal Canadian Navy.

- 2. In making their recommendations, therefore, Commanding Officers should not limit their recommendations to officers who are capable of performing all the duties of Lieutenant-Commander's rank. Normally, ability to perform the duties of a Lieutenant-Commander in the particular branch of the Service in which the officer has specialised would be sufficient. As directed in Paragraph 4 of A.F.O. 4240/42, recommending officers should state the type of office or appointment for which the officer is considered suitable if granted the higher rank.
- 3. Instances have come to notice of officers on detached service who, although eligible and suitable for consideration, have been overlooked, apparently through lack of a regular administrative authority. Every endeavour should be made to obviate any officer's opportunities of promotion being isopardised in these circumstances.

4. The following instructions are issued for guidance in rendering reports:

(a) Recommendations for Royal Naval Reserve and Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve Officers are to be forwarded separately.

(b) The names of officers recommended but not selected for promotion are not automatically reconsidered when the next selections are made. Fresh recommendations must therefore be forwarded if it is desired that officers not promoted one half-year should receive consideration the following half-year. There is no limit to the number of times an officer may be

recommended under this order.

(c) Officers in the R.N.V.(W) R. who fulfil the conditions of A.F.O.

4240/42 may be recommended for consideration under this Fleet Order for promotion to the acting rank of Lieutenant-Commander R.N.V.(W) R.

(d) Officers serving under any of the various T.124 agreements are not eligible for consideration under A.F.O. 4240/42.

(e) Recommendations may be forwarded at any time, but must reach the Admiral Commanding Reserves by 15th February and 15th August for consideration in March and September.

Recommendations received after these dates cannot be con-

# 2709.—T.124X Engineer Officers—Ministry of War Transport (formerly Board of Trade) Examinations

(C.W. 12357/42.—17.6.1943.)

Engineer Officers signed on Admiralty Agreement T.124X who have prepared themselves and are desirous of sitting for Ministry of War Transport (formerly Board of Trade) Examinations may, on the recommendation of their Commanding Officer and subject to Admiralty approval, be granted leave for this purpose.

- 2. No recommendation for leave is to be made unless a Commanding Officer is satisfied, after consultation with his Chief Engineer, that an officer has a reasonable prospect of passing the Examination.
  - 3. Leave will be granted under the following conditions:-
    - (a) Applications to study and sit for Examinations are to be forwarded by Commanding Officers to the Secretary of the Admiralty (Director of Sea Transport) stating—
      - (i) The name and rank of the Engineer Officer.
      - (ii) The Certificate which he intends to take.
        (iii) The date and place of the Examination.

- (iv) The date it is proposed he should leave the ship.
- (v) The officer's address while on leave.
  (vi) Whether or not a relief is required.
- (b) Leave will not be granted in cases where the efficiency of the Service would be impaired.
- (c) Officers are expected to be sufficiently well prepared to pass the Examination within a period of eight weeks and leave with pay will be allowed for this period.
- (d) In normal circumstances no extension of leave will be granted, but applications for a specific period of extended leave "off pay" will be considered by the Admiralty (Director of Sea Transport).
- 4. Officers granted leave on the above conditions are not to be signed off Agreement T.124X.
- 5. Officers are to report the results of their Examinations to the Admiralty (Director of Sea Transport) and ask for instructions. When an officer is successful the number and description of the Certificate should be furnished when issued.

### \*2710.—Temporary Commissions—Financial Position of Ratings on Promotion

(C.W. 21463/43,-17.6.1943.)

With reference to A.F.O. 1163/43, some ratings, who are otherwise suitable for promotion to temporary commissioned rank, may be reluctant to become candidates under the mistaken impression that private means are essential for young Officers in order to maintain their position. It can be stated without qualification, that the new rates of pay promulgated in A.F.O. 5862/42, are sufficient to enable an Officer, whether married or unmarried, to meet his expenses without additional income.

2. This should be explained to any C.W. candidate who asks that his C.W. Form should be destroyed even though it is not specifically stated that financial considerations have led to the request.

### \*2711.—Examination for Warrant Engineer and Warrant Mechanician, February, 1944—Return

(C.W. 23580/43.—17.6.1943.)

The next professional examination for the ranks of Warrant Engineer and Warrant Mechanician will be held on Monday, 7th February, 1944.

- 2. Candidates for the examination should forward their applications in due course, and the Admiralty is to be informed not later than the 1st October, 1943, of the names and particulars of candidates in each command or squadron so that the examination papers can be despatched in good time. These reports should be sent by signal in the case of candidates on foreign stations. Form S.584 for each candidate should be rendered at the same time. "Nil" returns should be rendered. Where the results of the February, 1943, examination are not known in time a request should be included for papers for candidates who are desirous of sitting again in the event of being declared unsuccessful in their previous attempt.
- 3. The worked papers of candidates from each command or squadron are to be forwarded to the Admiralty, accompanied by the prescribed forms, without delay after the examination.
- 4. Before a candidate is allowed to sit for this examination, Commanding Officers are to satisfy themselves that the candidate is qualified as regards:—
  - (a) Educational Test for Warrant Rank,
  - (b) Service and Character.
  - (c) Certificates,

in accordance with K.R. & A.I., Article 313.

- 5. The temporary relaxation of the age limits laid down in A.F.Os. 1509/39 and 1753/39 will also apply to the 1944 examination, i.e., candidates must be under the age of 40 on the 1st October, 1944.
- 6. Forms S.584 should be demanded from Store and restricted to the minimum quantity necessary.

## \*2712.—Advancement of Ratings Medically Unfit for General Service or Over Age (N. 13743/43.—17.6.1943.)

Amend to read "Over-age men who have not completed two years' sea service may volunteer to go to sea, if passed by the Medical Officer, and when they have completed the balance of two years' sea service, they will be eligible to be advanced to Chief Petty Officer by roster in vacancies in Port Division numbers. Sea service for this purpose is to be actual service at sea, and not equivalent service which, under special regulations, is allowed to be regarded as sea service".

1 searf, black silk.

2 cotton flannels.

2 singlets for wear under flannels.

1 jersey.

2 pairs drawers.

2 caps (blue).

2 cap ribbons.

2 pairs boots.

2 pairs books.

1 blue overall suit (2 for E.R. ratings).

2 towels.

1 waistbelt, blue.

1 oilskin.

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- 3. Loan clothing (sea-boots, sou-westers, watch coats) are to be available at bases for loan as requisite to ratings whose duties necessitate such protection.
  - 4. Kit-bags, hammocks, etc., are to be provided in the usual manner.
  - 5. Kit Upkeep Allowance is to be paid at full general service rates.
- 6. Men transferred to General Service under A.F.O. 2475/41 should be given a free issue of any articles in the Compulsory General Service War Kit as set out in A.F.O. 3916/41 proper to the rating in which they transfer which are not included in their L.D.D. kit. If the transfer involves a change in the class of uniform worn (e.g. Class III o Class III) the articles of uniform which they will be unable to wear in their new rating should be withdrawn and sold at the Training Establishment for the benefit of the Crown.
- 7. The following articles may be issued gratuitously to L.D.D. ratings who will be transferred to General Service on condition that the men concerned agree to pay for them in the event of their not being transferred to General Service within 12 months of the date of receiving the articles:—

1 bag, soap.

1 brush, boot, hard.

1 brush, boot, polishing.

1 brush, hair

1 brush, tooth

1 case, attaché.

1 comb, hair.

1 overcoat, horn buttons.

It is important that these ratings shall have been supplied with these latter articles before transfer.

8. Attention is drawn to the necessity of seeing that the kits of L.D.D. ratings are kept complete, serviceable and properly marked and that all items are of service pattern. These ratings should be encouraged to maintain one suit as a Number 1.

## \*2714.—Telegraphists Trained in Private Wireless Schools—Refund of Training Fees and Advancement

(N./D.N.A. 1654/43.—17.6.1943.)

The following revised regulations are to apply to men who join the Telegraphist Branch of the Royal Navy and who are in possession of the Postmaster-General's Special (or Higher) Certificate:—

- (a) They are to be entered in the rate of Ordinary Telegraphist.
- (b) Their disciplinary training should normally be undergone in New Barracks, Gosport.
- (c) Their professional W/T training is to be carried out in H.M. Signal School.
- 2. (a) On successful completion of the shortened course in H.M. Signal School (paragraph 1 (c) above), they will be entitled to refund of tuition fees incurred by them while attending a private wireless school, together with the cost of reasonable travelling expenses for such tuition, up to a maximum amount of £25 on production of a statement of the amounts incurred certified by the Principal of the wireless school.
- (b) They will be rated Telegraphist and ante-dated to date of entry if recommended by the Captain, H.M. Signal School. Men not so rated on completion of the course will be required to serve the normal time for advancement as laid down for other H.O. ratings in the Telegraphist Branch.
- 3. Telegraphists already serving, who are in possession of the Postmaster-General's Special (or Higher) Certificate dated prior to 1st January, 1941, and who enrolled at a wireless school before 1st July, 1940, are also eligible for refund of tuition fees incurred by them at the school, up to a maximum of £25, but in their case travelling expenses will not be refunded. A receipted school account for the tuition fees must be produced.

4. Certified statements of expenses or receipted accounts should be forwarded in original with the cash account in which the amounts refunded are shown. Amounts are chargeable to Vote 1D.

# Lee AFO 4225/46 \*2715.—Transfers to Dominion Navies in War Time Cancelled by (N. 12077/43.—17.6.1943.) AFO 368/47

For the duration of the war, the Admirally are prepared to give consideration to forwarding to the appropriate Dominion Authorities applications for transfer to Dominion Navies in respect of men who are bona fide citizens of the Dominions and were domiciled in the Dominion prior to the war and to their engagement in the Royal Navy, and have dependants residing in the Dominion, but who have entered the Navy under R.N. engagements, provided that there are some compassionate grounds for the request.

- 2. Applications from other ratings will only be considered in most exceptional circumstances, and the fact that a rating has married or wishes to marry a woman who is a citizen of a Dominion will not be regarded as adequate grounds for transfer to a Dominion Navy.
- 3. Application from Newfoundland ratings to transfer to the Royal Canadian Navy cannot be considered,
- 4. Applications for transfer to Dominion Navies should contain the following particulars:—

(a) Birth-place of applicant.

(b) When applicant last resided in the Dominion and for how long.

(c) Reason for joining R.N.

- (d) Address of nearest relatives or dependants.(e) Nature of compassionate grounds for request.
- 5. It should be made clear to applicants that the final decision as to their acceptance in a Dominion Navy rests with the Dominion authorities.

- The information required under headings (r) to (u) is essential and is to be provided in advance.
- 3. Where the answer at (b) concerns more than one ship it should be made clear at (e), (f), (l) and (m) from which ship the particular survivors are received.
- 4. When one of H.M. ships is sailing from abroad to a United Kingdom port with survivors or passengers on board this information should be signalled to the Admiralty and port of destination by the Flag or Naval Officer-in-Charge of the port of departure.
- 5. It should be noted that the figures for headings (c) to (n) should be given first without differentiating between injured and non-injured, British or foreigners, these particulars being indicated separately under headings (o), (p) and (q).

It should, however, be emphasised that a recommendation for promotion must be earned and rannot be promised, and that all entrants to the service must be prepared to serve in the ranks.

4. During the initial period of training at a depot the endorsement W.P. may not be cancelled without the approval of the responsible Superintendent, W.R.N.S.

5. The W.P. (Form S.1525) is to be prepared in duplicate, on enrolment, one copy being attached to the rating's papers and the other forwarded to D.W.R.N.S.

6. A White Paper may only be cancelled by the Commanding Officer of

6. A White Paper may only be cancelled by the Commanding Officer of the establishment, who is to report its destruction, with the reason, to Director, W.R.N.S.

7. When the rating has completed three months' service, whether or not she is considered suitable for immediate promotion, a report is to be forwarded without fail by the Commanding Officer to D.W.R.N.S. If recommended for promotion, the report is to be made on the usual Form S.1530.

8. White Paper candidates should be given suitable experience to fit them subsequently for undertaking the responsibility of officer rank.

9. Although White Papers are normally given on entry into the Service, a White Paper can be started at any time during the rating's career.

- 4. Future demands for films should in all cases be referred to the Instructional Film Distributing Officers concerned and not to D.T.S.D., Admiralty.
- 5. Instructional Film Distributing Officers will maintain and circulate catalogues of the films available in their libraries and those held on permanent loan by establishments in their areas. Copies to be held by individual establishments will be restricted to films which are in constant use, i.e. three times a week. - 7. Should a copy be damaged whilst in possession of any establishment the I.F.D.O. should be advised immediately so that arrangements can be made to secure replacement but the utmost care must be taken of the films while on loan. These will be checked on return to the library.
- 8. Copies of new films and new parts to existing films will be sent direct to film libraries, and to establishments allowed their own copies. Details of each film distribution will be promulgated by A.F.O.
- 9. Eye shooting films will continue to be distributed in accordance with A.F.O. 2991/42.
- 10. Aircraft recognition films will no longer be sent to individual establishments at home except to Aircraft Recognition Centres and to establishments specifically asking for copies through their I.F.D.O.

### 2732. Customs Privileges for Major Landing Craft

(N.L. 6596/43.-17.6.1943.)

- 5. A record of expenditure of these coupons is to be maintained in conjunction with the records of other ration documents.

AA.D. 2735.—Board of Trade Register and List of Retail Traders in Certain Businesses in Shop Premises in the United Kingdom

165/45

(N. 13543/43.—17.6.1943.)

The Board of Trade have intimated that they have set up a Register and a List of Retail Traders in certain businesses in shop premises in the United Kingdom, who have since 3rd September 1939, ceased to carry on such businesses, and they have asked that the attention of men now serving in the Royal Navy and the Royal Marines who in civil life were shopkeepers in these businesses may be drawn to the Register and the List so that if they satisfy the conditions for registration they may, if they so desire, make application for inclusion.

- 2. The Register and the List apply only to the retail businesses in most non-food goods, and the other businesses (viz., hairdressing, beauty treatment, circulating libraries, and auctioneers) covered by the Location of Retail Businesses Order. They do not apply to businesses of retail traders in food goods (including sweets and confectionery) and caterers. Information is already available in the Local Food Offices of the Ministry of Food about food traders who have terminated their business activities during the War. Food retailers and caterers will thus be in the same position as retailers whose names are included in the non-food traders register.
- 3. The purpose of this Register and List is to enable the Board of Trade to have at the end of the war a record of the names, addresses and other particulars of persons who in civil life were shopkeepers in the above businesses and who ceased to carry on such a business at any time on or after the outbreak of war, and it will be of mutual value and aid to the Board of Trade and shopkeepers in respect of claims for entry or re-entry into these retail businesses in the probable event of some form of trade licensing continuing for a period of time after the war.
- 4. Applications are entirely voluntary and optional. No fee is payable and the information given by the applicants will be treated by the Board of Trade as confidential.
- 5. Where a trader ceased to carry on such a business not through closing his shop but through selling his business as a going concern, he will not be eligible for inclusion in the Register, but his name will be included in a Supplementary List. The reason for this distinction is that traders on the Register will have established a strong primâ facie case for specially favourable treatment when they apply for any license that may be necessary to re-start their former businesses, whereas in the case of traders who have sold their businesses as going concerns, the presumption is that the sale has been an ordinary commercial transaction. Applications from such latter traders for licences will have to be considered very carefully in the light of the trader's circumstances at the time, and of the problem as a whole. The existence of the List will, however, enable them to put on record information about their businesses, which may be important if, owing to war circumstances, there was a forced sale.
- 6. The conditions that must be satisfied by an applicant in order to entitle him to registration are:—
  - (i) That he has ceased to carry on either directly or indirectly, on or after 3rd September, 1939, a retail business or a business as specified in paragraph 2. It is immaterial whether the business was opened before or after 3rd September, 1939.
  - (ii) That he was engaged in carrying on such a business for a "substantial" period prior to his withdrawal from it. The Board of Trade state that it is the general intention to interpret the word "substantial" as meaning a continuous spell of at least 12 months prior to withdrawal or an aggregate period of at least 2 years in the 5 years immediately preceding withdrawal. This condition may, in the Board's discretion, be waived where the Board consider that its enforcement would involve undue hardship to an applicant.

7. Application for registration is by form (R.T.R.2), which can be obtained on written application (postcards only) from the Board of Trade (R.T.R.2), Neville House, Page Street, London, S.W.1. The receipt of applications will be acknowledged as soon as possible. Men serving abroad may, if they wish, instruct some person in the United Kingdom (e.g. a relative, a solicitor or an accountant), to make application on their behalf.

2738.—Guns, Q.F., U.S., 4-in., Mark IX—Breech Mechanisms, Mark VIII—Fitting of Striker Springs

(A.S. 16590/42.—17.6.1943.)

The springs, striker "P", Q.F., U.S., 4-in., Mark IX gun (breech mechanism, Mark VIII), referred to in A.F.O. 811/43, are now available, and should be demanded as required from R.N. Armament Depots, who should forward intermediate demands to Director of Armament Supply.

- 3. A 1-in. diameter hole, to permit quick examination of the bore after a stoppage, is to be drilled in the position shown in the diagram.

### 2740.—Guns, Machine, Browning (Colt), 0.5-in., Watercooled—Water Chests

(A.S./D.N.O. (W.O.) 241/42.-17.6.1943.)

It is possible that some ships mounting 0.5-in. Browning (Colt) watercooled guns may not have been supplied with water chests and hoses (as illustrated in frontispiece to B.R. 641/42) for circulating water to the gun water-jackets.

- 2. Except where fixed water tanks, pumps and pipes have been provided as in certain "Town" class destroyers for supplying circulating water, one water chest, with appropriate hoses, is to be used in all ships including D.E.M.S. for each twin or single mounting having water-cooled guns.
- 3. Ships should demand water chests with hose connections as required from the nearest R.N. Armament Depot, stating whether required for single or twin mountings.
- 4. Occasional use of the pump, as described in A.F.O. 4739/42, is necessary in order to avoid the risk of stoppages and accidents caused by overheating.

Every endeavour should be made to carry out the detailed instructions contained in the above article despite the difficulties inherent under war conditions.

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5. The shafts of the armatures under deposit for the 80 k.W. Turbo Generators fitted in "Eskimo", "Nubian" and "Tartar" are slightly longer than the armature shafts of the similar machines fitted in "Onslow" and "Pakenham" Class Destroyers. A suitable distance piece is, therefore, to be provided for fitting between the bearing cap and housing at the commutator end when the former armatures are fitted on the latter vessels.

### 2749.—Detonator Carriers for Depth Charge Pistols

(A.S. 6778/43.-17.6.1943.)

Some depth charge pistols of Canadian manufacture, i.e., bearing a serial number prefixed by the letter "C," or "C" followed by one other letter, will be found to have a corrugated brass strip inserted in the groove or undercut of the detonator carrier.

- 2. This corrugated brass strip must not be removed from the detonator carrier, since its removal will result in excessive freedom of movement of the disc detonator and may thus cause failures due to the blow of the striker being reduced by having to pierce the disc detonator before striking the detonator.
- 3. When fitting a detonator to a carrier of this type, care is necessary to see that the corrugated brass strip is properly home in its groove. If this is not done, there is a risk that the end of the pistol body may but on the edge of the strip and fail to make a joint on the rubber washer.

### 2750. Emergency Starters for Steering Gear-Modifications

Destroyers

(P. 19326/42.-17.6.1943.)

Experience has indicated that difficulty exists in making a quick change-over from normal to emergency conditions in the emergency steering motor starters fitted in certain destroyers.

- In order that this requirement can be met the starters are to be modified as shown on A.F.O. Diagram 187/43.
- 3. The additional components for this purpose have been purchased and are being delivered to H.M. Dockyard, Portsmouth.
- 4. All emergency steering motor starters are to be examined and if it is found that these modifications have not been incorporated, the commanding officers of the ships concerned are to include an appropriate item in the next list of As. and As., work to be carried out by ship's staff.
- 5. The necessary components are to be demanded from the Electrical Engineering Manager, H.M. Dockyard, Portsmouth.

## 2751.—Mark VIII Depth Charges—Firing from Boom Vessels (T. 04217/43.—17.6.1943.)

Trials have been carried out to establish the best method of firing depth charges Mark VIII from boom vessels where the shallow water sometimes produces "failures to detonate" by the depth charges, owing to pistols being buried in mud, or of the entrance of sand sufficient to wedge the orifice plate off its seating. These trials, which have been successful, consisted of attaching an elliptical float to the charge at the pistol end, thereby reducing its sinking rate and ensuring that it would not be buried quickly in mud. A slight decrease in range occurred, but is not considered of importance.

2. When firing Mark VIII depth charges boom vessels fitted with depth charge throwers are, in future, to use this attachment, which comprises the following items of naval stores:—

Vessels in commission should forward demands to their storing yards or bases for one set of the items referred to for each depth charge carried. Supply to ships of new construction should be arranged similarly by storing yards or depots in the usual manner.

- 3. The "L" shaped attachment (see A.F.O. diagram No. 185/43) should be provided by yard manufacture as necessary. It is made of M.S. 5/32-in. thick, 1-in. wide, and 1½-in. from the angle of the "L" on the outside, to each extremity. At the angle of the "L", on the inside, the attachment is strengthened to ¼-in. One hole is bored in each end of the "L" attachment, one ½-in. in diameter, the other 5/16-in. in diameter. One hole will take the pin of a 1-ton shackle, the other will take a bolt fitted in one of the tail-securing lugs of the Mark VIII depth charge.
- 4. The float is to be secured to the pistol end of the Mark VIII D.C. by means of a pendant \(^3\_4\)-in. E.S.F.S.W.R., 4 feet in length, the 1-ton shackle and "L" shaped attachment. One end of "L" shaped attachment is to be bolted to one of the tail securing lugs at the pistol end of the Mark VIII charge, the other end is secured to the pendant \(^3\_4\)-in. E.S.F.S.W.R., 4 feet in length, by means of the 1-ton shackle, the pin of the shackle being inserted in the hole provided in the "L" shaped attachment.
  - 5. The establishments of naval stores concerned will be amended.

### 2752. Pellet Dan Buoy-Introduction-REPORT

(T. 1422/43.—17.6.1943.)

Trials have been carried out with a small type of dan buoy, known as the pellet dan buoy, under the following conditions:—

- (a) General dimensions ... ... as A.F.O. Diagram No. 186/43 (M.D. Sk. 1892/134).
- (b) Dan flag ... ... size 6.
- (c) Elliptical floats ... 2 in number, Pattern 8717.
- (d) Mooring wire ... ... 20 fathoms 1-in, F.S.W.R.
- (e) Depth of water ... ... 10 fathoms. (f) Tidal current ... ... up to 3 knots.
- (g) Type of sinker ... concrete, Pattern 8797.
- (h) Sea ... ... 2, no swell.
- (i) Wind ... ... up to force 6. (j) Visibility of dan ... approximately 1 mile.
- (k) Duration of trials ... 7 days.
- As a result of these trials it is considered that this buoy is suitable for use by small minesweeping vessels when operating in sheltered waters, in lieu of dan buoy, Pattern 8719.
- 3. This buoy will not at present be manufactured as a store article, but minesweeping bases wishing to use it are to demand the necessary components and arrange for the buoy to be constructed locally.
- 4. Bases using this buoy are to forward to the Secretary of the Admiralty (D.T.M., Bath), a report on its performance when sufficient experience has been gained.

#### 2753 .— Rudder and Steering Indicators in H.M. Ships

(D. 02201/43.—17.6.1943.)

The instructions promulgated in A.F.O. 6292/42 are to be amended as follows:—

Paragraph 4 cancel and substitute:-

- 4. Provision of the rudder indicator equipment is being arranged at the Admiralty but it is anticipated that delivery will not commence for some considerable time. Demands for this equipment should be forwarded by Overseers to Director of Stores (6B).
- 5. Supply of the necessary parts and fittings for wheel indicators should be arranged by refitting Yards during ships refits. The indicator is to comprise a graduated quadrant with a simple pointer driven by either rod

gearing or Arens control from the steering telemotor transmitter or control shafting. Non ferrous material is to be used for parts within 12 ft. of the compass.

The choice of rod gearing or Arens control is left to the discretion of refitting authority in conjunction with ships' officers, it being borne in mind that the primary intention of the indicator is to show the sense of the movement rather than to record its amount with scrupulous exactness.

6. Ships concerned are to forward an A. and A., Classification "A", for the work to be carried out.

## 2754.—Ships Undergoing Alterations, Repairs or Additions to Torpedo Tubes or Torpedo Stowage and Handling Gear—Torpedo Equipment Trials

(T.1418/43.—17.6.1943.)

A torpedo equipment trial is to be carried out in any ship in which major alterations, repairs or additions are being made to the torpedo tubes or to the torpedo stowage and handling gear, and in any ship which is being converted to carry a torpedo armament or to stow and handle torpedoes.

- 2. If in any doubt as to the need for such a trial, Flag and Naval Officers-in-Charge of contract repair work or Admirals Superintendent of Dockyards should obtain a decision from the Captain, H.M.S. "Vernon" (Northern Torpedo Section) or the Captain, H.M.S. "Vernon" (Southern Torpedo Section), for ships refitting north and south respectively of the line Great Yarmouth-Milford Haven.
- 3. Instructions for initiation and conduct of torpedo equipment trials are given in B.R. 633 (1).
- 4. When arranging the date of a trial with H.M.S. "Vernon" (N.T.S.) or (S.T.S.), the following factors should be borne in mind:—
  - (a) The period between the trial and the date of completion of the refit should be sufficient to allow clearing of defects and deficiencies discovered during the trial before the ship leaves the refitting yard.
  - (b) Alternative trial dates and as much notice as possible should be givenin order to avoid clashing with other torpedo equipment trial commitments.
  - (c) If the torpedoes and stores needed for the trial are not already on board at least seven days' notice is normally required to arrange for provision of this gear.
- 5. In order, therefore, to ensure that the ships referred to in paragraph 1 leave the refitting yard efficient for service, particularly ships which are only in hand for a short time (e.g., coastal force torpedo craft changing tubes), it is essential that arrangements for torpedo equipment trials should be initiated at the earliest possible date.

(A. S. 8486/42.—17.6.1943.)

### 2758.—R.D.F. Sets, Types 271/2/3/P.—Fitting of N.U.4 Anode Connection in Panel 3AK

(S.D. 03250/43.—17.6.1943.)

Valves, N.U.4, now issued have their anode lead issuing from neck of the valve instead of from a side terminal as previously. With this type of valve the anode lead provided with the above type sets is liable to cause a short circuit. These leads are to be replaced by a less flexible type.

- 2. Ships fitted with one of the above sets should demand from S.N.S.O. (Haslemere) one "Connection complete with brackets for panel 3AK, Pattern W.8154", quoting this Order as authority.
  - 3. These brackets should be fitted by the ships R.D.F. Officer or P.R.D.F.O.
- 4. A.F.O. Diagram 179/43 (A.S.E. Drg. No. 33685) illustrates the method of fitting the connection.
- 5. Method of Fitting.—The top pair of fixing bolts for the right-hand N.U.4 valve holder are to be used as fixing bolts for the board carrying the insulator.

The wire supplied should be connected between the insulator and the right-hand filament terminal of the left-hand N.U.4. The anode lead of the right-hand N.U.4 should be cut to a suitable length and attached to the insulator.

## 2760.—R.D.F., Type 286M—Conversion to Type 286P/291 and Disposal of Aerial Outfits ATN

Production of aerial outfits ATR will shortly permit the completion of the programme of conversion of Type 286M sets to Type 286P/291.

- 2. Flag officers concerned should arrange accordingly for the conversion of all remaining Type 286M sets at the first convenient opportunity.
- 3. Aerial outfits ATN removed from ships or held at bases should be brought to produce.
- 4. Admiralty Letters D. 03765/42, dated 24.2.42, and D. 018745/42, dated 12.9.42, to Admiral Superintendents, Chatham and Rosyth, are cancelled.

### 2761. R.D.F. Types 286PQ/291-Ventilation of Office-A. and A.

(S.D. 03226/43.—17.6.1943.)

With reference to A.F.O. 56/43, it is essential that a 5-in Exhaust Fan with natural supply should be fitted in each office containing Type 291 in accordance with Clause 10 of Specification B.195/42.

- 2. Where Type 286PQ has not yet been replaced by Type 291 a 5-in. Exhaust Fan is also required.
- 3. Commanding Officers of ships fitted with these sets and where no such artificial ventilation is fitted should insert an A. and A. Item, Classification "A," for this work to be carried out.
- 4. Application for supply of 5-in. Fans, quoting ship's voltage, should be made direct to Director Naval Construction, Bath.

### 2762.—R.D.F., Types 291W and 286PW—Aerial Outfits ATT

(S.D. 03286/43,-17.6.1943.)

A number of different designs of aerial unit for use with aerial outfit ATT have been produced under the same pattern number and description.

- 2. Separate pattern numbers and descriptions have now been allocated as follows in order that aerial units may be distinguished and that submarines and yards concerned may demand the appropriate type to meet particular requirements:—
  - (i) W.4803—Aerial Unit for Outfit ATT.—The original design of which twelve only were produced.
  - (ii) W.4803A—Aerial Unit for Outfit ATT, Design "A".—A modified design for British submarines of which about eighty were produced.
  - (iii) W.8323—Aerial Unit for Outfit ATT, Design "B".—A design now in production for British submarines.
  - (iv) W.8323A—Aerial Unit for Outfit ATT, Design "C".—Modification of design "B" in an experimental stage—not yet in production.
  - (v) W.8324—Aerial Unit for Outfit ATT, Design "D".—As for design "B" but with the lower end of the mast tube sealed for shipment in the easing of a submarine. (Will only be produced when required.)
  - (vi) W.8324A—Aerial Unit for Outfit ATT, Design "E".—As for design "C" but with the lower end of the mast tube sealed for shipment in the casing of a submarine. (Will only be produced when required.)
  - (vii) W.8325—Aerial Unit for Outfit ATT, Design "F".—As for design "B" but with special detachable reflectors and sealed lower end of mast tube for use in Royal Netherlands Navy submarines where the aerial is required to house close up against the bridge plating.
  - (viii) W.8325A—Aerial Unit for Outfit ATT, Design "G".—A modification of design "F" in the experimental stage—not yet in production.
  - (ix) W.8326—Aerial Unit for Outfit ATT, Design "H".—As for design "B" but with flange at lower end of mast tube omitted for use in Royal Netherlands Navy submarines with special mast arrangements.
  - (x) W.8326A—Aerial Unit for Outfit ATT, Design "J".—As for design "C" but with flange at lower end of mast tube omitted.
- 3. It is intended that British submarines should be fitted with Pattern W.8323 aerial units (or Pattern W.8323A if successful), and that Allied submarines should be fitted with aerial units Pattern W.8325A or Pattern W.8326A as appropriate if W.8323A is not suitable. Demands for replacement aerial units should be forwarded to S.N.S.O., Haslemere, accordingly.
- Instructions for the return of defective aerial units will be promulgated separately.
  - 5. Establishments List No. E.523 will be amended.

# 2763.—Wee Meggers—Revised Allowances for W/T and R.D.F. Purposes (N.S. 12041/42.—17.6.1943.)

In view of the increase in the number and variety of W/T and R.D.F. sets now being fitted in ships and shore stations, it has become necessary to extend the allowances of wee meggers for testing purposes.

- 2. The appendix to this Order shows the revised allowances of wee meggers, Patterns 5047 and 13339, for use with W/T and R.D.F. apparatus. Wee meggers being obtained from American sources to supplement production of wee meggers in the United Kingdom will be known as "Pattern 13339".
- 3. Services concerned should forward demands to the Superintending Naval Store Officer, Haslemere, to complete to the revised allowances, and any instruments held in excess of the approved scale are to be returned to the nearest storing yard or depot.
- 4. In view of the present actute shortage of wee meggers and the large requirements of these instruments for other than W/T and R.D.F. purposes, it will be some considerable time before demands in accordance with this

Order can be met, and priority in supply will be given to services requiring wee meggers for purposes for which allowances have already been promulgated. Demands are, therefore, not to be hastened.

5. In the meantime, requirements for the W/T and R.D.F. departments of ships, etc., will have to be met by utilising the wee meggers already on board for other purposes.

- H.M. Ships constructed or refitted in America possess naval stores and equipment, permanent and consumable, of American manufacture which will require replenishment or replacement from time to time.
- 2. Suitable British equivalents should be used wherever possible in lieu of the American stores when required. It will be found that many items, both consumable and permanent can be dealt with in this way.
- 3. In all instances where no acceptable British equivalents can be found, demands for the American type stores giving full particulars and quoting Reference Nos. as shown in the American Allowance Lists should be forwarded to the Admiralty, D. of S., and not to the storing Yard, nor to America, unless the vessel is, or will be shortly, at American ports for some time, in which case the demands should be forwarded to the Deputy Director of Stores, P.O. Box 165, Benjamin Franklin Station, Washington, D.C.
- 4. Vessels carrying spares of American type naval stores on board should not wait until the spares are exhausted, but should re-demand periodically up to the initial quantities allowed.

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## 2767.—Armament Stores—Drivers, Screw, Q.F., 3-pdr., Hotchkiss Guns, Mark I—Modification

(A.S./G. 8649/42.—17.6.1943.)

To enable drivers, screw, Q.F., 3 pdr. Hotchkiss guns, Mark I to be used for removal of striker and sear spring of guns in Mark V mountings, the handle portion should be bent through 45 degrees in accordance with A.F.O. ## 2771.—Heating of the Ventilation of Officers' Quarters and Offices of H.M. Ships to Meet Arctic Conditions

(D. 014415/43.—17.6.1943.)

It has been approved in principle to modify the ventilation of Officers quarters and offices of H.M. Ships approved to be fitted for Arctic service by the addition of steam heaters in the artificial supply ventilation system.

- 2. The additional steam heaters are to be supplied with steam from the existing steam heating system enlarged as necessary. In "Ajax," "Arethusa" class, "Southampton" class and later cruisers the working pressure of the steam heating system is 125-lb./sq. inch, and in other ships including Battleships and Aircraft Carriers the working pressure is 50-lb./sq. inch or less. In "Leander," "Achilles" and "Orion" the ship's heating steam is superheated, and any additional heaters supplied to these ships should have cast steel headers.
- 3. The heaters will be supplied for ships fitting out for Arctic service by the Admiralty on application by the W.P.Ss., P.E.R.Os., and Overseers. Any special requirements affecting the steam system will be indicated by the Admiralty.
- 4. Electric heaters should be retained until experience has been gained which may justify their omission.
- 5. The Commanding Officers of ships required to be fitted for Arctic service should include an item, Classification "A," in their next list of As. and As. to cover the work involved.

### 2772.—Imo Telemotor Pump

H.M. Submarines

(D.6379/43.—17.6.1943.)

In order that the Imo Telemotor pumps in submarines may be maintained at the highest possible efficiency, arrangements are to be made for the pumps, when defective, complete with motor, starter and bedplate, to be returned to the makers for overhaul as vessels come in hand for refit.

2. One set of spares is supplied for each pump and these should also be returned with the pump to the makers for examination.

### 2773.—Inflatable Lifebelts—Supply to Allied Naval Personnel

2. An A. and A. item, classification "A", is to be raised for vessels already employed on hot weather service to provide for the necessary wiring and installation of any additional D.A.Rs. to conform with the above supply. Where possible arrangements should be made for the local purchase of additional D.A.Rs. required. Details of D.A.Rs. purchased should be reported in accordance with A.F.O. 1342/40.

### 2778.—Reserve Feed Water and Fresh Water Tanks—Contamination

Destroyers

(P. 6494/43.-17.6.1943.)

Experience shows that in Destroyers fitted with reserve feed and fresh water tanks on ship's side, contamination of feed water and fresh water may be caused by damage due to bumping against fenders or catamarans.

2. It is realised that war operational conditions are such that normal precautions when going alongside are not always possible, but in view of the serious consequences of contamination to feed water, Commanding Officers of ships concerned should ensure that the risk of damage to the ship's side in the vicinity of these tanks is reduced to a minimum by taking care that the fenders or catamarans are kept clear of these positions, if possible. Special stiffening for fendering is fitted in the machinery spaces and is shown on the Docking Plans.

2775.—Modifications to After Bulwark.—As. and As.

American Built Diesel Electric Rescue Tugs

(D.3628/43.—17.6.1943.)

Reports have been received that damage has been caused to the after bulwark in the above-mentioned vessels by the chafe of the towing wire.

- 2. To provide protection to the bulwark, heavy segmental iron should be fitted on top of the taffrail at the stern extending forward to the after tow beam.
- 3. The Commanding Officers of vessels concerned are to include an item, classification "A", in their next lists of As. and As. to cover the work involved.

The demands should be forwarded in one batch, preferably covering three months, and any intermediate demands should be reduced to a minimum.

### Section 6.—SHORE ESTABLISHMENTS

### 2797.—Sick Leave Regulations—Uncertificated Sick Absence

(C.E. 7456/43.—17.6.1943.)

The Sick Leave Regulations have, in view of the present heavy and increasing strain on the medical profession, been modified as from 1st June, 1943, as set out below. The concessions in (a) and (b) below are intended only as a war-time measure and in the first place are experimental.

- (a) Uncertificated absences.—The period of paid sick leave which established and unestablished officers may take without medical certificate has been extended from two to four consecutive days. This is subject to the overriding maximum of seven days in any period of twelve months without production of medical certificate. It is emphasised that the extension now allowed is entirely at the discretion of heads of establishments or departments and the greatest care should be taken to see that the concession is not abused.
- (b) Deductions for National Health Insurance benefits.—In order to afford the maximum relief to doctors, deductions in respect of sickness benefit under the National Health Insurance Acts may be waived for temporary and unestablished staff of any grade, for any period for which a medical certificate covering the sick absence is not required.

No officer who is a compulsory contributor to National Health Insurance will be allowed to draw both sickness benefit and full pay. Such an officer, if taking uncertificated paid sick leave for more than a single day for which normally he could claim benefit from his society should be required, when reporting himself sick to his department, to state in writing that sickness benefit has not been and will not be claimed from his Approved Society.

These certificates should be attached to the reports of sick absences made to the paying officer.

(c) Absences including a Sunday.—A Sunday on which attendance is not required and which falls within a period of uncertificated sick leave granted under this order may be ignored for the purpose of the overall limit of seven days, but will count as sick leave for all other purposes.

The Chief Inspector of Taxes should be informed as to the disposal of any forms No. 6 D.S. received after the employees concerned have been transferred to other establishments.

## 2800. Industrial Employees Returning Home from Service Abroad—Adjustment of Income Tax

(D.N.A. 10287/43.—17.6.1943.)

When an established workman is transferred to the United Kingdom from an establishment abroad, an adjustment of his income tax assessment for the year in which the transfer takes place is necessary, and the following revised procedure is to be followed.

- 2. The form of assessment (form 377 or 36B) is to be attached to the man's transfer note (form D.135) and forwarded to the Cashier of the home establishment. If the form of assessment has not been received at the date of the man's discharge, this should be clearly noted on the form D.135.
- 3. The Cashier of the home establishment is to forward to the Chief Inspector of Taxes, Departmental Claims Branch, a statement on form 6A (adapted) as shown hereunder:—
  - (a) Taxable emoluments and amount of tax deducted for the current year to date of transfer, and
  - (b) total taxable emoluments for the preceding year.

Note.—In the event of the form of assessment not having been received from the establishment abroad, the fact should be reported to the Chief Inspector of Taxes.

- 4. Pending the receipt of revised instructions from the Chief Inspector of Taxes, the Cashier of the home establishment should not take any action regarding the collection of any balance of tax that may be due in respect of the emoluments issued abroad.

(D.N.A.49/43.—17.6.1943.)

With reference to Articles 32 and 368 (2), Instructions for the Conduct of Cash Duties, B.R.669, all advances for travelling expenses and subsistence allowance made on or after the 1st January, 1943, which are brought to account in the cash account are to be classified to a bulk private individuals heading entitled "Private Individuals—Travelling Advances," and all recoveries in respect of such advances are to be similarly classified. Recoveries of advances made prior to the 1st January, 1943, are to be credited as hitherto under the names of the private individuals concerned.

- Particulars of individual payments will still be shown on the cash vouchers, and separate notifications of advances made should be forwarded to the Director of Navy Accounts as hitherto.
- 3. The necessary amendment to the classification of cash accounts already forwarded will be made by the Director of Navy Accounts.

#### 2802. Office Machinery and Equipment

(C.E. 54145/43.—17.6.1943.)

Attention is drawn to K.R. & A.I., Article 1948 (10), under which items of office machinery are never to be purchased locally, and to A.F.O. 3427/41 which re-affirmed this regulation.

- When requirements arise for machinery and equipment of the more complex types, e.g.:
  - (a) visible index systems, branded filing systems.
  - (b) printing, reproduction and photographic apparatus, folding machines,
  - (c) Dictaphones and Ediphones,
  - (d) special inter-communication telephones.
  - (e) adding, calculating and punched card machinery,
  - (f) sorting apparatus,

the Organisation and Methods Section at the Admiralty should be consulted at an early stage and in any case before discussion with the representatives of firms making articles of the sort required.

- 3. Under present arrangements all such requirements are examined by the section before being approved, and it has been found in many cases, where the section has not been consulted at an early stage, that time had been wasted on detailed consideration of equipment that was unsuitable to the work or subject to unacceptable delays in delivery.
- 4. Inquiries should be accompanied by as much information as possible and be addressed either (a) directly to the Secretary of the Admiralty (Organisation and Methods Section), Queen Anne's Mansions, London, S.W.1, or (b) in the case of any establishment for which a particular Admiralty Department has general responsibility, to that department for discussion with Organisation and Methods Section.
- 5. Demands for typewriters, hand-operated duplicators and other simple, "non-technical" types of office equipment should continue to be forwarded to the Keeper of Stationery and Printing, Admiralty, accompanied by a report in accordance with A.F.O. 1345/41.

### 2803. W.R.N.S. Hairdressers Equipment

(N.S. 14494/43.—17.6.1943.)

With reference to paragraph'3 of A.F.O. 4727/42, the standard scale of W.R.N.S. hairdressing equipment is shown in the Appendix to this Order.

- 2. Naval Establishments in which one or more W.R.N.S. hairdressers are included in the complement should forward demands as necessary to the appropriate (S) Naval Store Officer or Victualling Store Officer as indicated in column 5 of the Appendix. A further A.F.O. will be issued when stocks of the items marked † in the Appendix are available at the Victualling Depots.
- 3. With regard to the electric hair dryers, hooded and hand types, the Electrical Engineering Manager of the associated Dockyard (Warship Electrical Superintendent, in Northern Ireland) should be consulted before these dryers are put into service, to ensure safe operating conditions. If any electric hair dryers provided from private or other sources are already in use at any Establishment, details of the method of wiring, etc., should be reported as above at the earliest possible date, if this has not already been done.

(L.1149/43.—17.6.1943.)

In future expenditure incurred on account of necessary motor transport for industrial canteens on the premises of Admiralty establishments is to be a charge to the establishment and not to the canteen, except as provided under paragraph 3. Thus the provision of necessary motor transport for canteens becomes one of the services provided by the Admiralty under A.F.O. 4218/42, paragraph 1 (iv).

- All transport for a canteen should be carried out by general type vehicles already in service at the establishment. Such vehicles are only to be driven by authorised Admiralty drivers.
- Where the canteen is run by catering contractors, they should be informed that any transport required to bring their staff or supplies to the canteen from outside the establishment is their responsibility.
