#### 94—Mess Gear—Revised Scales

(V. 6264/41.—8.1.1942.)

As a war-time measure of economy, it has been decided to suspend the present scales of mess traps shown in B.R. 93A—Manual of Victualling, Volume II, Appendix K, and to substitute the revised scales shown in the Appendix to this order, which are to apply forthwith to all ships commissioning, and in commission, including any remaining on the pre-1937 scales.

- 2. Supplies of items deleted from the existing scales will, however, continue to be made until stocks are exhausted. Items in excess of the revised scales are to be retained on board until they are unserviceable.
- 3. No further purchases of glassware with cut star for Flag and Commanding Officers' messes will be made, and all china and earthenware will in future be issued unbadged.
- 4. Articles marked with an asterisk indicate the items of permanent store which may be condemned on board and written off charge by certificate.
- 5. The regulations for the supply of officers' mess traps, mess utensils, implements, etc., contained in B.R. 93—Manual of Victualling, Volume I, Part IV, Chapters XIII and XIV—will continue in force as far as they are applicable.
- 6. Their Lordships desire to draw attention to the necessity of exercising all possible economy and care in the use of mess gear under existing conditions. Articles of electro-plate, hardware and linen should not be returned to a victualling yard for replacement so long as they are reasonably fit for further use, and demands for replacements generally should be limited to essential requirements.

The undermentioned scales of mess traps, utensils and implements are to apply to W.R.N.S. quarters and messes.

- 2. Demands should be forwarded by the Accountant Officer of the parent establishment to the appropriate Victualling Yard or Depôt for compliance. Those for first requirements should state the number of officers and ratings for whom supplies are required.
- 3. Any mess gear taken over with premises to be used as W.R.N.S. quarters should be accounted for by the Accountant Officer in the same way as articles received from a Victualling Yard. In such cases first demands should indicate what items and quantities in the scales are not required.
- 4. All articles will be supplied through the Accountant Officer and will be dealt with and accounted for by him in the usual Service manner.
- 5. It will be necessary to detail an officer of the W.R.N.S. to be responsible for the care and custody of the mess gear and to ensure that it is properly and economically used. The Accountant Officer is to be furnished with particulars of losses and breakages by neglect in order that recovery of the value may be made from the person or persons responsible.
- 6. Demands for articles in replacement should bear a certificate to the effect that the expenditure of the articles to be replaced is reasonable. Articles worn out, etc., should be disposed of as directed by the Accountant Officer. Attention is drawn to paragraph 6 of A.F.O. 94/42.
  - 7. Paragraphs 11, 12, 13 and 14 of A.F.O. 198/40 are cancelled.
