

Civil Flying Boat G-ABUH on passage Darwin to Koepang signalled she was about to land Koepang 30th January and has not since been seen or reported. Two Naval personnel Paymaster Lieutenant D. W. McCulloch and Paymaster Lieutenant B. L. Westbrook were on board proceeding to Batavia for duty.

Dutch Destroyers are changing their silhouettes by removing after mast and plane platform abaft it.
